

## CHARITY THEME OF ELKS SPEECH

Annual Memorial Exercises are

marked by short but heart-  
stirring address

Heroic achievements may not leave a lasting trace upon the memory of time, but deeds of pure benevolence, charity and generosity by man to man

The sentiment, expressed by T. Bailey Lee of Burley at memorial exercises conducted Sunday afternoon, prefaced address dedicated to departed

members of Twin Falls lodge No. 1183, B. P. O. E. which abounded throughout with similar thought expressive of the basic principal accredited to the great fraternal order.

Bespaking the charity of the organization the speaker quoted a line from the ritual of the lodge:

The faults of our brothers we write upon the sands,  
Their virtues upon the tablets of love and memory.

**Charity Loves Purview.**  
The orator of the occasion did not speak at extraordinary length, in fact the speech was, "for the most of those attending the annual exercises, all too short." He demonstrated a well defined ability, in the use of words, a few words, generally relying upon epictic homilies rather than lengthy passages. He spoke briefly upon the deeds men have wrought that made them remembered, and the comparative few achievements of such men as Benjamin Franklin, whose gift to man was declared to be of an immortalizing nature, with Julius Caesar, whose heroics died live only in history, and he said, "I care not for any persons' achievements."

"The law of man should be the law of kindness," the speaker declared. "The law of man should be the law of the time to cultivate each other. He derided the law of the survival of the fittest as the law of the brutish, declaring that the only just law between man and man is the law of brotherhood, the religion of love. He deplored the education of brains thus built up the mighty industrial structures only to workshop the mind and soul of workers. "Man never needed the sustaining charity and benevolence of his fellow men," he said. "The law of brotherhood directed to the apparent loss of brother love in the mighty cataclysm of blood and tears through which the world has passed. The law of brotherhood shall be announced, is now reading a harvest of bitterness. In a prescient moment the orator declared that universal charity and generosity would be the only solution of the problems when war will be more. He said material reward in sorry recompense or encouragement for high practices and no address with an urgent word in remembrance of those who have passed that place unknown from whose bourne no one can ever be brought back to life. To remember, he said, to live."

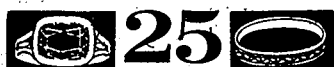
## CIDER EXTRACT SPREE

### Three Men Wanted for Unbecoming Conduct—Jailed to Stay During the Winter.

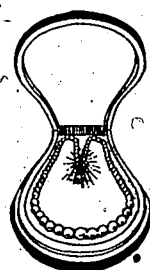


