W. F. Alworth is Only Candidate Named in Opposition to Present Directors; but Votes for Others is Intimated

DISCUSSION WAXES WARM  
ABOUT LABOR EFFICIENCY

Stockholders Recite Instances of Slackness on Part of Employees of Corporation; Manager Replies

Opposition to the re-election of members of the board of directors of the Twin Falls Canal company was manifested at Monday morning's session of the annual meeting of stockholders when the name of W. F. Alworth was placed in nomination for director by C. A. Robinson, Twin Falls, and when, soon after the nominations had been declared closed by vote of the assembly, Mr. Robinson asked for a ruling by the chair as to the validity of voting for persons not placed in nomination for directors.

After consultation with J. R. Bothwell, attorney for the canal company, and others, Chairman Asher B. Wilson ruled on this question that "as least proposition" votes cast for candidates not placed in nomination would be valid.

The names of other persons for whom such votes might be cast were not disclosed.

Five to Be Elected.

With five directors to be elected, six nominations were made, that of Mr. Alworth being the only one which, other than the five candidates are the members of the present board; J. H. Barker, Bulli, (land Brown, Bulli; Ivan G. Lincoln, Edgar P. A. Koenig, Kimberly, and W. F. Alworth.

Discussion of the report of a committee named two years ago to draft new by-laws for the corporation, and action on the report, was expected to follow after the afternoon session.

McPherson Objects.

DRASTIC RESOLUTION ON ALIEN LAND OWNERSHIP IS INTRODUCED IN HOUSE.

BOISE (Special to The News)—Adoption of house concurrent resolution No. 1 introduced by Representative George W. Van de Steeg of Canyon county, would place the Idaho legislature on record in opposition to ownership or lease of land in Idaho by subjects of Japan, who are specifically mentioned in the resolution, and in opposition to the enactment or adoption by Congress of any law or treaty with Japan which would abridge the right of states to determine their own course with respect to admission of Japanese immigrants.

Purpose to maintain the west as a "white man's country" and declaration that the Japanese are a "non-similable race" is contained in the preamble to the resolution.

Mr. Van de Steeg announced that he is preparing to follow introduction of this resolution with the introduction of a bill to prohibit immigration of Japanese into Idaho and to forbid subjects of Japan from owning or holding land in this state.
