

GALDWELL BOYS DEFEAT LOCALS IN FAST GAME

Field's Delivery Puzzles Twin Falls Lads, Who Wobble in Defensive Work at Critical Times

The Caldwell high school baseball team defeated the Twin Falls high school baseball nine yesterday afternoon at Laneson field by the score of 10 to 3, in a game that was featured by the hard hitting of the winners, with men on bases.

For seven innings it was as pretty a game as one would want to see, the score up to the first of the eighth being 1 to 0 in favor of the visitors. In the eighth the locals cracked, allowing the Canyon county boys to gather four runs. The ninth inning showed more disjointed play, the Caldwell team, scoring five runs on three hits and three errors.

Field Is Puzzler.

Walter Field, on the mound for the enemy, pitched a clever game, allowing but six scattered hits up to the ninth inning when a single and two homers netted the locals their three runs. Field has an easy delivery with a large assortment of curve balls, and above all, he is endowed with coolness.

Fix, majority of the locals, twirled great ball for seven innings, allowing eight wildly scattered hits and but one run.

The Caldwell team as a whole showed the greatest fielding exhibition seen on the local field as far as high school baseball is concerned. Lyke at third startled the fans with three beautiful stops, taking them in like a big leaguer.

E. Lowell, who came here touted as the best first baseman in the state, and not having made an error this year lived up to his reputation having 14 putouts in his credit without a bobbie.

Lanester Is Star.

Lanester played a beautiful game at short gobbling up five different chances with nary a miss. He lead his team in hitting yesterday, popping out three hits out of four trips to the plate, on a two bagger and one a triple.

Kim, the Hawaiian second baseman for the visitors, although making two errors, played a neat game and cracked out two clean bingles.

For the home club there isn't much in the feature lino after speaking of

the two terrific clouts by Fix and Hammond over the right field fence. Bobbles came at the wrong time, allowing the visitors to pile up runs on hits that should have been outs.

Two fast double plays featured the game, each team making one.

Make Easy Start.

Caldwell started scoring in the first inning when Lawson, first man up, scoring the visitors to pile up runs on hits that should have been outs.

Hammond picked one to his liking, and drove the pellet over the right field fence for another homer, heading Mur. Lanester, ss., Harper, batting for Jamison, whiffed on three pitched balls.

Accumulate Five Runs.

The ninth brought five more runs across for Caldwell. After Jamison had taken care of Kim's easy grounder Field singled to left, Lawson was safe when L. Jarman let his roller get away from him. E. Lowell hit one to Jamison who threw Lawson out at second. G. Jarman hooded Lanester's grounder and all hands were safe, Fix scoring on the throw to the plate. E. Lowell went to third. Putzler threw the ball so left field, Lowell scoring.

Lyke tripped to deep center, scoring Lanester. L. Jarman booted Hurt's roller and Lyke scored. Hurt stole second, Jensen was passed, D. Lowell singled to center, scoring Hurt. On the throw to the plate Jensen took too long, from C. to G. Jarman.

After Lanester had thrown Putzler out at first, Cliff Fix slipped once off the right field fence for a homer, saving the locals from a shutout. Thometz whiffed the air, but Mussell gave the fans a start with a clean single to right. "Slim"

D. Lowell was robbed of a double in the eighth when Fix, who had taken Nye's place in right field, speared his liner with one hand. Fix deserved the hand he received from the stands.

Hurt made a nice running catch of Cron's long fly in the eighth.

Fix's homer in the last of the ninth saved the locals from being shut out.

The big league umpiring of Bar Woolman was a feature of yesterday's play. Bar is a past master in the art of running a ball game.

Gerald Jarman boosted his batting average with three out of four.

The teams play again today.

TODAY'S MARKETS

GRAIN PRICES RECEDE IN CHICAGO MARKETS

Weather Conditions, Favorable to Growing Crop, Induce Drop in Opening Bidding Across Board

CHICAGO, (AP)—With cool and wet weather prevailing, regarded as likely to improve the conditions of the winter crop and the spring crop as well, the wheat market averaged a little lower in price today during the early trading. Declines, however, were checked by the fact that Liverpool quotations showed relative firmness as compared with the setbacks in price here yesterday. Chicago receipts today totalled 170 cars. Deliveries on May contracts amounted to 161,000 bushels. The opening which varied from 1-4c lower to 1-2c advance, with May \$1.45 1-2 and July \$1.27 1-4 was followed by a slight upturn and then by a moderate general decline. Rains causing delay to planting of corn tended to steady the market for corn and oats. After opening unchanged to 1-8c higher, July 64 5-8c, the corn market hardened a trifle more and then underwent an eight-cent advance. Oats started 1-8c off to 1-4c advance, July 40 to 40 1-8c then kept close to the initial range.

Provisions not neglected but steady in line with hog values. The market for hogs was rather aggressive in selling, increased weakness of May affected the new crop deliveries. The close was unsettled 1-8 to 1-4c net lower with May \$1.41 3-4 to 1.42 and July \$1.36 1-8 to 1.39 3-8.

Shipping demand here was slow. The close was only at 1-8 to 3-8c net decline with July 64 1-4 to 64 3-8c.

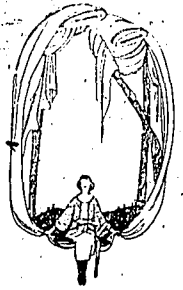
