

SOUTH AGAINST WESTERN STATE DAIRY MEASURE

Governors Protest Plans to Tax Butter Substitutes Proposed by Idaho Legislature; Gooding Also Opposed.

ATLANTA, Ga., Feb. 19 (AP)—Two southern governors today expressed opposition to the already expressed against legislation either taxing oleomargarine, which is a combination of animal and vegetable fats, or forbidding the manufacture of butter substitutes.

Members of congressional delegations also held their views to the protest from the floor of the senate in Washington.

Wants Bills Defeated. Governor Fujita of Louisiana today requested members of the Louisiana congressional delegation to use their influence to defeat the proposed legislation.

Telegrams protesting the passage of such measures were sent to the governors of Wisconsin, Moore of Idaho, Dera of Utah, Richardson of California and J. Lyons, Baker of Missouri, McKellen of Nebraska, Donahay of Ohio and Pierce of Oregon.

BEPRIMAND FOR MITCHELL FAILS TO MATERIALIZE

Report That Presidential Rebuke Was in Store for Air Chief Proves Ungrounded; Story From Examiner.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19 (AP)—Yesterday's widely advertised story that a presidential reprimand was imminent for Brigadier General Mitchell exploded today with a force that left those who had stood sponsor for it scurrying to cover.

General Mitchell, himself, placed on the stand before the house aircraft committee, testified he never had received the summons to the White House, reports of which were disseminated from the committee room.

Later Representatives Perkins of New Jersey, the committee examiner, put on the grill by these newspaper correspondents who had assumed responsibility for the story without attempting to verify it in other quarters.

The New Jersey representative did not say from what source his information came, but he did repeat with particular emphasis an assertion made earlier in the day at the committee session that General Mitchell had not himself started the rumor.

General Mitchell, instead of going to the White House for the heralded reprimand, appeared once more before the aircraft committee, reaffirming his opposition to the air policies of the war and navy departments.

American Steamship Captain Is Held by Chinese Authorities

Ship Strikes Yangtze River Sampan and Officer Jailed; Sailors to Get Release.

PEKING, Feb. 20 (AP)—Captain Hawley, an American of the steamship Chinchuan, which flies the American flag, is being detained by military authorities at Kwei-chowfu, Szechwan province, because his ship struck a Yangtze river sampan, it became known in reports received here today.

The captain was taken from the ship, although his passengers were permitted to remain aboard. American sailors from gunboats at Washington, 75 miles west of Peking, 100 miles east of Kwei-chowfu, have started for the latter port to secure Captain Hawley's release.

MEAT SHORTAGE PREDICTED IN AMERICA SOON

NEW YORK, Feb. 19 (AP)—The American family's "T-bone steak" and "prime roast beef" as just will be both scarce and dear by next September, a delegation of cattle raisers and sheep farmers from mid-western states told Wall Street financiers at a luncheon today.

INDIAN AFFAIRS EXECUTIVE NOT GUILTY, REPORT

Special House Committee Exonerates Commissioner Burke of Charges of Graft Made by Former Judge.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19 (AP)—The majority report of a house committee which investigated administration of the office of Indian Affairs today exonerated Commissioner Burke on charges of maladministration, preferred by Hugh Murphy, former judge of Oklahoma county, Oklahoma, and cleared the Oklahoma court of similar charges brought against it by the Indian Rights association of Philadelphia.

Representative Hastings, Oklahoma, and Hill, Washington, democrat, filed minority reports, concerning disposition of \$1,000,000 of the estate of Jackson Barnett, wealthy aged restricted Creek Indian, in two equal fifty, one to his wife and the other as an endowment for an Indian school and orphanage.

Outcome Held Detrimental. Representative Howard, democrat, Oklahoma, who brought the Murphy charges to the attention of the house by inserting them in the congressional record, declared the outcome of the investigation was the "most detrimental thing that has happened to the Indians in 25 years."

The majority report, signed by Chairman Snyder, New York, and Representative Leavitt, Montana; Garber, Oklahoma, and Drumm, Pennsylvania, republicans, and Hayden, Arizona, democrat, found that "there is nothing to sustain any charge of corruption against the commissioner of Indian affairs, Charles H. Weeks of Effort to Recover Body of Man in Canada Unavailing; Caught by Slide.

LETHBRIDGE, Alta., Feb. 19 (AP)—A story of an abandoned mine working, a trapped homesteader and several weeks of treacherous toil to bring his body to the surface, but without success—a parallel of the now famous Floyd Collins cave case, reached here today from the north country.

George A. Holden, 37, a homesteader, was the victim, and lay his body in the old mine, covered by tons of debris and fire raging around. Holden entered the mine on January 22, last, to obtain fuel and without warning the roof of the workings caved in. It was instantly killed. The aged man's head was visible beneath the earth and rocks. The mine caught fire from the lantern carried by the victim.

SENATE PASSES NUMBER BILLS DURING SESSION

Armistice Day Will Become Legal Holiday if Governor Signs One Measure; District Fair Provision Approved.

JOHNS, Feb. 19 (AP)—Armistice day, November 11, will attain legal holiday in Idaho if the governor signs H. R. 20,150, which received favorable consideration at the hands of the upper house of the Idaho legislature Thursday afternoon.

The district fair bill, by Yeaman, Newcomb and Dera, was one of the bills passed by the senate. It permits three or more counties to band together for the purpose of conducting a district fair-act for one week or more of the county petition the board of county commissioners.

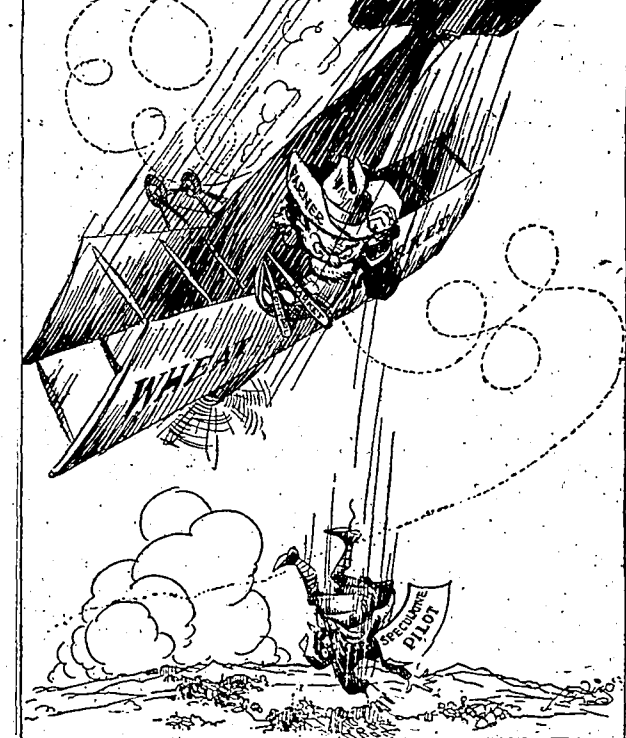

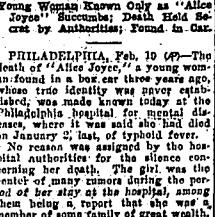
