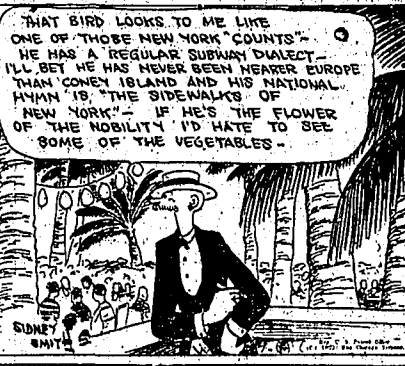
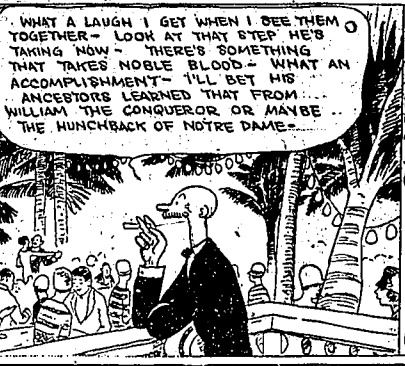
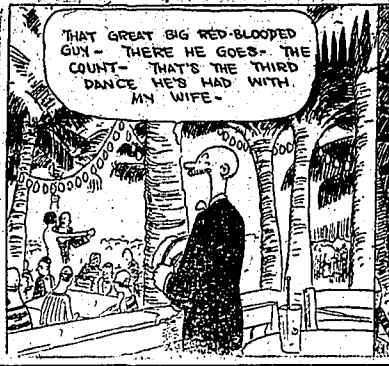

A deputy sheriff Wednesday afternoon went to Roseworth to learn whether Vandenberg had taken with him approximately \$200. It was hoped in his home there. It was believed that Vandenberg had only a small sum of money when he disappeared.

First Visit Here.
Vandenberg, with his wife, who is the daughter of the storekeeper at Roseworth, and family, arrived recently from New York. The first visit to Twin Falls yesterday, when he was accompanied by Hansen and by his wife. The latter, played last night at another hotel here.
Vandenberg, according to a description given the officers here, is about 35 years old, five feet 11 inches tall, and weighs approximately 165 pounds. His complexion is dark. He wears a light-colored, gray overcoat and brown shoes and bib overalls over his trousers.
Vandenberg and Hansen registered Tuesday night at about 10 o'clock at the Waverly hotel. Hansen immediately went to bed while Vandenberg, according to the officers, went to walk around town a while, left the room and did not return.

OUTBUILDING DESTROYED FIRE MENACES DWELLING

Blaze Originating in Smokehouse at C. G. Kelly Residence on Addison Avenue, Threatens Heavy Loss.

Fire that originated in a smokehouse in connection with a garage and the outbuilding there, at the residence of C. G. Kelly, 440 Addison avenue east, at about 11:30 a. m. Wednesday, destroyed the combination building and for a time threatened to spread to the dwelling house about 30 feet distant. There was no car in the garage at the time.

Twin Falls fire department, while making hose connections and placing the engine in position to pump water from the Pacific coulee, discharged the contents of a chemical tank on the dwelling and then brought the blaze under control.
No estimate was made as to the loss involved.

OUTLINES FIGHT ON LEAF ROLLER

Idaho Entomologist Details Results of Recent Tests in War on Orchard Pest.

Conclusions based on results of tests conducted by Claude Wakeland, entomologist in charge of the experiment station, with a view to determining most effective methods of combating the leaf roller were given by Mr. Wakeland in an address delivered before a recent meeting of horticulturists here and have been further developed by him in the following letter written in response to request of George F. Sprague, secretary of the Idaho Fruit Growers' association.
Results of our tests of last season on eggs of the fruit tree leaf roller indicate that a very satisfactory degree of kill could be obtained by the commercial miscible oil or oil emulsion and also by the home mixed oil emulsion. Commercial emulsions tested were Dornoll, Freesulphon, Target Scale Destroyer and Dornoll Solignum. Paraffin, Atlantic and Brown Neutral oils were used and emulsions were prepared by both the government and Missouri station formula. The Missouri station formula gave us a 100 per cent better result than the Missouri station formula. Likewise Atlantic Red gave a little better kill than Brown Neutral. In general, however, our results indicate that the difference in per cent of kill is not sufficient to justify the difference in price and in selecting one of these oils the grower can safely choose the one of his own preference. Both commercial emulsions, Brown Neutral oil, last season sold at less than two-thirds the price of either of the other two oils.

From the standpoint of practicability the Missouri station formula is better for use here than the government formula since an emulsion made by this process is easier to prepare, cheaper, and can be used with hard waters where difficulty might be experienced in the use of the government emulsion on account of the soap used in it. The Missouri station formula, however, the government emulsion has to be bolted.
Calcium Caseinate Oil Emulsion—Cold Mixed.
Canebrake Station Formula.
Engine oil, gallons..... 2
Water, gallons..... 1
Calcium caseinate, ounces..... 4
In preparing this emulsion dissolve the calcium caseinate in the water. This can easily be done by placing the caseinate in a can with a tight top and shaking with sufficient water to dissolve it. Another method is to place the caseinate in a large bucket and draw it with stream of water forced through a spray gun or nozzle. After the caseinate is dissolved and the oil and water are thoroughly mixed, the emulsion should be stirred together and then pumped four times under pressure through a spray gun or nozzle to produce a satisfactory emulsion. In combining the ingredients it makes no difference whether the oil is added to the water or the water to the oil provided that the calcium caseinate is first dissolved in the water. Pumping may be done through a mechanical sprayer or through an orchard sprayer machine with a spray gun or nozzle attached to the hose.
