WEATHER FAVORS GROWING CROPS

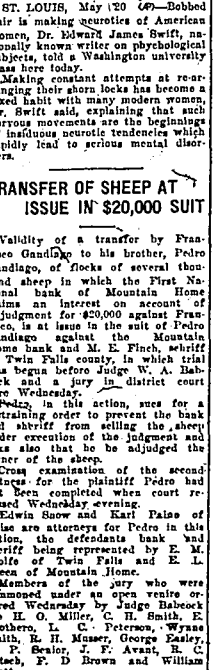
Nature Good to Southeast Idaho During the Last Week, Says Report of Bureau.

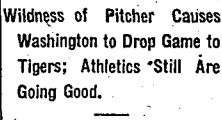

DRIVE FOR BIBLE TEACHING IN MAKING HERE

Defeat of Part Time Religious Education Bill in Idaho Claims Attention of State Sunday School Workers.

Death at the hands of the last session of the Idaho legislature of the bill that would have provided for religious education in connection with the public schools seems likely to come in for a generous measure of attention from the Idaho council of religious education and annual Sunday school convention that opened three days ago in the Methodist Episcopal church here Wednesday.

A new campaign looking toward more successful presentation of the measure to another Idaho legislature seems likely to be mapped out at the convention here, and in this undertaking, it is believed, much assistance is to be given by state and national leaders in the field of religious education who are members of the convention faculty, including Dr. Hugh S. McGill of Chicago, executive secretary of the international council of religious education; and Dr. Walter A. Squires of Philadelphia, head of the week-day church schools of the United States.

One Hundred Register The convention opened its sessions with a registration of about 100 delegates, including Sunday school executives and teachers from many southern Idaho communities and a number of state and national leaders in the field of religious education. The opening session heard addresses by Mr. H. R. Shaw of Denver, director for the children's division of the Colorado council of religious education, on "Childhood, the Hope of the World," and by Rev. E. M. Jasper of Salem, Oregon, superintendent of Sunday school work for the Methodist Episcopal church in Oregon, on "The Young People and the Educational Program."

The opening session heard addresses, presided over by Dr. H. O. Meredith of Nampa, state president, and a conference with state educators marked the opening of the convention sessions this afternoon. Delegates and convention workers were guests at a fellowship breakfast served in the Baptist bungalow. A statement of committees was announced just before adjournment this morning.

Dr. A. H. Upham, president of the University of Idaho, is to open second day's session this morning with an address on "The Church and the Public School in Religious Education."
