San Francisco Sees New Day Dawning With Completion of South Idaho Line

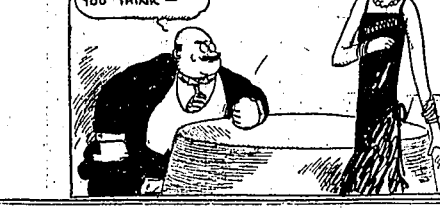

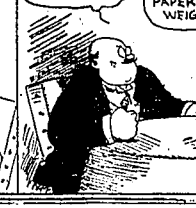

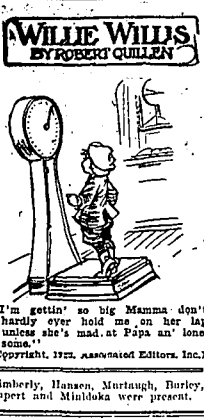

ARTESIAN WELL WILL TAP FLOW FOR NATATORIUM New Enterprise for Twin Falls Definitely Launched; Experienced Driller Promises Water and Tells Reasons.

next few months, it was learned Wednesday. Promoters of the project hold an option for purchase from H. D. Maxwell of a tract of 11 acres of land west of Blue Lakes toward north, where that thoroughfare is crossed by the Perrine road. The proposed natatorium site, which is to be made available to the public as a free parking and picnic grounds, is within a mile of the center of town and on the route of the imminent bridge that is to span Snake river canyon at Blue Lakes, over which it is anticipated thousands of tourists and sightseers will pass each season.

Moore, half brother of Mr. O'Connor, and Jack Cochran, well known well drillers of this district will be associated with Mr. O'Connor in the undertaking. Gives Geological Outline. In support of his contention that warm artesian water flow is to be encountered in a well sunk on the proposed site, Mr. O'Connor quoted reports of both national and state geological experts. It is his opinion that the flow will be encountered under and impregnated with a heavy deposit that marks the bed of a great lake that once covered this region. This deposit has been identified by geologists as the Payette tertiary. It is found underneath the lava flow that subsequently poured over this region. It is Mr. O'Connor's opinion that the Payette tertiary, forming a great syncline in the district with Snake river in its trough, has sealed up a vast reservoir of underground waters. He pointed out that the area extending west to 200 miles from west Yellowstone to Algh is one of heavy precipitation, but that only a small proportion of the precipitation in this area enters the river. It is his opinion that the water flows under the tertiary stratum at the base of surrounding hills where its depth is

relatively thin and that there has thus been formed a great underground reservoir of artesian waters. Mr. O'Connor insists that no great work is involved in the plan to bring in an artesian well of immense flow. Heating System Probability. He suggested that the temperature of the artesian flow may be so high that it may prove feasible to work out a plan for heating buildings in Twin Falls by means of warm artesian water. He would not be surprised, he stated, to encounter water of 150 degree temperature. Heat of the earth in this region is about twice as great as it is in the middle western states, he stated. Warm Springs which Mr. O'Connor regards as outcroppings of the artesian basin underlying this region, are to be found at Hanbury's natatorium in Snake river canyon, a mile west of here and in the river canyon near the Hansen bridge, 10 miles east of Twin Falls.
