

TOLL IS HIGH IN EXPLOSIONS ABOARD BOATS

Two Tankers Collide on Mississippi River Below New Orleans; Blast Following Hurts Many Into Waters.

(By the Associated Press.) NEW ORLEANS, April 8.—A collision between two tankers on the Mississippi River below New Orleans tonight resulted in a series of explosions aboard the vessels.

Five missing. Five members of the crew of the Stimpson Oil tanker O. T. Waring were missing tonight as a result of a series of explosions aboard the vessel in a collision here today.

Members of the crew of a tanker of 200 were injured. Newspaper men were rushing to the scene of the collision to obtain details of the collision between the two vessels.

Edward Balser, Joseph Elias, E. T. Bayl, Manuel Alvarez, Perry Laurier, members of the crew of the Stimpson, were among those known to have been aboard the vessel when the blast occurred.

The several miles the river was literally ablaze with benzine, which covered the banks immediately after the collision struck each other.

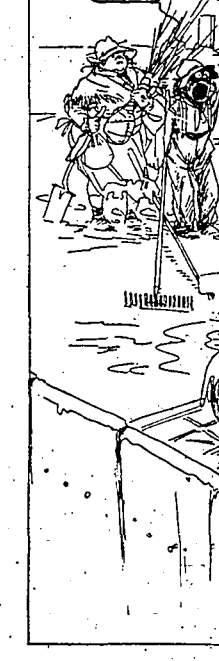
The president expressed hope that the congress would hold frequent meetings which he said would tend to betterment of relations between North and South Americans.
