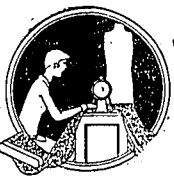

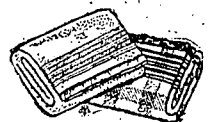

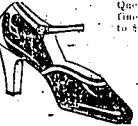

CHICAGO GRAIN TAKES SLUMP

Slackness of Demand for North American Wheat and Argentine News Hurts Prices.

CHICAGO, Jan. 19 (AP)—Wheat turned downward today, affected chiefly by apparent slackening of demand from the Argentine government, which would artificially sustain value. Closing quotations on wheat were heavy, but not lower, and 50¢ to 10¢ higher up, on the down to a shade advance, and provisions varying from 7¢ to 10¢ higher.

Slackness of demand today for North American wheat tended to emphasize the depressing effect of the latest news regarding intentions of the Argentine government. Furthermore, the Liverpool market was lower than expected, and a weak Argentine market showed 3,287,000 bushels increase for the week.

No official Action

Apparent authoritative messages to Chicago grain houses explained that although the Argentine government will try to prevent the Argentine wheat crop from being exported at an unduly low price, no definite steps in that direction had been taken. A generally accepted opinion among Chicago traders was that Argentine supplies of wheat must be in handsome if government should require necessary to support the price.
