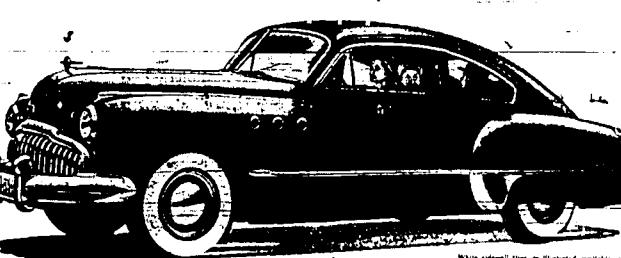

The proposal's backers, however, yesterday advised that they would not change their minds. Research shows that more frequent changes are essential, the backers said.

Company representatives across the nation disagreed.

W. T. Holliday of the Standard Oil Company of Ohio said that the proposal would mean a 100-mile shift to the traditional 100-mile run. Oil becomes contaminated in 100 miles, he said, with gritty particles and dirt, and it affects the performance and the life of the motor.

Mr. Holliday said that he would not want to be quoted as "I'd lose my job."

He said any car could go at least 100 miles without any trouble at all, and some of the gas that he said would make it make my living selling.
