### Price Draws Plan to Stop Gas Refunds

BOISE, Jan. 7 (AP)—Secretary of State J. D. Coy Price today had outlined a plan for controlling gas prices.  
Five recommendations were included in the plan, prepared for Idaho legislators.  
At the present time, Idaho farmers and city gasolines pay tax without paying state gasoline taxes, but pay the tax at the time of the purchase of gasolines.  
Price suggests that colored gasoline be added for effective consumption making it simple for officials to make periodic inspections to determine loss of privileges of five years and \$500 fine for farmers who use their gasolines for other than farm purposes.  
To obtain gasoline, Price suggests the applicant could receive a receipt from the clerk of the court where he makes application for the license.  
Price recommends this receipt of certificate could then be presented to the dealer for gasolines.  
On the certificate to the wholesaler who would remit the state tax along with the dealer's tax on refund would be required.

Cook said a gallon of water for every 100 pounds of feed is the correct ratio in raising hogs.

The county agent said extensive service agencies have found ways to increase the ability of hogs to resist diseases and internal parasites, as well as digestive disturbances.

Cook said a gallon of water for every 100 pounds of feed is the correct ratio in raising hogs.

In other advice, swine growers, the county agent said, a mineral shortage may be the cause of poor growth in hogs.
