

Up to 12 Inches of Snow Hits L. A.; Freeze Continues

Los Angeles Valley residents Tuesday could take comfort in the fact they weren't the only ones besieged by a winter of severity.

In Twin Falls recorded its lowest low temperature of the season, a minus 17 at 2:30 a. m., the southern California area blanketed by a record snowfall.

Services reported up to a foot of snow fell in the Los Angeles communities. The storm was described as the worst in the area.

California's history of cold snaps and southern blizzards is well documented in a report by a spokesman for the state weather bureau.

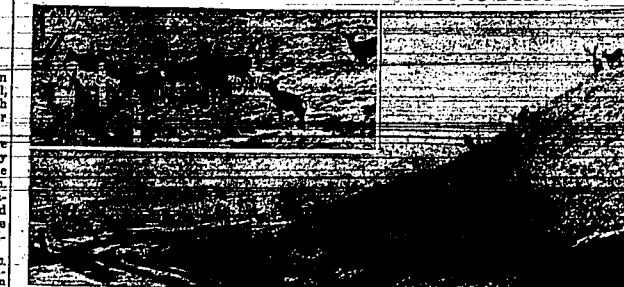
