TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—Sen. Rayburn, Tex., will possess more power and responsibility than any house speaker since the 1930s as a result of the new legislative procedure adopted by the majority group to break the rules committee's authority to keep legislative bills from the floor.

The good-natured Texan's appreciation of his new status makes it all the more surprising that he has met with the same resistance in the chamber after the system begins to operate. Under the new procedure the speaker's role is that of any regular standing committee which may demand recognition after a bill which the group has reported favorably has been held in rules for a day or two.

There will be times, of course, when a chairman will use this method to obtain a show-down on legislation not wanted by the administration. But, as Rayburn studies the new provision, he has no reason to expect to give the nod to the man on his feet. Otherwise, the speaker would be arrogating to himself the same control which the rules committee once possessed.

Pot Shots

HOW THINGS APPEAR FROM PEGLER'S ANGLE

"I think that I started at this period a very bad habit, which I have never cured. Frequently I would use, in talking to Mrs. Roosevelt, a phrase which I had overheard in her conversation."

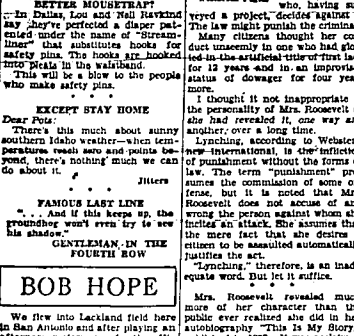

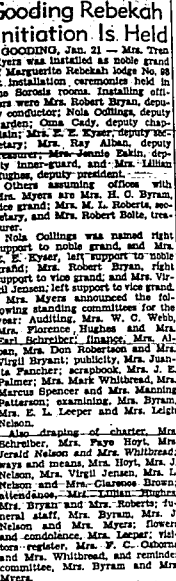
