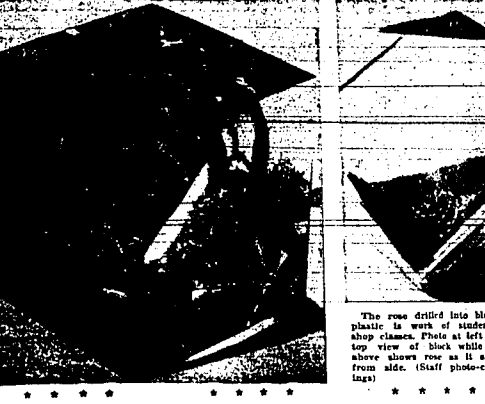

### New Army Way Befuddling to Oldtime Sergeants, Hank Says

It is still alive—and it's a cliché, it is because nothing short of the end of the world could kill him—Sergeant Salmooni must be the most befuddled man in the United States today.

After service in three wars, there is no possible way the army could make him understand that the army of today is different from the army of yesterday based on kindness and common sense. He is a sergeant in the army of today and that one of his major duties as a sergeant is to act as a sort of "soldier-sister" for the inexperienced in his charge. "No one with every so much as a grain of sensitivity would deny that the army is right in trying to provide the soldier of 1946 with an atmosphere of home, of that it is to be commended for its efforts to eliminate the toughness and roughness that has always been associated with the job of soldiering."

But at the same time, anyone who has ever been a soldier in time of war cannot but help visualize the bewilderment of the old non-com—the backbone of the army, I believe they are called when they receive instructions as they have of late: "From on casing—Look with a halfed glare on the rolls of dice. Be careful of the tone of voice used in addressing troops. Praline proper table manners. Be sure that each soldier keeps up a steady correspondence with the folks back home; in short, conduct yourself as if you were a counsellor at an exclusive boy's camp."

"I hope that Sergeant Salmooni, and thousands of others like him, can adjust themselves to this new routine

—but I'd hate to bet on it. I would much rather make a bet that the Sergeant Salmooni of the army would rather have a recruit knock that bull's-eye out on the rifle range for an expert's badge than have him get a letter of praise from the regimental commander for having the sharpest creased pants in the outfit."

Sergeant Salmooni—and his was the first face and voice that greeted me when I arrived at Camp Wheeler for basic training not too many years ago—believed it his duty to make life in training so miserable that you prayed for the day when you would be released from his clutches and given a chance to come hand to hand with a friendly German or Jap. He succeeded, as all who served under him will testify. As for his greeting a recruit with a "kindly smile, and then scurrying off to write the recruit's family that Johnny had arrived in fine shape and was happy, as sergeants are said to do today—well, you might as well ask Wetnamiller to play "Hallelujah!"

He greeted us, as I remember, by telling us that as there would be nothing for us to eat for six or seven hours, and, as he wouldn't like to be seen in our company, we could wash the roof off the barracks. Yes, wash the roof off, you went to wash the roof. So, you went to wash soap, brushes, and buckets of water. "The kind of a sergeant," he told us, "who likes the roof over your head as clean as the barrel of my rifle."

The roof cleaning assignment was reduced to the minimum by the sergeant and public relations official of the Pacific Supply Cooperative, Walla Walla, Wash., C. J. Lane, district manager, Pocatello, and Mark Taylor, with the farm machinery division, Pocatello.

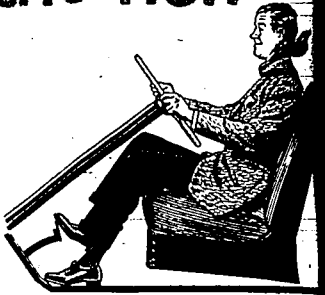

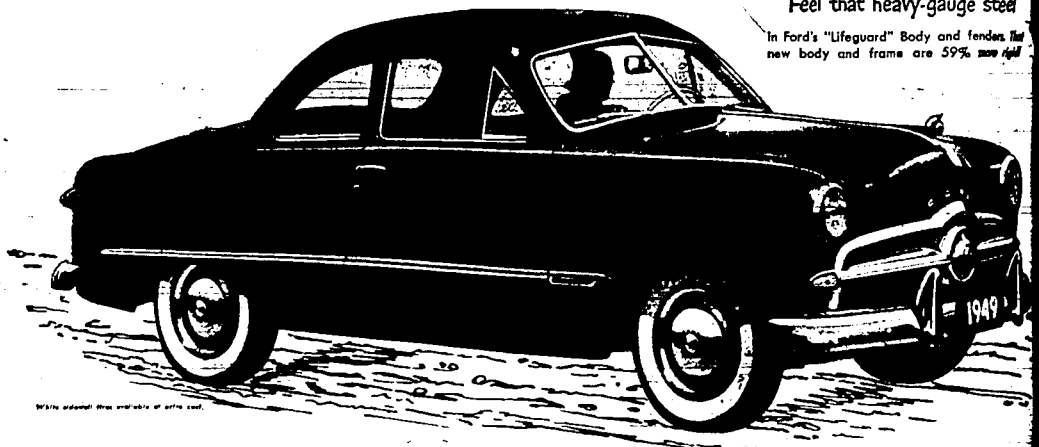
