The gambling bill provides for local option elections to determine whether the state will be incorporated in any incorporated city or village in the state. If the vote is in favor, the bill will be passed until an election is held and games of chance prohibited over portions of the bill.

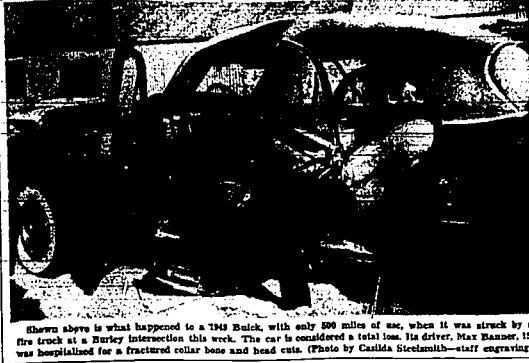

\$479 Is Quota of Each Resident of County in Taxes

Each resident of Twin Falls county will pay approximately \$479 as his share of maintaining county, state and federal governments in 1949. It was announced Thursday by the Idaho State Chamber of Commerce and the Associated Taxpayers of Idaho.

Twin Falls county's share of the federal budget amounts to approximately \$2,983,000, approximately \$2,824,000 of the two-year state budget, and approximately \$213,141 in local property tax charges for one year, the two organizations stated.

Although there is no definite method of computing Twin Falls county's exact share of the cost of government, the two organizations said, the above figures give an indication of the approximate cost to Twin Falls county taxpayers. The cost of government is shared by all taxpayers in the state.
