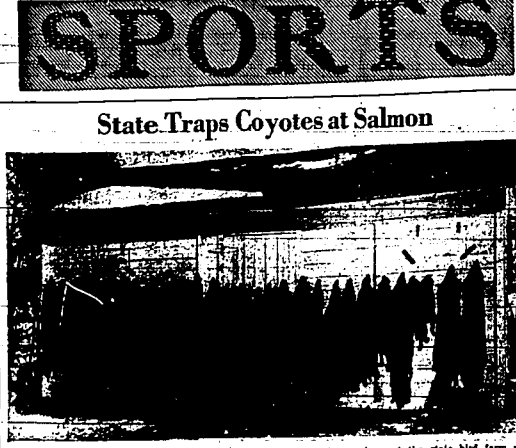

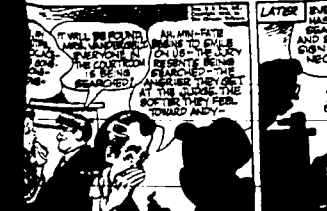

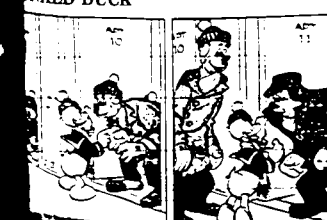

Atom Energy Will Help Out U. S. Farmer

By PAUL F. ELLIS

OAK RIDGE, Tenn., Feb. 3 (AP)—The element of America stands to reap great benefits from atomic energy. One of this "atomic city" may come plants now unknown to man—a potential addition to the world's shrinking food supply.

Add don't be surprised if you see "atomic" plants growing through a farmer's fence. That is part of the plot science is weaving to learn the secrets of why plants grow and what they need to produce bigger and better crops.

Radioactive fertilizer seen by scientists believe that increased and better crops will not come from "atomic" plants. The big gains, they said today, will come in better fertilizer—growth producing substances much cheaper and more powerful than used now.

The new type of fertilizer they believe, will come as a result of using radioactive isotopes, or substances, to determine delicately what food plants need to exist.

Bit of New News
As of today, it is too early to find out how much of various compounds to use in fertilizer.

Most fertilizer contains such substances as phosphorus, calcium, potassium and zinc. The time is here to wait until a crop yields to know just how much of each element must apply to the earth. The fertilizer compounds can be "tagged" with radioactive atoms. In the case of phosphate, for instance, it can be determined how much a plant takes from the soil.

Technique is Simple
The technique is simple. As the plant grows, the radioactive phosphorus it takes up can be measured by a Geiger counter, a delicate instrument that records radioactivity.

It also can be determined how much is left in the earth. Thus, better results in the making of fertilizing compounds can be made. After Hiroshima it first was believed that the radioactive earth made plants grow better, but later investigation showed that the ground was made more fertile by destruction of numerous types of organic material.

Montana Rancher Says Plenty Hay 'Available' There

CHEAT MOUNTAIN, Mont., Feb. 3 (AP)—At least 10,000 tons of hay are in the Great Falls and Triangle areas that should be hauled for shipment, says George Melton, Dillon, Mont., stockman, said.

Melton, checking supplies of hay for stockmen in Idaho and Utah, said "there is no hay shortage in our state." He said he talked with farmers, ranchers, hay producers,

county agents and others cognizant of the food situation. The Dillon rancher expressed opposition to the bill introduced in the legislature to place an embargo over shipment of hay out of Montana.

"I seriously doubt this embargo is needed, for an emergency does not exist in this state," he asserted. Melton was accompanied in his tour by Vern Redfield of the Idaho Falls stock company, also interested in hay for Idaho and other areas in which his company has stock interests.
