Truman Reissues Plea for Controls Of Prices, Wages

WASHINGTON, Feb. 10 (AP)—President Truman called today for a steady push to control prices and wages. He said the government has a right to control prices and wages when he asked for the authority in his state union message Jan. 4.

At that time he sought the right to invoke price ceilings, but Congress refused to grant it. "Which basically affects necessary, or scarce commodities," which basically affects industrial production or the cost of living. He also pointed out that "unjustified" price adjustments would force a break in price ceilings.

'49 Economic Adjustment Will Hit Everybody, Expert Avers

Editor's note: What is behind the story here is the commodity market. What effect will it have on American prices? How does it mean to all of us? A nationally known economic statistician answers these questions in the following interview.

NEW YORK, Feb. 10 (AP)—Every body is going to get a little bit in the economy adjustment this year. A. W. Zelenski said today.

But there isn't going to be an enormous rise in prices. No body is going to be hurt too bad. And there is no need for a panic, Zelenski said.

The working man, he said, is going to get the best of the reshuffle that's coming.

Zelenski is an economic statistician with a suite of offices and a staff of economists and market analysts in the Empire state building. He is a man who figures the odds in the business world.

"The falling prices, the temporary unemployment in some cases, the adjustments are being made as a normal thing. It's a matter of simple arithmetic," Zelenski said.

"It merely means that prices were too high. The public has bought all of the products that it had to have at any price, and now is waiting for prices to drop. Supply has caught up with demand.

"There is no depression in sight. There is still an unmet public demand for all kinds of goods. It is a good thing for the country as a whole to have a period of readjustment. It's good for people who could afford to pay high prices, manufacturers and business men. The masses who can't afford to pay prices only in ratio to their earnings."

What does this mean to the different economic groups?

Here is Zelenski's prediction: "The general public will be hurt the most of all classes of income. Some goods will have to be sold at less than their cost. There will be some merchandise produced at a lower cost."

Workers—"The cost of living will fall from 8 to 10 per cent by December. It will be held at that minimum for a while, but then it will drop. Such as rent, utilities, telephone and other services which did not skyrocket in cost and will not fall off. Salaries will not decrease that much."

Farmers—"Farm prices will fall this year. They did last year principally because of the decline in prices. However, farmers will not go into a tailspin because they are not speculating as heavily in land as the rest of the world. They have a reserve from high profits during the war. The exceptionally high farm prices benefited a few farmers and lower living costs and farm machinery price drops which began last fall will benefit all. Manufacturers—"Profit per unit will drop off, but not as much as you would think. A cost adjustment will be necessary, with sharp salary cuts. First reduction in labor costs will be the dismissal of "bums and loafers" with a resulting higher output per man hour.

"The general outlook is that the sharp rise in prices will be followed by a period of readjustment. It will be a normal thing. It's a matter of simple arithmetic," Zelenski said.

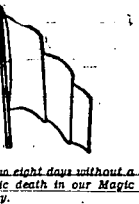

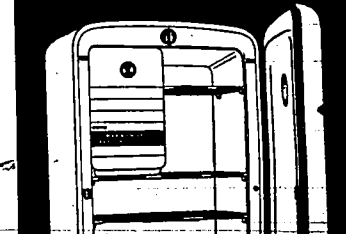

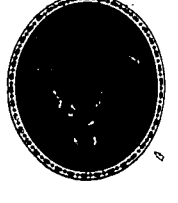

This guarantee was expected to be made from the United States Treasury.

However, as of Feb. 10 of this year, eight months after the program was established, only the negligible sum of \$50,000 has been received from the Treasury. And it was a supposedly cautious, Yankee concern, probably owned by Republicans, which took the risk.

The loss transfer is the Godfrey Cabot company, Boston, which is engaged in the export of a carbon black plant in England, the most stable of the Marshall plan beneficiaries.

DETERRANT—Administrator Paul Hoffman has under consideration 18 other applications for the program. But the money involved totals only a mere \$4,800,000. And the investments are scattered, and the others are for ventures in France, Holland and other European countries.

Hoffman admits frankly the principal deterrent to the export of capital consists in the disturbed conditions overseas, especially the ever-present possibility of war with Russia in which the investments would be destroyed or confiscated by an enemy.

HELLS CANYON FOR WHAT?

A. C. Inman, vice president of the Idaho Power company, has advanced some interesting reasons why Idaho should be on its guard against being sold a bill of goods during all the present agitation for federal development of the Hells Canyon.

At an army engineers' hearing in Boise the other day, Mr. Inman offered several arguments why Idaho should be opposed to the comprehensive plans set up in the so-called "1938 report" for the development of the Columbia river basin, including power, flood control and navigation projects.

The main control plan embodied in "1938 report" proposes a monstrous dam in Hells Canyon, which the people of Idaho already have heard much about.

Mr. Inman has reminded the people of this state that the main control plan, "as the report shows, is essentially a public power program." That that is not the case, he contends, there is no particular need for such a development in Idaho.

"If (the plan's) power projects should be located in the areas where additional power is needed, now and also will be needed in 1960, over and above the ability of existing agencies, both public and private, to supply," he said. "That is not the situation in southern Idaho and eastern Oregon. There is no power shortage in southern Idaho and eastern Oregon. No such program exists or will exist in the foreseeable future, either in southern Idaho, or in eastern Oregon, Utah and Montana, where existing electric companies are fully meeting all demands and will continue to do so."

The future of southern Idaho and eastern Oregon is dependent upon the continuation of a sound and economic program of reclamation, not upon public power, according to Mr. Inman. The department's agencies, he understands, can now qualify to use part of the \$1,000,000 which congress has voted for emergency use.

“We said Utah has about used up an emergency state appropriation of \$250,000 for purchase and transportation of hay and feed.

Before the storm is over, he said, it may have to use for feed cost another special appropriation of \$500,000 intended for road clearing.

He said he hopes the aid which federal agencies provide will relieve the road fund sufficiently to permit this use.

Granger said he had word tonight that one-third of a herd of 100 Aberdeen Angus cattle had died in the storm.

“I find it hard to believe that so large a proportion of these sturdy cattle could perish, but it is an indication of the terrible situation the stock men are facing,” Granger said.

“I said he also was told, in a telephone conversation with his home, that snow banks are so high they would have to be abandoned and new roads packed down parallel to the old roads.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 10 (AP)—President Franklin D. Roosevelt's bill to repeal the T-H-Hartley act has run into a slow-down today as the senate labor committee extended its hearings until Feb. 23.

This is 13 days beyond the deadline set for tonight. It is a nine-day extension, in terms of actual hearing days.

The committee made its decision late yesterday at an uproarious session in the Senate chamber. The word “indefinite” flew around. The final vote was unanimous but that didn't mean everybody was happy.

Defeat for Demo

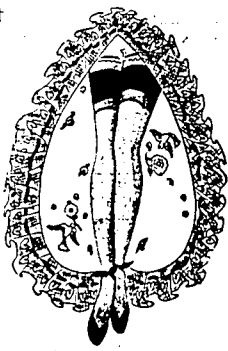

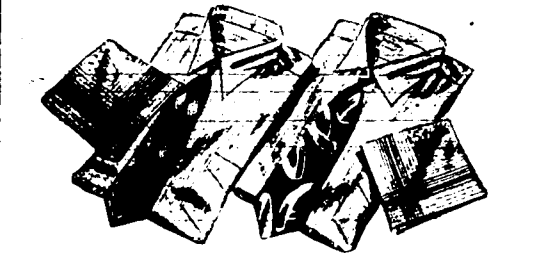
