Pope Asks for United Prayer From Faithful

VATICAN CITY, Feb. 14 (AP)—Pope Pius XII today appealed to Roman Catholics for united prayer April 9 to remove world evil he said were spreading again in the countries where a conspiracy has been formed against the Lord and against His Church.

The Vatican soon afterward announced a commemoration of the day that the pope's hands were raised in prayer against Josef Cardinal Mindszenty, bishop of Szeged, Hungary, in 1956. It instructed the same prayer for all those who in the future should be "completely innocent in the same crime."

The pope himself did not name any nations or any international organizations in his denunciation of world evil. The Vatican announcement, however, is to be made public according to communian and to the communist-ruled states behind the Iron curtain and throughout the world.

The pope praised the "ever closer alliances of nations at one point in his 1,000 word apostolic encyclical. Such unity of states, he said, should ward off the dangers of the future, and was a step in the future, with new weapons, will cause immense destruction."

Warns of Alliances
The pope warned, however, that these alliances "will be dangerous if they are not based on a strong sense of the brotherhood of men."

He said that "the conflict between the good and the wicked" has become, if ever, been so acute as it is today, the pope said.

"The enemies of God avail themselves of every kind of help and aid," he said, "including the radio, the press, the cinema, the radio, organizations, public meetings and private interviews, education and culture. All are at their service to spread ridicule and false teachings."

Pumping Project Farms to Be Leased to Test Water Supply

BURLEY, Feb. 14.—Based on the necessity of proving the existence of an underground water supply adequate to support the north side pumping development, six farm units will be leased and irrigation facilities will be completed for crop production this year.

S. R. Marsan, Minidoka project superintendent here, announced arrangements for lease of the six farms will be issued in the near future. He said an order had been placed for a deep-well pump and diesel power unit capable of producing 75 second-foot-of-water. Installation is planned for next month.

The farm units are located in the north side pumping division of the Minidoka project, 10 miles north of Rupert. They have an average irrigable area of 84 acres and range from 70 to 108 acres. Only one unit will be allowed to grow alfalfa and provide farm ditches.

Awards will be made according to the applicant's qualifications and the bid price. Successful bidders need not be veterans and will not be required to establish residence on the farm unit. No preference right to homestead these tracts at a future date and opening will be granted to any leasee.

Proposed Law OK's Loan to Homesteaders

WASHINGTON, Feb. 14 (AP)—Veterans settling on irrigated homesteads could obtain farm-development loans from federal sources under a law proposed by Rep. John Sweeney, R., Idaho.

He would amend the farmers home administration act to permit such loans, including those for water facilities.

Homesteaders are barred from such financing now because the original homestead title to the land until all project construction payments are repaid.

Under Sweeney's bill, FHA would acquire a lien on the land for the amount of its loan. If the original homestead title to the land is not repaid, the new homesteader would be charged with any balance due on the lien.
