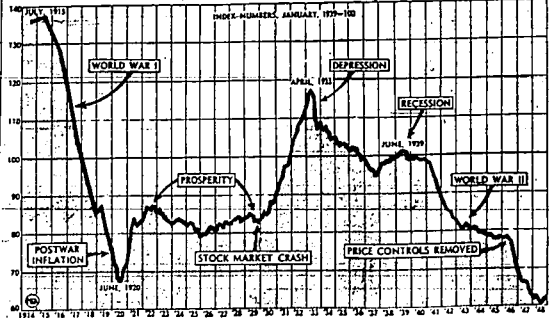

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24 (AP)—Administration Democrats have decided to open their drive against Senate filibustering Monday. Southern members who oppose the move announced they will filibuster against the measure.

Days of time-killing talk are in prospect while the southerners try to prevent action on the proposed change in Senate rules. The change would permit two-thirds of the senators to cut off their own filibusters on any bill.

Under the standing interpretation of the current rule, such a cut-off is possible only when a bill or resolution actually is before the senate. The rule has been held not to apply to such matters as a motion to take up a bill.

The southerners expect to base their filibuster on this point. As soon as an effort is made to call up the proposed new rule for discussion, one of their number will seek the floor and hold it as long as he can. Relays of orators will be ready to spill him if necessary.

A conference of Democratic senators agreed to open the fight against the filibuster Monday. Sen. J. Lee Rankin, Ill., said the issue has to come up sooner or later and "the general feeling is the sooner we get it the better."

Lucas announced that the senate will meet every day next week.

Businessmen Also to Gain Security Aid

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24.—A top-ranking Democrat said today that the man who owns a business can expect to gain under the federal government's old-age pension program soon.

But the Democratic spokesman predicted Congress will continue to exempt farm workers and household employees from the old-age and survivors insurance program. He said it isn't practicable to include them.

Informant Not Identified This Democrat asked not to be identified by name. He is an influential member of the House Ways and Means committee which will begin hearings Monday on the public assistance and the old-age and survivors insurance phases of the social security program.

The self-employed—doctors, lawyers, and those who own businesses—are among the principal groups covered by old-age and survivors insurance.

Mr. Truman, in two legislative proposals submitted to Congress Monday, recommended that the pension program be broadened to include the self-employed. He proposed that as of last Jan. 1 the self-employed contribute 2 1/2 percent of their gross income to finance their part of the program.

Comprehensive Reramping The President's two legislative proposals would also ramp up the old-age and survivors insurance program but also of the present new aid program.

Under the suggested public assistance expansion, nearly all self-employed persons would be eligible for federal financial aid. The only needy persons not eligible would be those who have no public assistance program in the area, the blind and dependent children.

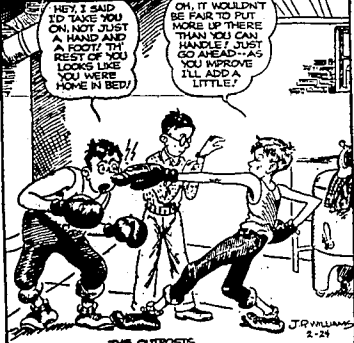

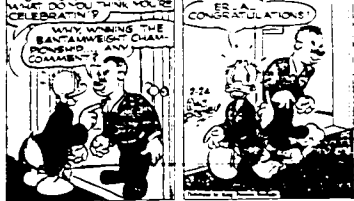
