Location of Students Studied in School Expansion Program

In order to plan school expansion in Twin Falls, four maps are being prepared to show the location of preschool, grade, junior and senior high school students, according to Clyde Koonas, chairman of the board of education.

"We can estimate the number of students who will be in school during the next six years by statistics of birth certificates in this county," Koonas said, "however, since many children who are born in Twin Falls actually live in other counties, the statistics are unreliable."

A house to house canvass is being made to show exactly how many children can be expected to enter Twin Falls grade schools in the future.

"In 1952 there will be a tremendous increase in the number of pupils," Koonas said.

He added that junior and senior high school information can be estimated from the number of students in the lower grades.

Information obtained in the survey will be compiled and mapped.

UP President Prominent in Western Area

SALT LAKE CITY, Feb. 25 (AP)—Arthur E. Stoddard, elected president of the United Pacific railroad yesterday, is well known in the intermountain west.

The railroad's headquarters here, Stoddard served as superintendent of the Utah division, with headquarters at Ogden, from 1914 to Dec. 1, 1941, when he was promoted to general superintendent of the eastern district in Omaha. Prior to that time he served as assistant superintendent of the eastern district with headquarters at Omaha, Cheyenne, Wyo., North Platte, Neb., and Laramie, Wyo.

Stoddard has been employed by the railroad since 1916.

Asbury, well-known in both Utah and Idaho, had been president since Feb. 1, 1946. Among many improvements completed under his direction was extension of diesel power, extension of centralized traffic control, completion of gravity classification freight yards and construction of the Aspen, Wyo., tunnel to eliminate the only section of single line track on the company's main Omaha-Salt Lake City line.

Snow Falls and Melts at Hailey

HAILEY, Feb. 25—With much of Magic Valley enjoying balmy weather, winter whitened this area again with a light snow "drizzle" which remained Wednesday after a brief but hard-driven storm Tuesday night. The snow enlarged water to look like heavy cables.

The forest service reports a total snowfall of 10 1/2 inches from Oct. 1948 to the first of this week, with a 40-inch snowfall for the same period a year ago. The official snow depth at Hailey now is 23 inches.

So rapid has the thaw been that snow shoveler-high to a fall man a week ago is now only about knee-deep. Further north the snow is still remaining with the promise of a long alk season. Depth is 55 inches on Oshkosh mountain and 64 on the highest station at Baldy mountain.

Herd Found High in 3 Areas—Counties

GOODING, Feb. 25—An average of 312 pounds of butterfat was produced by 441 cows in Gooding county during December, according to County Agent H. E. Higgins who said there was only one other herd improvement association in Idaho with a higher average.

Harold Harding, leader for the Gooding-Lincoln-Verme dairy herd improvement association, reported there were 22 herds with 189 cows milking and 83 cows dry for a total of 41. These cows averaged 128 pounds of milk and 312 pounds of butterfat for the month.

Of the 23 herds, 18 made the honor roll by averaging 30 pounds or more of butterfat for the month.

A GREAT VOLUNTARY REFORM

There is no denying that liquor is a problem, not only in the United States, but the world over. What can be done about it, however, is quite a different question.

We have had experience with prohibition in this country, and that experience was anything but good. There are certain reform organizations, however, which still insist that the evils of drink can best be defeated by making liquor illegal.

Those who have taken a more open-minded attitude in trying to determine what alcoholic is all about know that prohibition is absolutely the wrong approach. The Alcohol Foundation of America, working in cooperation with Yale university, has established another doubt that alcoholism is a disease.

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Through tolerance, understanding and reliance upon a greater power, the members of AA actually accomplish "an objective" which can never be achieved by prohibition, houses of correction, or anything of the kind.

Right before our very eyes we have seen a strange reform, voluntary in every respect, sweep over this country. Square dancing—a wholesome revival of entertainment, enjoyment and relaxation, an activity which has given millions of people an excuse for drum routine, new interest and an opportunity to meet new friends...

On one hand, many clubs the country over, which have depended on the sale of liquor as their sole source of revenue, are finding this square dancing business a real headache. The members spend their time square dancing instead of drinking.

Now, the churches have found, square dancing a more profitable activity. Many churches are dipping for more—not for a "lift," but merely to quench a naturally-activated, ineradicable thirst!

Anyone with liquor on his breath is given "the cold" every day. These men and women who several months ago have rated themselves as two-handed drinkers.

There's something about all this that should appeal to a lot of people's eyes. The only way to discourage indulgence in alcohol by the so-called "normal" or "social" drinkers is to provide them with something for a voluntary incentive—something which they will accept as being more desirable.

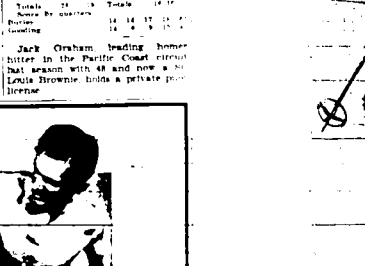
