### Use Reported For Sawtooth Forest Areas

HAILEY, March 3—Nearly one-fourth of a million visits were made to the Sawtooth national forest for recreation during 1944, according to a report issued by the State Supervisor Frank S. Moore. This is a heavy increase over the 1947 figure, and is more than double the number of visits made in any year earlier than 1947, said Moore.

The average visitor remained in the forest for about two and one-half days, the report indicated, making a total of 510,000 man-days use of the forest for recreation purposes. The comparable figure for 1947 is 262,000 man-days.

Winter Sports

A new winter sports area located in Soldier's creek about 15 miles north of Fairfield accounted for only a small number of visits because it was established late in the year, according to Moore. It is expected to become a popular area, drawing skiers not only from Fairfield, but from Gooding, Jerome, Twin Falls and other sections of the lower country.

Summer Usage

Campgrounds were heavily used throughout the summer, with an estimated 40,000 visits. Most of these days each, being made to these areas. Picnic areas accounted for 16,000 visits, approximately 600 more than last year.

Types of recreation use covered by the report include summer camps of Boy Scouts, camps, camps and similar groups, vacations at hotels or resorts located in the forest, and visits to privately owned summer residences, allowed under special permit from the forest service.

From Far From Capital

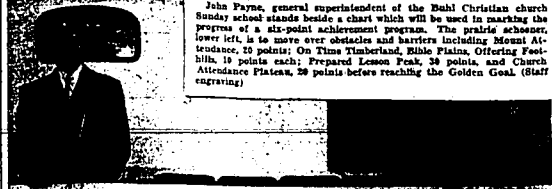
Extremes, the chief industrial community in Norway's Arctic region is 1,100 stormy air miles from Oslo. It is even farther from the capital.

# Life in MAGIC VALLEY

I'm a lean dog, a keen dog, a wild dog and lone;

Superstition is supposed to be the fog of lunacy. It is a superstition that has haunted the image of a Pullman car numbered K-18. He couldn't get this vision out of his head and even wrote a book about it. Now, you never heard of it because it was never published. "Too weak," said Tom's publishers. Just think! All this was going on when a pupil of Guarnerius fashioned Max Liedt's violin, and there we sat in an Idaho parlor in 1928, and heard it sing! Truly Bellini accompanied and later played solos. There were flowers, a splendid cake, a supper and a lot of nice people.

Blanche would play. Better luck next time. Lots of fun sooming through valley furniture stores trying to buy a lamp shade. At the colorful Harry Muagrave shop out on Kimberly road we went in to get the shade, came out with a Ming tree. "Now don't forget to get the shade," said the fellow who looks like a Muagrave but isn't. At Burkholder's we met dark-haired Mrs. B. who told us a lot about furniture and their experiences in the early days. A nice-looking and pleasant man of middle years met us at Hoosier's, showed us an elegant sofa and chair of curved blue mahogany. "If you didn't add it to the Ming tree, the sippers on the cushions were so intricate."

Grammar has a rule about "which should be called an outword." "A preposition is a word 'You mustn't end a sentence with'." Writers occasionally split infinitives, so you can hear 'em crack. They also dangle participles until the poor things are blue in the face, and leave prepositions out on the ends of sentences. It's sometimes necessary to depart from the rules to keep a natural flavor to one's writing. One author says, "I was years shreading the awful accuracy of our educated speech and writing. Both apart to life only as they reflect our own time. It's a mistake for 20th century folks to write and talk like those of another century. We need pathfinders to loosen up

the language, and who aren't afraid to adopt some of the gorgeous vernacular of the people. Chaucer, Shakespeare and other great ones have survived because they dared express their own times. We should know our English so well we can violate the rules when necessary."

The foreign office once collected a speech of Churchill's because he left a preposition on at the end of a sentence. Wuntze was furious. "This is a type of pedantry," he said. "Up with which I shall not put!" You won't find split infinitives in the Bible or in Shakespeare, as this form of bad grammar wasn't known until the 18th century. Plenty of examples of it in English literature, though, as well as of dangling participles and misplaced prepositions. Lord Byron even came to be known as "the father of the split infinitive."

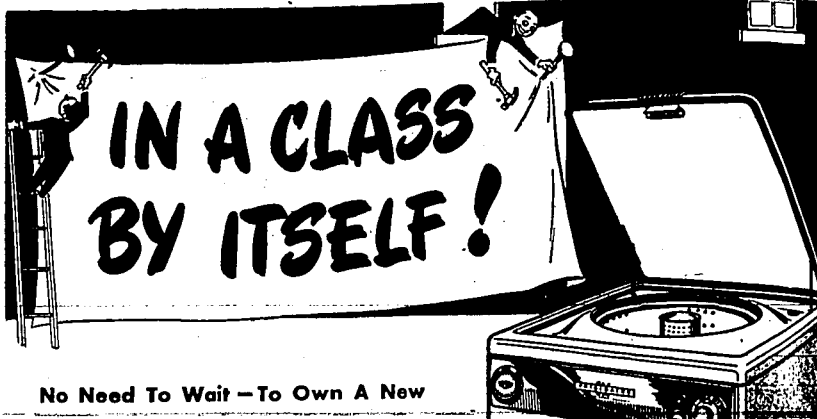
