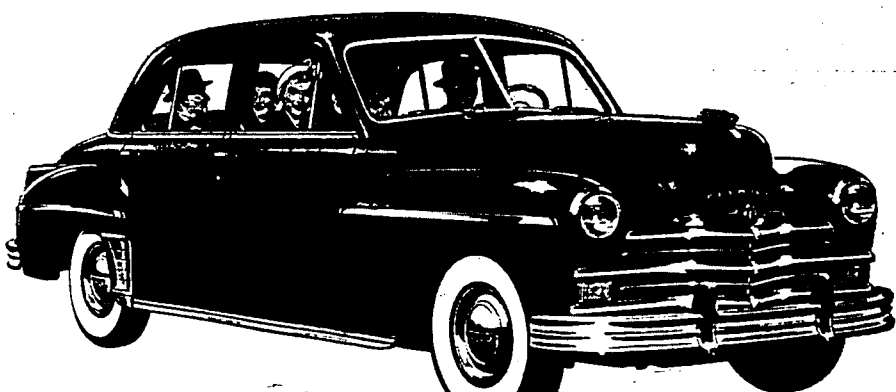

**BLACKFOOT**, March 19—Byrd Trego, retired Blackfoot publisher, has written a one-man fight against stream pollution and misuse of natural resources.

Trego, 80 years old, has been publishing his ideas through newspapers and over 12 radio stations. Whenever he gets the opportunity, he speaks for conservation to promote his views. People in the intermountain area must put an end to abuse of natural resources "before it is too late," Trego insists.

He has been urging communities to build sewage disposal plants to convert sewage into commercial fertilizer and stop stream pollution. He points out that such a program will improve health and reduce the need for doctors, nurses and hospitals.

A major part of his program is planting of new grass, trees and shrubs on foothills and mountains to prevent soil erosion. Trego says such a move would result in the return of natural springs. With the aid of reservoirs, floods could be prevented, he says. He points out the killing of streams destroys fish and other aquatic life.

Trego says the intermountain country will enjoy a long and profitable increase in population and industry if residents of the area will take steps to safeguard natural resources.

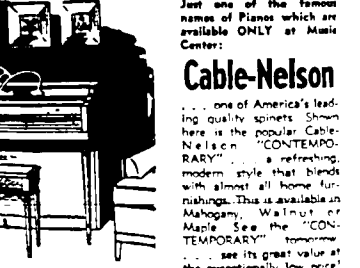

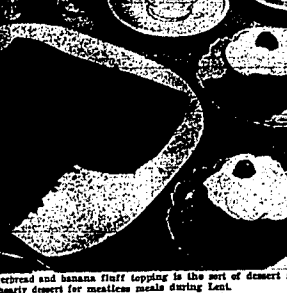

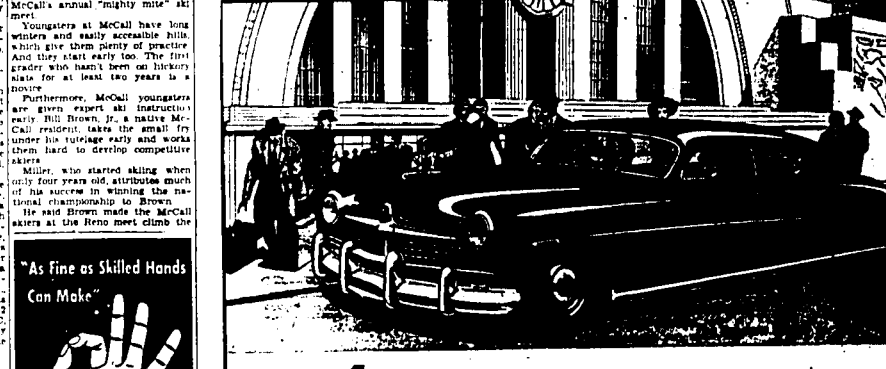

WASHINGTON, March 19 (AP)—President Truman returned today from his 13-day Florida vacation a little heavier but feeling "fine."

He told reporters at the airport that he would send the north Atlantic security treaty to the senate for ratification "as soon as it is ready."

"This was taken to mean the senate would get the pact soon after it is signed here April 4. The President had already approved the text made public yesterday as well as the explanation of it last night by Secretary of State Acheson.

**No Official Connection**

### Solon Asks Army For Nitrogen to Bridge Shortage

WASHINGTON, March 19 (AP)—Rep. Thomas O. Abernethy, D., Miss., today called upon the army to give up nitrogen from its ordnance plants to help ease the fertilizer shortage.

Abernethy, chairman of a house agriculture subcommittee which has just concluded a week of hearings on the fertilizer situation, proposed that the army turn over to U. S. farmers the entire output of its nitrogen plant at Elmer, Tex.

Nitrogen is the raw material for fertilizer. Abernethy said farmers could use about 1,300,000 tons of fertilizer this year, but only about 900,000 tons will be available for regular trade sources.

Army experts told the subcommittee that their nitrogen plants will turn out about 200,000 tons of nitrogen-fertilizer this year, 67,000 tons more than their usual production rate.

**1949 Business Outlook Good, Expert Claims**  
 CHICAGO, March 19.—Unless businessmen or consumers get panic, the nation this year should be only slightly less prosperous and possibly better off than in 1948, the government's top economist today said.

As a result of "the disinflation of 1948," said Chairman Edwin G. Nourse of the President's Council on Economic Advisors, "we may take off some fat, but we shall not die and need not really suffer."

Not Pollyanna Voice  
 He said "it is not the voice of Pollyanna but of business statistics that says underlying conditions are sound and basically favorable."

In an address to the executive club, Chicago, on "the gentle art of disinflation," Nourse summarized the economic outlook as follows:

"1948 should show a sustained volume of consumer spending and hence employment only very slightly below last year, production even higher, and prices adjusted to a better structure and a level some what but not seriously below the peaks of 1948."

Lens of Britain  
 Profits should be "as well as or better maintained over the long pull" when industry is working at 90 to 95 per cent of capacity, Nourse said, as under the "recent strained conditions" when mills and mines were forced to 100 per cent of capacity.

Last year, he suggested, was not a year of "reasonably full employment," but a year of "slight over-employment, in part a cause and in part a result of the inflation."

**Danish Researcher Develops Resistant Variety of Potatoes**  
 UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, March 19.—In the horticultural greenhouses at the University of Idaho are 150 unusual plants. They are crosses of the Russet, Idaho's famous baking potato, and two new lesser known varieties, Menominee and Explaine.

The potato seedlings are there because Einar Larsen, a native of Denmark doing potato research under a special fellowship, wanted to try—"just for the fun of it"—a venture in potato breeding that some scientists said was difficult, if not impossible.

"The seedlings Larsen selected may well be the start of a new variety of the Russet potato resistant to certain diseases now plaguing the industry," comments Dr. J. E. Kraus, head of the department of horticulture.

Larsen came to Idaho about a year ago. He was picked for a University of Idaho agricultural research fellowship through the American-Scandinavian foundation. His main research project at Idaho has involved light greening of potatoes.

Seeded potatoes sometimes turn green under lights in cellars, in storage warehouses and at the terminal markets. Sometimes they turn that tint in the grocery stores. However, don't let the green potatoes and Larsen's work has opened some promising leads as to the cause.

Larsen will return to his native country where he has received his master's degree at the 1949 commencement. The potato seedlings, however, will stay in Idaho.

"This spring they will be transplanted to outdoor plots on the university farm. Tubers produced the first year will go to the Aberdeen branch station for further testing and increase."

During the 1948 harvest Larsen was stationed at the Aberdeen branch station, center of the university's potato research. While there he studied closely mechanical harvesting and handling methods developed by Idaho's big-scale grow-
