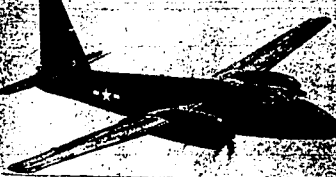

**TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG POT SHOTS**

WASHINGTON—The British foreign office is exerting quiet but strong pressure on the United States to assume the lead in organizing an anti-Bolshevik pact between the near and middle eastern states, even before representatives of western Europe and Scandinavian nations have scrawled their signatures beneath the north Atlantic treaty.

### No. 1 Envoys Meet April 2 On Pact Plan

WASHINGTON, March 23 (AP)—Secretary of State Dean Acheson and foreign ministers of other Atlantic pact nations plan an important meeting here April 2 on pact matters, it was learned today.

Informants said top diplomats of Britain, Canada, France, Belgium, Luxembourg, The Netherlands and Norway intend to be here for the meeting, which will be held on April 4. Foreign ministers of Denmark, Portugal, Italy and Iceland also will be on hand if those nations accept invitation to join the pact as charter members.

Truly Sinking Set

The signing of the historic treaty is scheduled for 3 p. m. EDT April 4 in the interdepartmental auditorium which seats about 1,000 persons. President Truman is tentatively scheduled to be present at the ceremonies.

Officials said the prime purpose of the April 2 meeting will be to reach formal agreement on text of the historic 20-year pact. This approval is assured in advance.

To Debat Plans

In addition, the conferees are slated to consider future action to build the treaty into a forcible pact and to consider any Russian aggression. Soviet reaction to the treaty, interim plans to protect the pact, and other matters will be discussed.

While the final formal meeting of the foreign ministers will focus on development of a common strategic defense plan, officials said that creation of a high-level pact council and a defense committee will come only after the treaty is ratified. This is expected by the end of May.

### Help of Baby Teeth Called Aid to Adults

LOS ANGELES, March 23 (UP)—Baby teeth in adults result from treatment and preservation of the first or "baby" teeth, a specialist in children's dentistry said today.

Because a "baby" tooth is infected or broken is no reason to extract it, specialists at the University of Southern California, said.

Dr. Babrowitch and his associates at USC are pioneers in the new approach. So far, they have saved silver nitrate treatment to save first teeth in more than 1,000 young patients. Only four failures have been reported.

Youngsters need their first teeth until the permanent teeth replace them in normal order, the scientist said. Children then chew their food better and the formation of the mouth is protected.

In their silver nitrate treatment, the USC dental scientists devitalize the nerve of the damaged baby tooth.

The root canal is sterilized and the complete treatment usually requires several visits. Finally, the silver nitrate treatment is placed in the cavity. It penetrates to the end of the canal where the nerve was and tests have shown that the tooth, which receives nourishment from the tissue surrounding the root.

Often times a permanent tooth begins to come through at an early stage. In such cases, the scientist's recommendation that the baby tooth in it way be pulled.

Dr. C. E. Pogue of the national research and development board said the navy subjected some of the defective rockets to X-rays. An "amazing" number of non-detonating rockets were put back into the line—were put back into the line, he said.

The faulty assembly, Pogue said, was traced back to one factory worker who explained that he had forgotten how the grenades had to be put in order to "blow up."

Pogue said the factory worker explained that he put one nose in the front of the rocket and one in the back.

### DDT Called Bad For Milk Supply

WASHINGTON, March 23 (UP)—The government acted today to keep what one official termed a "slow, insidious poison" from seeping into the nation's milk supply.

The agriculture department warned dairy farmers: Don't spray your cows or barns with DDT to kill insects.

It will kill the insects, all right, but it also will accumulate in the milk and then seep into the milk she gives, the department said.

The department quoted toxicologists of the food and drug administration as saying that "even small amounts of DDT in food such as milk... might prove harmful to humans, especially infants and small children."

### U. S. 'Formally' Ends Naval Pact

SHANGHAI, March 23 (UP)—The United States navy formally has "dis-established" its facilities at Tingtao port, now held by Chinese communists, it was disclosed today.

A navy source said a similar order for Shanghai "ships come at any time. We are ready for it."

The U. S. west Pacific fleet under Vice-Adm. Oscar Badger had been stationed at Tingtao but was moved to Shanghai some time ago.

Identify any bone in the human body with certainty except the femur. (The only reason I know this is that a friend of mine broke his, and told me where it was.)

Recognize any flower by name except the rose, or any tree except the elm and the oak.

Read anything, including a dog-house, although I have spent some of the best years of my life in these structures.

Tell the music of any composer except Stephen Foster.

Play a musical instrument or speak a foreign language.

Tell a mushroom from a toadstool or spinach from kale.

Light a cigarette without coughing, or give artificial respiration to a drowning person.

Blow bubble gum—although I've tried—or mix any drink except a

highball or an aspirin parrot.

Cook anything except a hard-boiled egg.

The group, headed by H. B. Marshall, local businessman, announced the first of 100 new units in the housing project would be started Monday.

"We would have the first units completed within six weeks," Marshall said after a meeting of industrialists in the Pocatello area had been received, and that some of the industries would undoubtedly lead to

the building of new industries in the area.

The Industrial Housing, Inc., group has been planning for over a year to meet just such a situation.

Marshall said "we knew that in order to get industry into Pocatello we would have to supply housing. That has been one of the great drawbacks to western industrial development. There just weren't enough facilities in some new industrial areas to bring in some new industry of any size. We foresaw that possibility, and we have taken adequate action."

### Aptitude Tests Are Available At Office Here

Vocational aptitude tests for high school seniors can be administered by three qualified men at the Twin Falls office of the state employment service, school superintendents have been asked to inform students who plan to seek jobs this spring.

Ervin A. Kelly, Pocatello, employment counselor for 11 southern Idaho offices of the ISES, spent Wednesday and Thursday at the Twin Falls office conferring with the testing program and checking files of handicapped veterans.

Giving aptitude tests in high schools under direction of the employment service is a new idea, Kelly said, but has been tried and found successful in Maryland. There are two written and two dexterity tests.

Kelly warned that the tests are not perfect and must be considered factors and disabilities, but serve as guidance tools. There are 20 occupational aptitude patterns with groups of jobs in each pattern. It is left to the interpreters to select the potential job best suited to the person tested.

The men in the Twin Falls office qualified to administer the tests are Hugh Nelson, Bill Hulet and A. J. Meeks, managers.

The program for placing handicapped persons, especially veterans, is going well, Kelly noted. He is checking files of handicapped veterans for completeness and accuracy. Employers are asked to employ handicapped veterans first, Kelly pointed out. He said they have been satisfied with the people they hire.

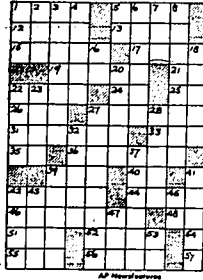
