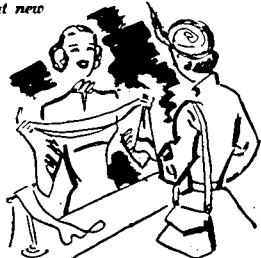

### West Nations Eye Action of Yugoslavians

**By SIDNEY ARNE**  
**AP Foreign Affairs Analyst**

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP)—Yugoslavia's capital, Belgrade, is now the focal point of one of the more serious and delicate situations in Europe. It is now being watched by the nations of the West.

The price paid for it is nothing less than a nation. Will Yugoslavia stay on the Kremlin leash, or will she join the western world?

Diplomats here point out that Yugoslavia's attitude toward the United States is crucial. It finally breaks with Moscow and allies the nation with the west, the situation will certainly raise doubts in other middle European capitals—Bucharest, Prague and Warsaw, among them.

**Fall Into Red Orbit**  
Yugoslavia came out of World War II with Moscow-trained Tito at its head. It became a party to the security and trade treaties through which Moscow set to bind middle Europe to Moscow plans.

Then last summer, to the surprise of the western world, he was presenting a "nationalist" policy. Tito has countered in several speeches since then. They add up to a Yugoslavian fear that the nation would be forced, under Moscow planning to act as merely a source of raw material to the rest of the Soviet bloc.

**Wants Own Factories**  
And Yugoslavians, like so many other nations today, want to do more than rely on raw cotton and wheat for some other nation's factories. It wants some of its own factories. Yugoslavia is not at all a small steel industry.

Moscow promised Yugoslavians some machinery, but there is no certain way for Washington trade experts to know whether Russia ever did.

Tito's worries about his nation staying a raw material supplier, however, would seem to indicate that Moscow might to deliver the machinery she promised.

**Key to Half-World**  
Since last mid-summer Tito and his nation have lived in a half-world.

But Tito has kept his power in the seven months since he was ousted as head of the Moscow-created coalition. He still controls both the army and the secret police, and he has just received a vote of confidence from the Yugoslav Communist party.

In both London and Washington there are signs that Tito is being watched for some point at which both governments will decide to back him by letting him buy the machinery he needs to re-arm his country, and hence to strengthen himself.

### Jackson Hole Ban Is Missing in Bill

WASHINGTON, March 28 (AP)—Something new was left out of the interior department bill.

It failed to contain a provision which would forbid the use of any national park service funds for administration of the much-touted Jackson hole national monument in western Wyoming.

House Appropriations committee gave no hint in its report as to why it was missing. It is possible that the restriction was written into the bill on the floor of the house, when it grew to its final form that served for the first time can spend some money on Jackson hole.

### Hunts for Rattlers Open in Oklahoma

WATNOKA, Okla., March 28 (AP)—Oklahoma's snake hunting season of 1949 is off to a rattling good start.

Sunday's annual hunt near here brought out 700 hunters one from as far away as California—and produced a snake bag of 300 squirming rattlers.

The Watnoka hunt is held each year by the Watnoka Rattle Club. It is a warranty for the rattler, which draws thousands of hunters from practically all the states.

The Okla. hunt is first Sunday.

The price money here was taken by one of the Okla. professionals Alvin Lamer, who caught the longest rattler—37 inches. Several have tried to rob Ward Austin, who took a \$224 first snake.

### Clouds of Steam Not Evidence of Volcanic Activity

HELENA, Mont., March 28 (AP)—A survey party, headed by a federal geologist, has found no evidence of any volcanic activity on Red Mountain, and offered a simple explanation for the clouds of steam.

The Clouds emanate, Great Falls, Mont., U. S. geological survey geologist, who led a party of seven to the base of the mountain's 5,500-foot peak, said.

"We found no condition that would cause any volcanic activity," he said.

The bureau said the work will protect the watershed of both Crane creek and Padlock reservoirs which irrigate about 10,000 acres of land near Weiser.

The pellets were selected from 100 experimental types in an attempt to develop one for range use. The seed is coated with special minerals and chemicals.

Martin said this is the first large scale test to be made with this type of seed.

### Lead Price Down Again to 17 Cents

NEW YORK, March 28 (AP)—American Smelting and Refining company today had reduced the price of lead one cent a pound to 17 cents a pound.

This was the third price reduction for lead this month. The postwar price decline of 31 cents established last November, had prevailed until March 8, when the price was reduced to 18 cents. A further cut to 18 cents followed on March 15 when buying interest failed to revive.

Since that date, sale of lead had been slow as consumers continued to lighten inventories and keep purchases to a minimum awaiting settlement of the market.

The light OPA price of lead was 17 1/2 cents a pound, in November of 1948.

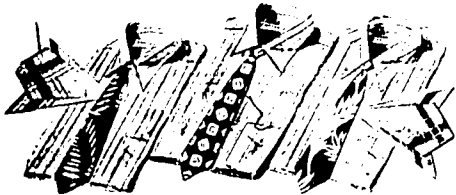

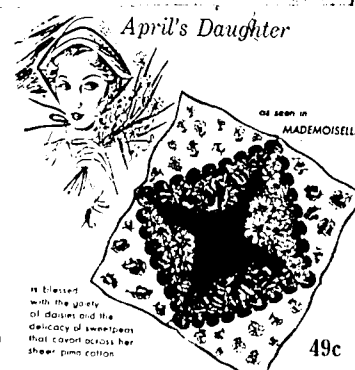

### Expert Tells Of 'Growing' Snow in Test

PORT COLLINS, Colo., March 28 (AP)—Now that the government has decided it is impractical to "melt" snow from the clouds by sprinkling them with dry ice, it is trying to "grow" snow on the ground.

Experiments thus far have been so promising that they are being held on a larger scale at Fort Collins, director of the Rocky Mountain forest and range experiment station, reported today.

Deeper snow is produced by scientific snow-making. That gives additional water needed for irrigation and power by the thirsty west.

Forest Service tests that it is 20 per cent more moisture can be gained by cutting forests properly, McGinnis said.

It has been found that timber cutting decreases the interception of snow and rain by the tree canopy and thus increases the precipitation reaching the ground, his report said.

In one plot of lodgepole pine trees were cut to an average spacing of eight and one-half feet. Over a three-year period this produced an average of 1.23 inches more snow, a gain in water storage of 2.5 per cent.

Low Oaks

In a second test, forests were thinned until only one stand along in a cleared circle 71 feet apart. This gave an increase in water storage of 1.64 per cent gain in water storage.

Spruce-fir stands produced these results. All available timber on most strips 60 feet wide, with alternate strips left uncut, 22.4 per cent more snow, suitable timber cut on areas 96 feet in diameter, 28.7 per cent more snow, slash trees selected for thinning, 34 per cent more snow.
