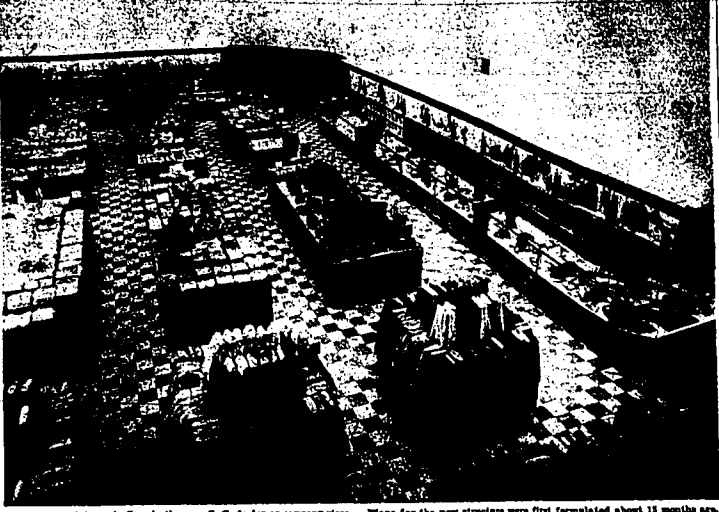

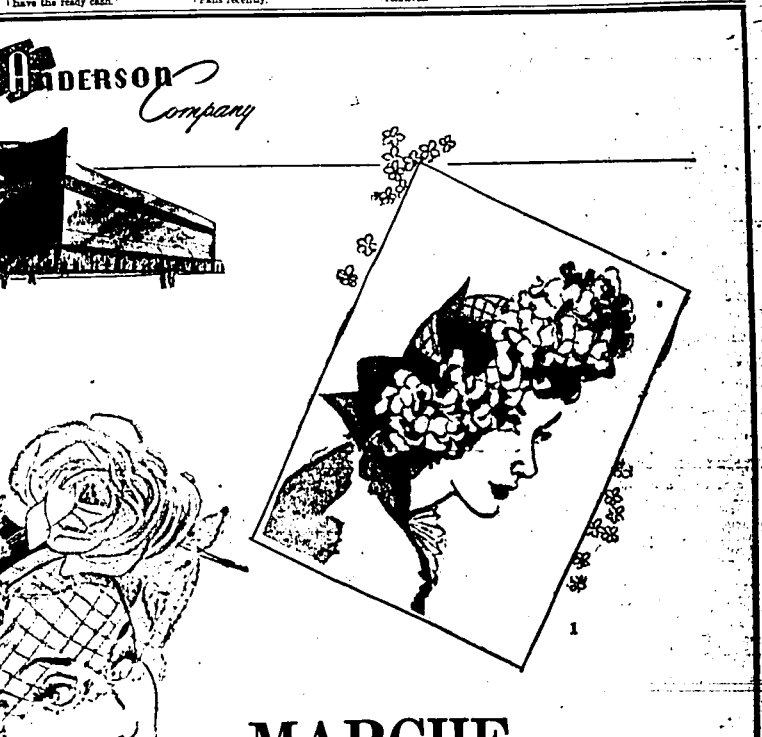
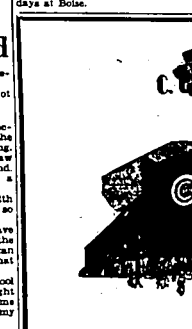

Another Pact Gets Okay of Arabs, Israel

REHOBOTH, March 29—Israeli and Trans-Jordan delegates accepted armistice terms today and returned to their capitals for final approval of the draft.

United Nations officials immediately set for Damascus to work on armistice negotiations with Arab negotiators in Syria.

The Trans-Jordan agreement will be signed Friday, extending the truce to the West Bank. Egyptian troops in the West Bank were ordered to leave and an accord for Palestinian self-defense was signed.

A settlement is yet to be concluded between Israel and Iraq, Yemen and Saudi Arabia, of the Arab League.

The agreement on terms between Israel and Trans-Jordan came after several meetings of Dr. Bevan, British High Commissioner for the Middle East, and Gen. Atchut in Jerusalem.

Mr. Bevan and Gen. Atchut, who were here from Monday, agreed Monday there were no serious differences between the two sides.

Mr. Bevan stated that the agreement was a draft agreement. This was written yesterday morning.

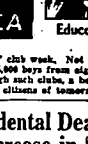
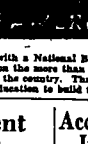
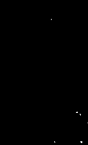
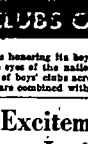
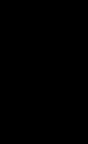
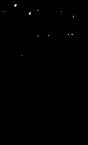
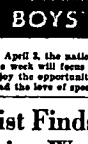
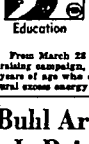
Outstanding Questions

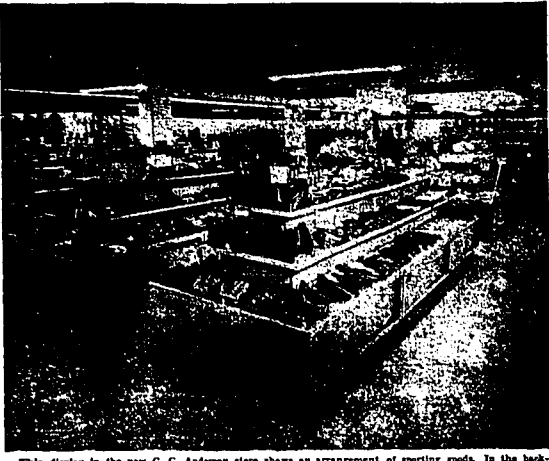

Arms Priority Plea Is Given By De Gaulle

PARIS, March 30 (AP)—Gen. Charles de Gaulle wants the United States to arm France at once as the principal defender of western Europe under the north Atlantic pact.

Allied strategy designates the Rhine as the first line of the expected attack from the east, he told a news conference yesterday, but the line will be manned primarily by Frenchmen, at least at the beginning if there is a fight.

It would be "a grave mistake" to designate Britain as west Europe's chief defender, the general asserted.

For one thing, he said, another conquest of France and bombardment and retreat to liberate her, would destroy the country both morally and physically.

He demanded that the United States promptly make definite strategic commitments in the event of attack on west Europe, and stick to a schedule of arm shipments to the French.

Cyprien Kossuth, French ambassador to London, said without further explanation, De Gaulle halted the north Atlantic treaty as a step toward a federation of Europe which might seek cooperation with Russia in unification of the continent, even if that might mean a change in the Russian regime.

He did not explain how he thought such a change might come about.

New 'Cosmic Ray' Machine Aids Science

ROCHESTER, N. Y., March 30 (AP)—Starting next Monday for mankind is promised in the dedication of the giant new cosmic ray cyclotron of the University of Rochester.

"The plain truth," he said, "is that so soon can predict the practical results. If you are expecting the cyclotron to yield the design for a new and more powerful atomic bomb you are almost sure to be disappointed."

Other possibilities, but unable to predict, he said, are new nuclear power plants (atomic power plants), a city in space, or a trip to the moon. He added:

"What this cyclotron will certainly do is just one thing—it will yield to the skilled physicists who work with it, new knowledge about the behavior, the structure and the characteristics of nuclei. And sooner or later this new knowledge will have striking, important and valuable uses to men."

The cyclotron is the world's second largest. The bigger one is at the University of California. This Rochester machine is more than a thousand tons of steel, and cost a million and a half dollars, mostly supplied by the office of naval research. The United States atomic research program helped.

The giant is a hollow box of steel with both sides cut away so that you can look right through it. The top, ends and bottom are four feet thick. They are part of an enormous electro-magnet. The poles of the magnet are inside this structure, curved like a flat pill box.

Inside the box there are two electrodes, leaving hydrogen nuclei, called protons.

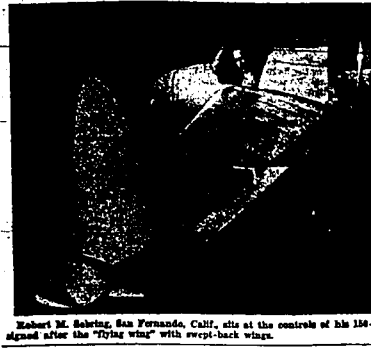

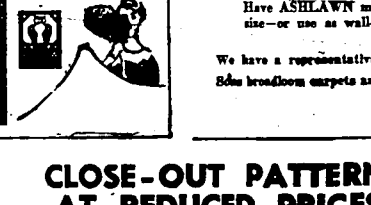

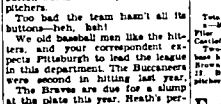

PHILADELPHIA, March 20 (AP)—A national citizens committee supporting "far-reaching auditing reforms in the federal government" has been formed under the direction of Dr. Robert L. Johnson, president of Temple University.

Dr. Johnson said the new organization which will work for the principles set forth in the Hoover commission's report is organized to be a non-partisan assembly.

700 Citizens Enlisted

More than 700 prominent citizens from all parts of the United States have been enlisted by the committee, Dr. Johnson reported.

Active in the committee will be some 300 members of the research units which prepared data for former President Herbert Hoover's study of the federal executive department.

"Our government has grown both in size and cost to a baffling extent," Dr. Johnson said, "and the modern need for large scale government, we want our citizens to understand and rally upon to preserve our freedom and our resources, both human and material.

"Time for Change"

"We believe the time has come when far-reaching enduring reforms in the federal government can be put into effect. The citizens committee will work to give President Truman and the Congress the comprehensive and informed public in modernizing the government."

Hoover is known to be supporting the Johnson Committee.

Forester Urging 'Speeded Access' To Timber Lands

PORTLAND, March 20 (AP)—Speeded and expanded construction of access roads to timber on national forests has been urged in a report by North Pacific Regional Forester H. J. Andrews.

Such a program would place additional over-mature timber on the market and bring up to sustained yield capacity the cut of a number of operators, he said.

It accompanied the forest service's annual report for 1945.

Present production on national forests can be maintained indefinitely, barring some unforeseen catastrophe, the report added.

The region, according to the report, contributed \$2,999,836 to the U. S. treasury and that operating expenses totaled \$3,899,486. More than half this last figure went for fire prevention and suppression and the maintenance of about 10,000 miles of roads and 23,000 miles of trails.

The chart gave the estimated cost for 1950 as \$44,324,000, and a peak figure of \$1,109,134,000 in 1963.
