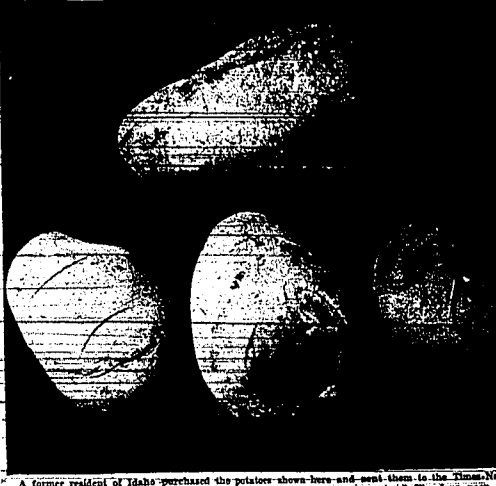

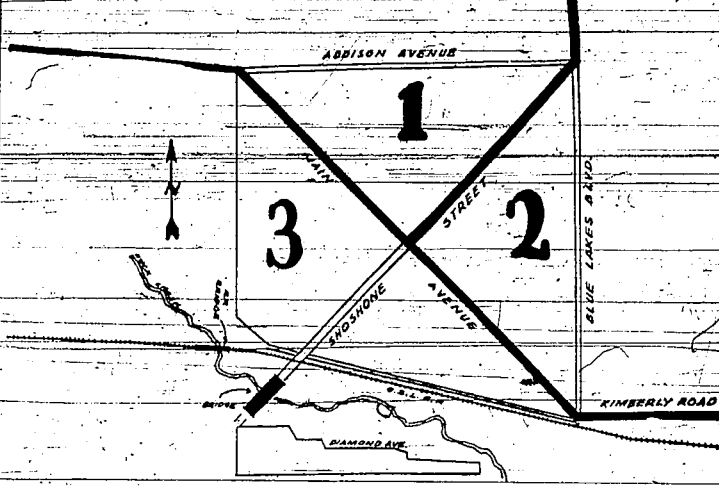

### River Water Analyzed for 'Salt' Content

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, April 2.—Water from the Snake River has the lowest mineral salt content of any water used for irrigation in Idaho, reports Max G. Jensen, irrigatorist, and Glenn C. Lewis, analyst in the department of agricultural chemistry at the University of Idaho agricultural experiment station.

Water samples were pumped, strained to purify, with water from the Snake River—collected for Lake Coeur d'Alene and used on Rathdrum prairie, coming third.

Water from the Bear river and Portneuf river in eastern Idaho had the highest mineral salt content. The range was from about 80 parts per million for the Golo—a mineral salt content not far from rainwater—to more than 300 parts for the Bear and Portneuf.

Idaho's biggest source of irrigation water, the Snake river, showed a fairly low mineral salt content at the headwaters, but this content steadily increased downstream as drainage water returned to the stream.

In cooperation with the leading irrigation companies of the state, the university's agricultural experiment station has been studying the mineral salt content of the rivers supporting Idaho's 2,500,000 irrigated acres.

## No Work for Months, but Many Apply for Jobs on Atom Plant



Employment office throughout southern Idaho are receiving a large number of applications for more permanent jobs in the proposed atomic energy plant near Arco, according to A. J. Meeks, manager of the Twin Falls office of the Idaho state employment service.

There is not a high-speed, rush job. Meeks said. The AEC estimates the peak construction employment of 6,000 probably will not be reached before 1953.

Employment this year will not exceed 100 since all that will be done will be starting test wells to determine water supply. Meeks pointed out.

—Employment in the next two years, 1950 and 1951, probably will not exceed 2,000, he added.

No one should go to eastern Idaho this year expecting to find employment on the project, he said. Other construction in the area will be to use some skilled construction workers this year. But the only other sure employment available in the area is seasonal farm work, primarily in cultivation and harvest of sugar beets and potatoes.

Communities near the plant site, Arco, Blackfoot, Idaho Falls and Pocatello, are anxious to avoid the usual boom and bust experience which often goes with large construction jobs. Meeks said. Plans of the atomic energy commission will permit an orderly development of the whole project and surrounding communities.

## Army Day This Year to Find National Guard Ready for Action in 24 Hours

By JOEL SHULMAN

Army day, proclaimed nationally for Wednesday, will find the 18th Infantry Regiment, Idaho national guard, ready to take the field in 24-hour notice. The guard is no longer a drilling outfit but a modern, well-equipped combat component of the regular armed forces.

At their weekly meetings on Tuesday nights, guardsmen don't drill any more. That doesn't mean they don't emphasize use of the rifle, machine gun, and other weapons. They drill, along with specialized training, in laboring to recruit.

The 18th Infantry, with artillery, tank and air sections, is composed of members of the air and tank arms, assisted in the recent winter weather emergency.

Radio use, communications systems, automobile mechanics and other special training are the main functions of the "new guard."

The new army dress uniform, announced in California, Arizona and New Mexico.

More than \$200,000 worth of equipment was issued by the army to the 18th Infantry regiment. Headquarters of the regiment are in Twin Falls. Aircraft components are located at Boise and Coeur d'Alene.

Units in Idaho vary in size. Twin Falls has 29 officers and 85 enlisted men. Jerome has 26 officers and men. Buhl, 59 officers and men; Burley, 51 in all—Gowling, 87—and Rupert, 29. The service company is located at Jerome.

This regiment is the only national guard combat team in the west. There is also one east of the Mississippi river. It is a complete unit and can fight as a combat team with the equipment it has now.

Initiators are regular army men. Special recruits are sometimes sent to regular army schools for training. They are then attached to the guard as guard members, drawing pay and rations in accordance with their rank. Most of them become staff, technical or master sergeant.

Veterans comprise a large portion of the Twin Falls unit. They serve as instructors much of the time, but many of them are learning specialties.

The theme, "every man a specialist," is carried into the national guard from the army. The manual of arms is taught but use of training in arms and equipment comes at the annual summer camp. Twin Falls units go to Fort Lewis, Wash. They spend two weeks in maneuvers. "Combat problems, field discipline and tactical training are stressed."

Summer field training will start June 4 and end June 18 of this year. During training time, men and officers will receive full pay and allowances. About 1,800 guardsmen are expected to attend from Idaho.

A "rule" of the 18th is that a party will not be given every summer in

which 12 or more new recruits are assigned. There have been parties for the past several months. Money for the parties comes out of company funds. Company funds are the contributions of enlisted men and officers for their own activities.

Meetings are held at the labor camp one mile south of Twin Falls every Tuesday evening. The auditorium in the building. Available for immediate use are a dozen radio sets, several racks of carbines and rifles, a demonstration 50 caliber machine gun, "mossie" canisters, and other field equipment.

Trucks, jeeps, weasels and other motorized equipment is used by the unit. Some of the jeeps travel more than 1,000 miles a month.

More members could be trained for national emergencies if the proper facilities were available. Regular officers believe. They would like to have an armory where equipment could be stored and permanent officers could be established. Six truckloads of equipment belonging to the unit are stored in Boise because of lack of space here.

In a national emergency the national guard would be made part of the regular army. This would occur before any draft or general mobilization program would get these away.

# Fight Slated As Hoppers Give Threats

By ROBERT E. GEIGER  
WASHINGTON, April 2 (AP)—The agriculture department says one of the greatest grasshopper outbreaks in recent years is threatened in the western and midwestern states this summer.

But already the department's "hank" force is setting out traps for two new species—and an old one—transport planes are smaller planes and some old-fashioned traps are being used to kill the voracious insects in their nursery grounds.

The task force is a group of bug experts of the department's bureau of entomology and plant quarantines, headed by W. E. Brittain, chief of insects control. It will attempt to control the hoppers in Montana, Colorado and Wyoming before heavy damage occurs.

**At 100 Pasture**  
Last year 50,000 cattle had to be moved from 100 pastures to grasshopper areas of all the pasture areas.

The task force is a group of bug experts of the department's bureau of entomology and plant quarantines, headed by W. E. Brittain, chief of insects control. It will attempt to control the hoppers in Montana, Colorado and Wyoming before heavy damage occurs.

**First Mass Attack**  
That this is the first time that a mass-scale attack has been made on a grasshopper breeding ground is the opinion of the department's entomologists.

The grasshopper is a pest which has been known to damage crops of alfalfa and clover and to eat the leaves of plants, mixed with grain.

The task force is a group of bug experts of the department's bureau of entomology and plant quarantines, headed by W. E. Brittain, chief of insects control. It will attempt to control the hoppers in Montana, Colorado and Wyoming before heavy damage occurs.

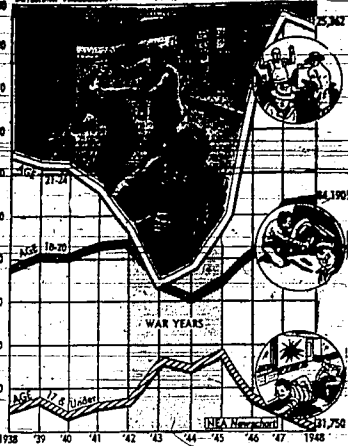
