"The answer of the financial considerations involved," Post said, "is that we have developed to a great deal of money. The question is whether we have developed to the stage in sections, Idaho where we can no longer afford not to think of such treatment."

"For example," Post said, "that half of the rural water supplies become so polluted that farmers refuse to use them. What would happen to this rich garden spot we call Magic Valley?"

"Suppose an incidence of enteric diseases increased in the area where many people are ill—either because of contaminated water, or they are getting poor health. The cost in money and misery could become prohibitive."

"In more recent years, many rural residents are drinking water from wells in their backyards. This is cheaper than sewer wells and much safer."

"Some farm organizations are showing interest in water pollution," Post said. "It is perhaps the best solution to the problem. Legislation would be ineffective unless people believed it necessary and demanded it."

Report will be forthcoming from the stream pollution committee, but it is doubtful that many changes will result unless the general public studies the situation and makes known the wishes, he said.

WASHINGTON, April 8 (AP)—The growing frozen orange juice industry probably will have a stabilizing influence on orange prices, the agriculture department disclosed today.

Dr. O. E. Hilbert, chief of the department's industrial chemistry bureau, said the frozen orange juice business has mushroomed into a major industry in Florida and is expanding in California.

Florida Got Jump
It is estimated that 900,000 gallons of Florida orange juice will be converted into frozen concentrate in Florida this year, he said. In California about 600,000 gallons will be converted, he said.

The frozen concentrate industry will help use up the huge surplus of oranges that causes a price slump at the height of the season, he said.

Spreads Distribution
It will tend to spread the distribution of oranges over the full year instead of two or three months of each year, he said. The house appropriations committee in testimony on the department's annual appropriation bill.

The Rev. Mr. White spoke briefly of the child who, in 1938, was so seriously ill he was not expected to live long enough to celebrate Christmas.

It was this fateful forecast which led to the early Christmas for Nubbins and attracted the sympathy of the nation in radio broadcasts.

Gifts poured in from all over the country.

But Nubbins' pluck and the efforts of medical specialists extended the boy's life almost another four years—years that were filled with one operation after another until his little fellow said he hated hospitals.

Recently the child was given his chance to go home or to the hospital.

The last choice home, and only a few days later, his battle was over.

After the services today, Nubbins' body was taken to Denver for cremation. Interment will be at Cheyenne.

Contest judges explained that each entrant's treatment of conservation principles "may be based on information from articles, bulletins, motion pictures, interviews of personal experience, but practical application of the subject is the main thing in the community-state consideration in the judging committee's hands."
