Total unofficial results of the election gave Schwendman 2,770 votes to 1,470 for H. G. Lauerbach, incumbent, who sought reelection on a platform advocating the operation of slot machines. "I accept the will of the majority," Lauerbach said. "This has not been a campaign of personalities but of principles. I believe Schwendman has been a good, clean opponent. I would consider it a privilege to help him in any way I can."

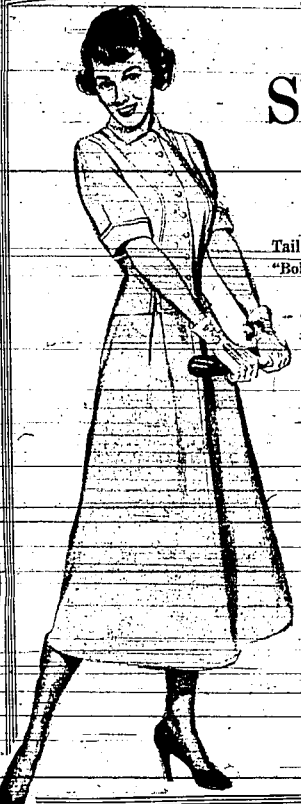

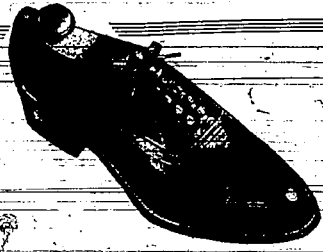

**NEW YORK, April 8 (AP)—**The first trial joust with the communists was held in federal court today in New York City. The judge granted wide leeway to the communists in their defense.

The accused are 11 men who represented the entire population of the Communist party in the United States. Only William Z. Foster, indicted but granted a verdict of insanity, is missing.

Technically the charge against the 11 defendants, all members of the national committee of the Communist party is that they conspired to teach and advocate the violent overthrow of the government. They were indicted under the so-called Smith act which provides a maximum penalty of 10 years in prison and a \$10,000 fine on conviction.

But with his very first witness the government has shown how broad will be the scope of its prosecution. And the aim and intent of the defendants is often remarked on by Judge Harold R. Medina.

This trial could all but end communism as any sort of a power in the United States, perhaps for all time.

### U. S. Ponders End to Famed Island Prison

**WASHINGTON, April 8 (AP)—**Federal Education Director W. Bennett says abandonment of "the rock," famous Alcatraz prison in San Francisco Bay, is being considered.

It's costing too much to keep the prisoners there. Due to the necessity of hauling water and other supplies from the mainland, Bennett said, it costs \$4 per prisoner per day at Alcatraz.

There are 228 prisoners at Alcatraz.

Bennett's statements were made while testifying before the house appropriations committee on money needs for fiscal 1960 for the state justice and correction departments and the federal judicial system.

**Crisis Deferred Cited**

The most important consideration, he said, is "to what extent the 'building up' and the fact that Alcatraz has been closed off for the years is an effective deterrent to crime."

Underworld characters, he said, know that strict discipline in Alcatraz and the fact that they have been unsuccessful escapes make the prison "the end of the world."

But, he said, it is not possible to operate vocational courses and industries at other prisons if these prisoners were divided among them.

**Predicts Problems**

It would mean constant watchfulness for serious disciplinary problems, he said.

Bennett also said that if another maximum security institution, such as the Federal Reformatory for Women at Alderson, Md., where the cost would be about \$7,000,000.

Although facilities have been put out to the navy and other agencies, he said, there appears to be no interest on the part of any of them in taking over the island.

U-N. Failure Caused Pact, Analyst Says

By DeWitt MacKenzie AP Feature Staff Analyst Monday the foreign ministers of 12 western nations met in Washington and signed the Atlantic Pact, the most powerful defensive alliance since the League of Nations.

Yesterday the United Nations reassembled in New York with intense emotion as the Atlantic Pact is the direct outgrowth of U. N. inability to fulfill the mission for which it was created.

This is no reproach on the United Nations. It is the result of conditions over which the U. N. has no control, that is, the division of a great portion of the globe into hostile ideological groups which are inalterably opposed to each other.

Because the security council of the United Nations has been paralyzed by the division, the western powers have felt impelled to take over the job themselves.

The pact has been signed and will become effective when the legislatures have voted their approval of the pact which their governments have taken.

However, while the western powers have ideological groups in the United Nations, there is no reason for the peace organization to think that there is any danger of weakening by the move. On the contrary, the alliance is calculated to strengthen the hand of the U. N.

for in its own big zone of influence, the Atlantic alliance can act on behalf of peace-loving nations against aggression.
