

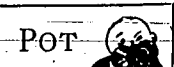

THE HIGHWAY INVESTIGATION

Now that Governor Robins has appointed the four members of the Idaho highway study committee which was authorized by the recent session of the state legislature, it is interesting to suggest that the people watch developments in this connection very closely.

It should be understood, of course, that the committee appointed—Sena. Clyde Blair, R., Lemhi, and L. Colby Lowry, D., Benewah, and Ernest Blaser, D., Madison, and Elvon Hampton, R., Latah—has only one purpose. That is to negotiate with and employ an agency to make a complete study of Idaho highways, bridges, administration of the highway department, and existing laws concerning roads.

The agency so selected must be one from outside the state. An appropriation for \$50,000 was authorized to defray costs of the survey.

The Times-News, along with a lot of others, questioned the legislature's sincerity at the time it decided on this interim investigation of our state highway department. It had all the appearances of an expedient political maneuver to offset demands for a non-partisan state highway commission.

As a rule, nothing comes of these interim investigations, although they do serve the purpose of taking the heat off the legislature during a hot session. And most of the money spent for such surveys is like pouring it down a rathole.

That's why the people of Idaho should watch very closely just what results from the appointment of the committee which will direct the investigating agency.

Will this investigation actually amount to anything? And if so, how far will the legislature go in carrying out the investigators' recommendations?

PRESUMPTUOUS MR. TAYLOR

Lillenthal's statement doesn't quite coincide with that frantic, almost out-of-breath announcement which Sen. Glen Taylor made to the effect that the atomic reactor plant makes the proposed Columbia valley authority an unnecessary agency.

BOISE, April 8 (AP)—Engineers from electric companies of the northwest end a three-day technical conference today with a tour of Idaho Power company installations and construction projects.

More than 200 utility technicians are attending the meetings of the engineering and operations sections of the Northwest Power and Light Association.

In yesterday's session the group heard L. B. Cowgill, Portland, northwest power pool coordinator, say that the electric companies of Idaho, Utah and Montana, not only have enough power for themselves but have enough surplus to cover shortages of companies in Washington and western Oregon.

Electric companies of Idaho, Utah and Montana are self sufficient and intend to stay that way, said in referring to available power supplies.

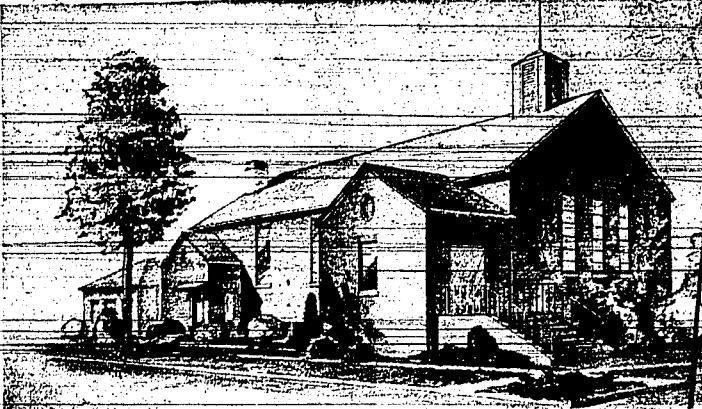

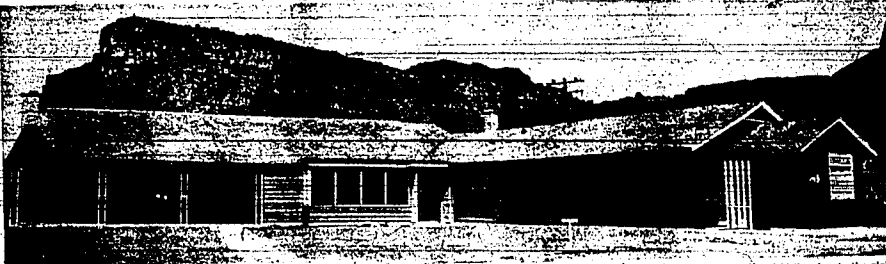

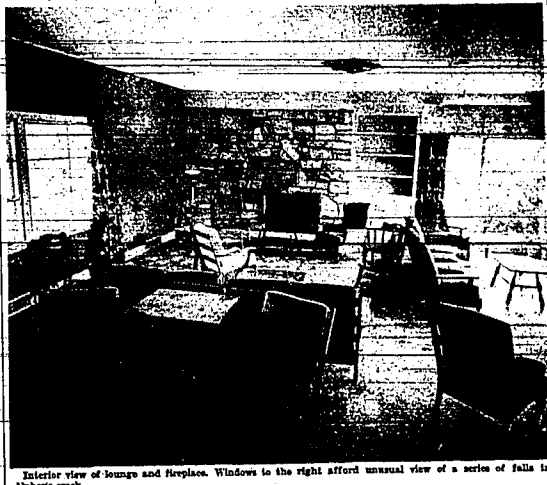

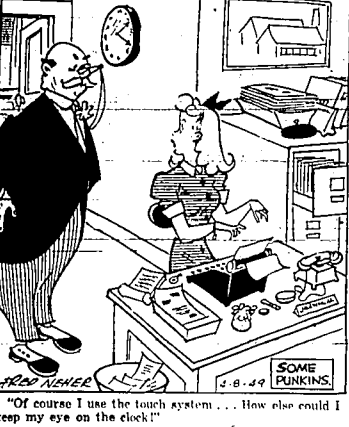

New Type of Hardwood Is Imperishable

PORTLAND, Ore., April 6 (AP)—A super-hardwood—you can't drive a nail through it—is being produced from the nation's softwood.

A piece of softwood lumber put into a heat press comes out so hard a wood saw won't cut it and so heavy it won't float.

The Western Pine Association reported the development today. It said during the years of experimentation in its research laboratories following extensive work by the government's forest products laboratory at Madison, Wis., had been completed.

Oliver Member Mills
The association turned the process over to its member mills throughout the 11 western states. A spokesman said several of the mills were planning to put the new heat-and-squeeze side of the lumber business soon.

The association reported the new product—called *Staypak*—can be manufactured easily. Pressure of 1,500 pounds per square inch is applied to a board at a temperature of 225 degrees. The natural resin in the wood flows, hardens, and seals the cementing agent for the compressed board. The board is only one-third of its original thickness, grained like the original.

Use Reported
The Western Pine Association reported that its uses would likely revolve around flooring, paneling, bar and table tops, tool and handle cases, bearings, furniture and similar things where hardness and resistance to moisture are desirable.

The new hardwood is both cigarette proof, and alcohol proof. It will burn but it does not kindle readily.

Although it can be made from nearly any softwood of low resin content, experiments with white fir have been particularly successful.

And white fir is being referred to as "a weed" because it is of limited value compared with other woods. There are some 60,000 acres of white fir in the western forests. With a new use for it, the lumber industry sees a further advance in its campaign to sand forest waste.

Big Blaze Strikes Lumber Company

COOLVILLE, Wash., April 8 (AP)—Fire struck the Cell Chouti Lumber company here, destroying the mill and a large stack of lumber.

A crew of 25 volunteer firemen fought the blaze and kept it from spreading to a nearby planing mill and two new drying kilns. Although no accurate estimate of damage was available, one source said the loss would run from \$75,000 to \$100,000.

Saved lumber totaling more than 20,000 boards fell unused in the fire. George Daly, a foreman, said the loss was covered by insurance.

The fire was believed to have started near a diesel engine. Larry Hoffman, an employee who was working above the engine room, discovered the flames. He was unable to control the blaze, he said, before it spread to oil tanks which exploded.

The company is owned by a mid-western firm.

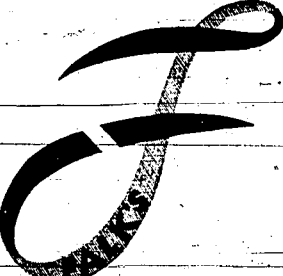
