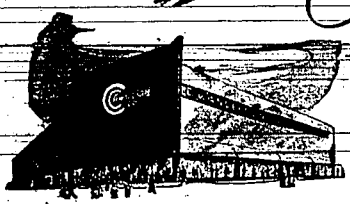

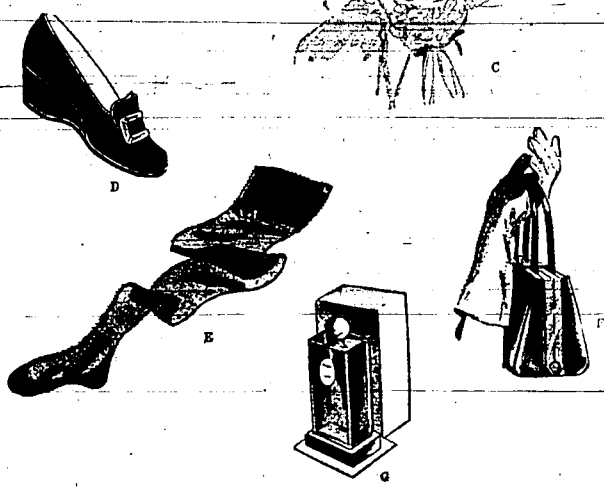

Joe Marshall, 75, Is Still Leading Authority On Idaho Spuds



Joe Marshall, at 75, Is Still Idaho Potato King

 Joe Marshall, Idaho's potato king, celebrated his 75th birthday anniversary at a party given in the hotel at the Park hotel by people from the Clover area, where he has been raising his famous potatoes since 1928.

About eight years ago Marshall began taking care of all potatoes raised on the Clover tract and as a token of appreciation for the vast improvement in crops, the people who live on his property planned the birthday party for him.

Attending were Mr. and Mrs. Mill Lierman, Ed Lierman, Mr. and Mrs. Emil Pedaghiel, Ray Smith, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Lutz, Mr. and Mrs. Willard J. Smith, Mr. and Mrs. Eric Wagner, Mr. and Mrs. R. W. Bhattner and Mrs. Stella Archibald.

Ed Lierman was master of ceremonies at the dinner at which many stories were told about the famous potato career of Marshall.

The Idaho potato king first became interested in perfecting potato crops because he was "always looking for some way to get better food for human beings."

Marshall returned recently from the 45th annual United Fresh-Fruit and Vegetable convention in Chicago where he had a display of Idaho potatoes. The mayor of Chicago heard about his unusual display and went to see it. Later Marshall sent the mayor and also Harold E. Stassen some potatoes and received letters of acknowledgment from both, which he keeps in his wallet and proudly shows to his friends.

In 28 years he has raised only one convention and that was because of an eye operation which kept him in bed.

"Conventions are great things to advertise the country," he says.

Twenty-seven years ago Marshall received his title of "Idaho potato king." In 1946 the title became official when he was crowned at the Chicago convention.

Originally from Ohio, Marshall left his home in 1892 and went to Montana. He came to Twin Falls in 1905.

In 1908 he began growing potatoes and tried to find a method to get better seed as well as experimenting with different methods of cultivation.

"I didn't make much headway at first," he said.

During the winter of 1921, he was hired through the federal reserve and state department to take charge of banks including the Twin Falls Bank and Trust, and banks at Pocatello, Hollister and Rogerson.

"That same year," Marshall said, "there were 3,000 acres of undug potatoes in the Twin Falls tract. They were so badly diseased that they brought 25 cents less on the market than Michigan and Wisconsin potatoes."

In the spring of 1922, he picked up the best seed he could obtain and contracted Ashton growers to pay \$1 above market price to grow seed potatoes for him.

By 1923 he shipped 150 carloads of certified seed-potatoes between Twin Falls and Idaho Falls and traveled through the country himself to give advice to growers on planting, cultivation, irrigation, how

to dig and carry potatoes and how to grade and market them.

"I sold potatoes for five cents over three times as high as any potato on the market from northern states," he said.

Idaho quickly recovered from diseased potatoes and began to prosper and become the capital state of the United States in the potato industry.

From 1924 until 1930 Marshall shipped from 1,000 to 1,200 cars of potatoes yearly, establishing a record in both quantity and quality for the state.

The condition in which his potatoes arrived at their destination became a source of concern for Marshall.

"When I first started shipping them I would go to the shipping point to inspect the cars for bruising of damaged potatoes," he said. "I found they broke down badly."

Ever since then Marshall has been giving lectures from California to Maine and Virginia on careful handling and clean storage of potatoes.

He was the founder of the Idaho Potato Growers association which recently gave 12,000 pounds of potatoes and onions to Oak-Park River Forest Day Nursery, Working Boys Home and Chicago Foundations.

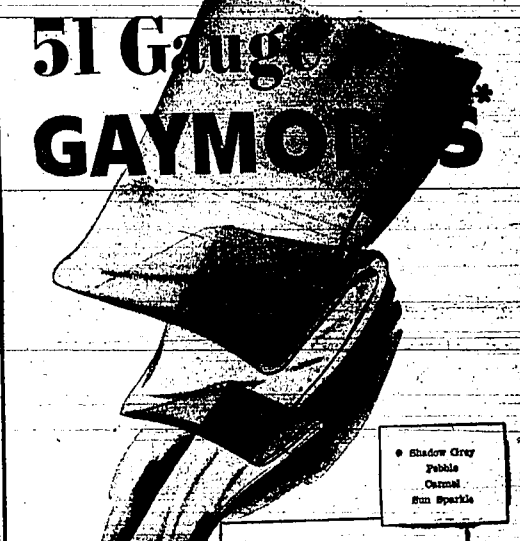

Melk completed a mission at Moscow for the English newspaper. With special privileges, he traveled extensively in Russia.

The newspaper career of Melk began in 1925 through his knowledge of Abyssinia and his friendship with Haile Selassie. With Mussolini attacking, Melk assumed the connection as war-diplomatic correspondent for "The People's Voice." He also occupied similar positions with "The Illustrated" and "John Bull."

Melk has published several noted books entitled "People of the Leaves," "Zambesia Interlude," "Veils of War," "Menzies over Hitler," and others.

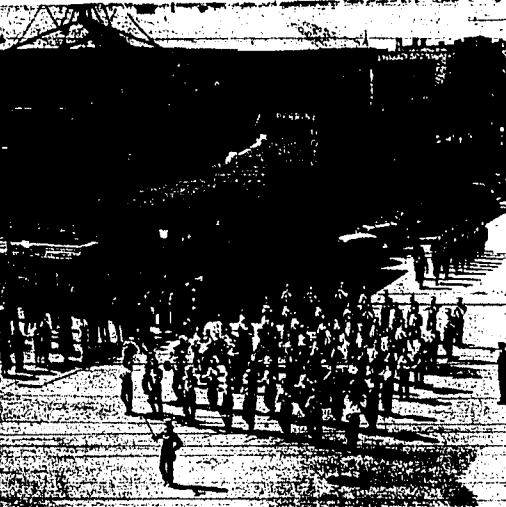

Collection of Antiques Prized By 11-Year-Old Girl at Buhl

By HUGHETTE WENIGER
Buhl, April 9—Unusual as it is for a young person to collect antiques is a hobby that Kala Crowley finds it interesting. She is well informed on her subject and enjoys the constant search for additions to her collection. Kala is the 11-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Mel Green, Buhl.

At a recent hobby show at the Lincoln school her display of antique miniature cups and saucers won considerable attention. Only a few other items were displayed. Most of the cups and saucers are family heirlooms, but a few are gifts from friends and relatives.

"About three generations ago," Kala commented, "it was the custom to give little girls these miniature sets on their birthdays, and in this way collections were started."

The miniature sets in Kala's collection are typical of the design of that period, the colors running to soft pastels, hand-painted flower designs usually with floral motifs decorated in gold.

One of the most interesting cups in the collection depicts from the usual current convention in design. The cup, which she has a buffaloe head designed from sea shells. Kala said, "I believe this was made by a child."

Three tiny cups and saucers appear to be the forerunner of the sets that are now made. They were found on the market later in the same size and design, but complete with pitcher.

Nearly all the specimens are more than 100 years old, and have come from Germany, Bavaria, France, England, Portugal and Prussia. Little pieces have been made in the United States.

Kala has not confined her collecting to the miniatures, but she is interested in antique dishes, too, and in several different types. She has authentic milk glass and the much prized lustre ware.

The milk glass plates in her collection were made as wall decorations and have scalloped edges through which ribbon can be run to hang them on the wall. The plates have reproductions of Venus and Cupid on them.

Milk glass is highly appreciated by collectors because of its rarity. Like all fashions milk glass went out of style. It has become popular again recently, but most of the pieces are imitations lacking the beauty of the original.

Lustre ware is also a prize item. This came from Germany and enjoyed great popularity in the 1800's. Like milk glass it is hard to obtain because only factory records were kept concerning the glass-making process. Kala's specimens of lustre ware have come down through the family or were purchased in antique shops.

At present Kala is concentrating on "chairside" plates. She has several different types. These were used "back" of the seat at breakfast cards are sent today. They were most popular in the early 1900's, but are used to some extent today as souvenirs.

The regular calendar plate contained a greeting, and had a remembrance on it. The souvenir plate usually had the picture of a church or resort building, and in some cases the current popular stage star.

Kala has a calendar plate from Bavaria Brothers in Kansas City, England, Portugal and Prussia. Little pieces have been made in the United States.

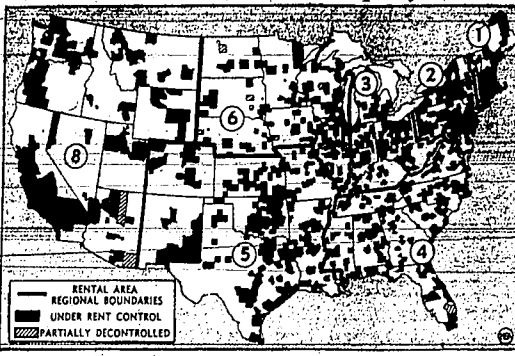

Conservatives Defeat British Laborite Rule

LONDON, April 8 (AP)—The conservative party wiped out today the 64-seat laborite majority in the London county council, second most important governing body in Britain.

Final returns from the county election yesterday gave the conservatives and laborites 64 seats apiece and one seat to a liberal, Sir Percy Harpur, a communist took their representation.

Deadlock Forecast
The possibility exists that the council may become "deadlocked." However, it appeared tonight the labor party would be able to elect a non-council member for chairman and thereby establish control of the body.

The old council, elected in 1926, had 90 laborites, 30 conservatives, two liberals and two communists. Five additional seats have been created since.

Follows Budget Announcement
The conservatives' announcement of a 10 percent increase in rates followed the announcement by Sir Stafford Cripps, laborite minister of the treasury, of the national budget for 1934-35. That budget held most taxes at about current levels and upped the prices of some basic foods.

One unseated laborite councilman, G. F. Howe, said 10 per cent of the voters he canvassed last night told him they had turned away from the labor party because of Cripps' call for continued austerity. Laborites had controlled the London county council since 1926. The council, outranked in importance only by parliament, administers schools, hospitals, public houses, parks, the fire department, streets, bridges and the like in 28 boroughs. It also has licensing and local taxing powers and has charge of town planning and building regulations.

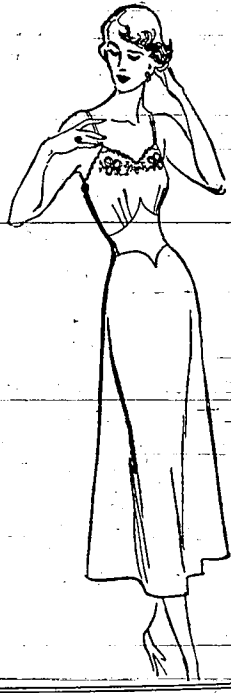
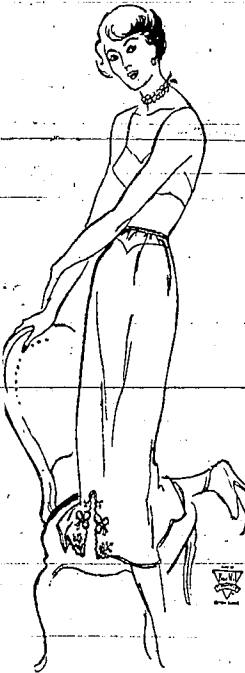
