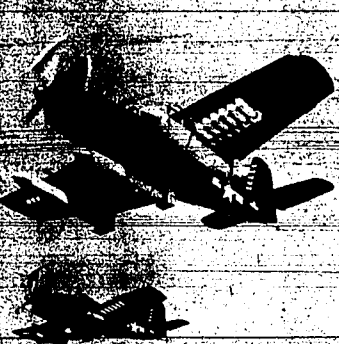

Dock Strike Ties Supplies of Meat

LONDON, April 12 (AP)—Britain's already record low meat ration was feared in danger today as the London dock strike entered its second day with no sign of settlement in sight.
 Thousands of tons of mutton, beef and other foodstuffs will be aboard the more than 80 ships tied up in the port of London. Unless the strike is settled soon, the government may find itself unable to meet even the present meat ration of approximately 14 (U. S.) cans worth of fresh meat and three cans worth of canned corned beef.
 Labor ministry officials said 15,000 men failed to show up at the docks today; strike leaders said 15,000 were out. Three thousand fishermen and bargemen were scheduled to meet tonight to consider a sympathy strike.

Straus Under Hot Crossfire Before Senate

WASHINGTON, April 12 (AP)—Senator Knowland, R., Calif., accused Reclamation Bureau Commissioner Michael W. Straus of "willfully and deliberately" giving the Senate "false information" during two years ago Straus told the senate appropriations committee his bureau had \$10,000,000 in unexpended funds. Knowland said the actual amount was \$35,000,000.
 Senator O'Mahoney, D., Wyo., touched off a senate flurry during discussion of an appropriations bill. He said while present law denies Straus salary until June 30, it will not affect his continuing in office.
 A rider to a money bill last year denied salary to Straus and Regional Director Richard E. Beck because they are not engineers. It has been in effect since Jan. 31; both have been serving without pay since then.
 Senator Downey, D., Calif., joined in the criticism of Straus.

Germans Face Bickering on Allied Ruling

 Initial German reaction to the allied announcement under which they are supposed to govern themselves has been surrounded by the agreement of the warring powers last Friday.

The members of the parliamentary council are trying to agree on a common program. Germany already were at odds among themselves and the allies over centralization of authority in the proposed government.

Already they are suffering from the fact that many Germans would take nothing they did as recognition of a divided Germany.

It was some Friday's announcement that the allies had agreed on their own attitude toward Germany. The German federal state, subject only to the limitations of the occupation statute, was to exercise full legislative and judicial powers. A great step was to be taken toward democracy at the same time, or before, diverse allied administrative institutions end. An allied high commission would be established to work with the German government.

Under Control

The Ruhr was to remain under international control. But allied forces were to be withdrawn and to save for Germany a large part of the remaining industrial plants actually scheduled for dismantlement.

The allies and Germans, working together would present the Russians with a situation, which might tempt them to renew negotiations for a settlement of the conflict, creating new possibilities for German unification.

Every possibility, with due regard for security and international allied obligations, was to be delegated to the warring powers. France was to have a veto in a limited field, and the high commission was to be a joint German-German government in certain cases, but the real objective was to maintain a neutral, not directive, control.

In reality the broad terms of the Russian plan, which if they wish, can nullify any action of any German parliament meant to bring about the end of the purposes of the occupation.

No Big Flood Predicted for Basin Region

PORTLAND, April 12 (AP)—The chief of the U. S. weather bureau here has announced he does not expect a damaging Columbia river flood this spring.

Col. R. Ellison said the odds against a flood are even higher than a month ago, because snow has been steadily melting into the river.

Although abnormal, rare weather conditions such as occurred last year could produce a flood, 20 feet of the Columbia at Troutdale is equivalent to 500,000 cbs (2 1/2 feet) of the Columbia at The Dalles. Those dangerous so, are above flood stage, but not dangerous.

The official river forecast predicted a peak of 100,000 cubic feet per second (30 foot stage) of the Snake river near Clarkston, a flood, 20 feet (4 1/2 feet) of the Columbia at Troutdale, 500,000 cbs (2 1/2 feet) of the Columbia at The Dalles. Those dangerous so, are above flood stage, but not dangerous.

The late May or early June peak in the Portland and Vancouver area would pass the peak before a height which would flood some often-inundated lowland, but would cause no serious damage.

Snake Rise Early

Ellison said "present indications are that the Snake river whose crest coincided with the upper Columbia's last year to produce abnormally high water, would pass the peak before the surge from the Columbia arrives."

The weather bureau here has issued warnings of local flooding in the Clark fork, Pend Oreille, and Spokane basins, in all eastward drainage of the Cascades in Washington, and in the entire Snake basin above King Hill, Ida.

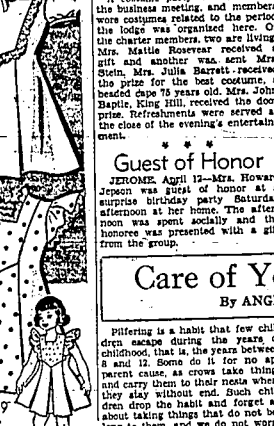

Postwar Rise Of Radio Said

Nearing Peak

CHICAGO, April 22.—The great postwar expansion in radio stations appears to be approaching its crest. The expansion is expressed by a majority of radio executives queried in a spot check at the 27th annual convention of the National Association of Broadcasters.

Most of them vote the belief that many areas of the country—probably most—now have as many radio stations as can be operated profitably.

Here's the picture: at the end of the year in 1946, there were 331 standard radio stations and 53 frequency modulation stations on the air for a total of 384.

Latest federal communications commission figures show 1,200 stations now operating—2,644 in all.

Some cities and towns that had only one radio station before the war now have three or more. Some that had no stations now have two or more.

Some of the stations depend on advertising revenue from sponsors. It means the competition for the radio advertising dollar has become much keener—even before television's full impact.

The industry's gross revenue has been increasing but not in proportion to the number of stations attempting to share it.

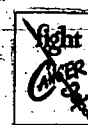
