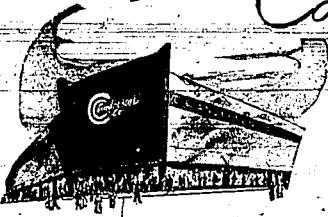

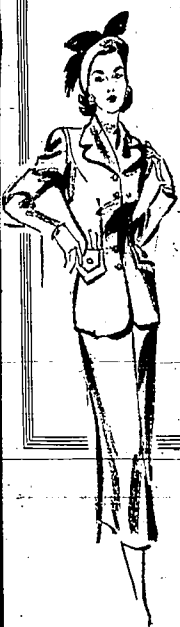

**Supports Are Reported for Grass Seeds**

**Supporters**, April 13—Supporters for the purchase of range grass seed to encourage an increase in production in expectation of greater need for such seed have been announced by the production and marketing administration of the U. S. department of agriculture, according to Carl E. Merk, county agricultural conservation committee chairman.

The support prices established for seeds produced include:

- Northern-grown alfalfa, 30 cents a pound; Alsike clover, 25 cents a pound; Ladino, 12 1/2; red, 15 cents; sweet, 12 cents; Hubert, eight cents; white, 45 cents. Of the common pasture grasses—smooth-bromus, will be supported at 18 cents; orchard grass, timothy at six cents, and the Alta and Kentucky 31 strains of tall fescue at 39 cents.

These wheat grasses have been added to the list of range grasses on which price supports were calculated in the fall of 1948. Cracked wheat grass will be supported at 16 cents a pound; tender at 10 cents; and western at 10 cents.

The other range grasses whose prices will be supported are: Big bluestem at 25 cents; Little bluestem at 20 cents; sand bluestem at 25 cents; alba oats grama, 50 cents; blue grama, 15 cents; buffalo grass, 35 cents; switch grass, 20 cents; stepping longgrass, 50 cents; sand lesovras, 50 cents; and yellow indiangrass, 25 cents.

The price at which mixed bluestem and mixed grama will be supported will depend on the amount and varieties of other seeds.

Price supports are to be operative through purchase agreements with farmers and they will be applicable to seed produced in 1949. The ratio will be subject to appropriate discounts for seeds which do not meet the basic specifications.

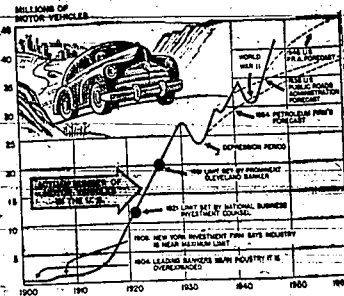

### Labor Plans Nationalizing New Business

LONDON, April 13 (AP)—The labor party said it will put five more big business under public ownership if it wins Britain's 1950 election.

The party's executive committee, in a 25,000-word policy statement, marked "common" life insurance, sugar making and refining, private and municipal water companies and all utilities "essential" for nationalization.

Nationalization of the chemical industry also was proclaimed if that become necessary "to assure vital national interests."

Development of municipal or other public ownership of fruit and vegetable wholesale marketing was forecast, along with government industries to compete with private business where necessary to control monopolies.

Businesses affected quickly declared they would fight.

Insurance companies were the biggest targets of the new public ownership drive. Two of the biggest were specifically named: The Prudential Assurance company and the Pearl Assurance. A party spokesman said 12 others are on the list.

The party said actually it wants to control only industrial assurance—life policies paid for by the wage and payable only on death. But it said company officials had shown that the industrial branch and other forms of insurance could not stand alone without drastic revision. Consequently all the insurance business of major companies will be nationalized, the statement said.

HAILEY, April 13—In connection with Easter week the Community Baptist church held a Palm Sunday baptismal service, with the address and services by the Rev. John Sapers, house. Social music by the choir and a vocal solo by Mrs. Leah Walker were featured in the service.

On Easter morn the observance for members of this church will begin with a sunrise service planned by the young people of the church. It will be held at 6 a. m. and will be followed by an Easter breakfast.

Speaker for the morning worship service will be Rose Williams who is a mission worker from the national office in New York City and a widely known speaker. Members of the church feel fortunate to have such a speaker, and realize their long effort in behalf of the church, which has been without a pastor for several months, is responsible for the consideration by the church officials.

The pianist-choir director, Mrs. Robert H. Wright, will present her group of two master artists—Vocal solo will be given by Richard Alm and Darrell Walker.

Programs for the service are being printed with a picture of the church on the front. In the past several months much improvement has been made in the building, and the members are awaiting the Sunday of June 12, when their permanent pastor, who will have received his degree then, will arrive to accept the pastorate of the local church.

### 2 New Drugs Hold Hope in Fever Control

WASHINGTON, April 13 (AP)—Medicine has two new and quicker-acting drug weapons against undulant fever, a group of scientists reported today.

Undulant fever, or brucellosis, is the disease caused by circulating raw milk from cattle infected with "Bang's disease"—or from handling raw milk. From 1936-1940, 24,000 cases of fever.

The scientists said either streptomycin or chloromycetin—two of the new "wonder drugs"—can overcome the acute stage of the disease within 72 hours.

This compares, they said, with seven to 10 days required by a combination of streptomycin and sulfadiazine.

They emphasized, however, that streptomycin and chloromycetin—and also the previous treatment—can overcome only acute attacks of the disease, with relapses possible after the patient recovers.

But scientists said that in some relapses they have noted, each of the "drugs" has "been as effective" as the second attack as the first. More than one relapse is possible.

The doctors made their reports at a symposium sponsored by the U. S. public health service.
