### Potato Piler's Injuries Cited By Specialist

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, today issued a report which will show, April 22, that the most common or ultimate injuries to potato planters in transferring them from tractor to trailer to the storage bin are suggested by E. M. Humphrey, associate agricultural engineer with the University of Idaho agricultural experiment station.

Stationed at Aberdeen, Humphrey is working on the potato injury defect, a cooperative venture between the university and the Idaho marketing commission.

Studies at the Aberdeen branch station last fall revealed that the piler was one of the main sources of mechanical injury to potato handling.

**Percentage Cited**

"Weighted average of samples taken from 16 different operators showed a reduction of 30 to 35 per cent in the amount of No. 1 potatoes due to this one operation," Humphrey reports. "There was also a noticeable increase in potatoes containing hard bruises. Here the increase was 11 per cent."

Humphrey suggests to reduce this loss are:

- Keep the operating speed of the piler below 70 feet per minute.
- Keep the piler elevated above the growing pile so that the chain cannot strike the potatoes in the hopper.
- Use slip rubber tubing over each chain link to act as a cushion.
- Padding hoppers.
- Pad the piler hopper with sponge rubber at least 1/2-inch thick and cover with canvas to prevent wear. If this is not obtainable, sacks used as padding will help prevent injury.
- Keep chain on the piler fairly tight so that it runs smoothly.
- Handle potatoes carefully when dumping into the hopper.

This study of piler injuries is part of an overall program to improve the condition in which Idaho potatoes reach the market, and to help the producer market his potatoes in good condition. To locate the points of operation where potatoes are injured, every handling operation from digging to display in the grocery store is being studied. Remedial measures are being directed first at the points of operations accounting for most injury.

WASHINGTON, April 22 (AP)—Representative Sanborn, R., Idaho, today cited a recent statement of President Truman as supporting the position of the 48 house members who voted against the European recovery program.

The President said economic cooperation administration costs might safely be reduced by \$15,000,000 this year because of lower prices of materials purchased for the program in this country.

Sanborn, who was only one of the 48, said in a statement he voted against the bill solely because he believed the amount authorized was excessive.

He was not voting against the bill because of any objection to the aid going to Europe," he said.

"Europe has made great strides of recovery with the help of the United States but there is ample evidence today that she can get along with much less than the amount recommended by the administration."

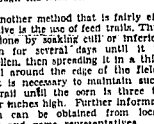

### Three 'Smoky Things' Cause Oregon 'Stir'

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., April 29 (AP)—Three smoking objects that flashed over Klamath county awoke this section of southern Oregon to talk about "trying things in the sky" today.

The best immediate explanation seemed to be that they were meteors. "First those who saw them said they thought they were burning pieces of aluminum. The investigation disproved this. An astronomer was cautious, however, about the theory.

"Too Many?"

"If there hadn't been so many of them, you would say definitely they were meteors," said Dr. J. Hugh Eriett, University of Oregon astronomer who flew to the area to investigate. He did not see the objects himself.

"I don't know," he continued, "I don't know. Of course, there have been times when several meteors have been reported traveling the same line."

A Klamath Falls businessman, A. A. Collier, and his wife reported the first one. He said it burned in a white light and had a 50-foot trail of white smoke that was at 5:30 p. m. Wednesday. The object appeared to be 10 miles south of Klamath Falls, he said.

Duplicated Later

Then three minutes later, in about the same place, they said they saw a duplicate.

A country school teacher, M. W. Griffith—who had heard—his Collier's report—reported he saw virtually the same thing today at 6:15 a. m. The trail, however, was 16 or 20 miles east of where the Colliers reported theirs.

The Colliers thought their plunging straight down. Mitchell said the one he saw zig-zagged.

Pruett said meteors have been known to zig-zag as they approached Earth, he said.
