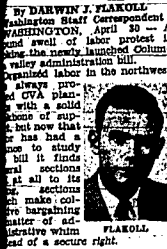

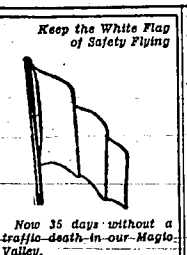

The OVA plan is subject to protest by the labor unions, and the administrators clear right to fire and promote as they see fit.

Distinguished Flying Cross Is Awarded Former Tail Gunner

Edward E. Powell, former staff sergeant in the air force, received a distinguished flying cross Thursday for his participation in a difficult bombing mission over Tokyo on Aug. 8, 1945. The presentation was made by an officer from Hill Field, Utah.
Powell is employed at the Shoshone falls power plant of the Utah Power company. He was a tail gunner in a B-29 of the 20th air force when he earned the award.
Following is the citation which accompanied the medal:
"For extraordinary achievement as a tail gunner of a combat crew while participating in aerial flight Aug. 8, 1945. These individuals were combat crew members on a B-29 aircraft leading an element in a daring daylight strike against the Mushashiro Nakajima aircraft factory in the outskirts of Tokyo, Japan."
The radar set on their bomber became inoperative and navigation difficulties were encountered when the crew had to fly through two tropical storms while en route to the objective. Reaching the area, they quickly drew into their assigned position as leader of the number three element.

New Solutions Used Now for Insect Sprays

Several new insecticide solutions are now recommended in place of the present method for terminating farm insect pests, according to County Agent C. W. Dalgle, who has returned from a three-day training course held this week in Boise.
In place of DDT a preparation containing five per cent of chlordane is now recommended for control of alfalfa weevil. The chlordane may be applied either as a dust or a spray. It is most effectively applied at 20 pounds per acre to the entire building as well as the weevil is first noticed.
To kill chinch bugs and wood ticks on sheep, one pound of edosha benzene and hexachloride to four pounds of DDT and 100 gallons of water is recommended.
The same old remedy of 10 pounds of actual DDT per acre applied at the same time as commercial fertilizer is suggested for killing wire worms. However, a new preparation which contains five per cent chlordane dust is suggested for killing wire worms.
DDT spray is still recommended for killing earwig. It is recommended such spots as fence rows, just before and just after the insect is suggested for killing wire worms.
For killing the logan bug in alfalfa, one pound of edosha benzene and hexachloride to four pounds of DDT dust is recommended. DDT is recommended for killing flies on dairy cattle.

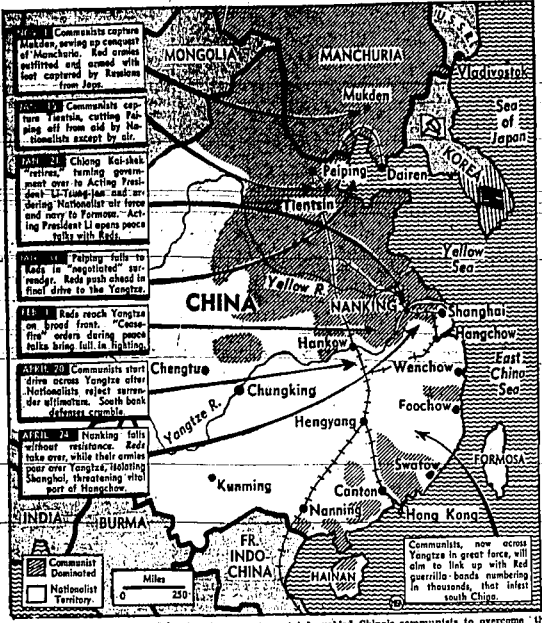

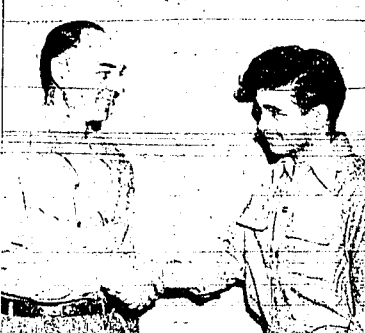

Spokane, April 30 (AP)—The city of Spokane shuffled Rep. Compton I. White's \$200,000 damage claim to the legal division today for a thorough examination.

Nor did they comment on the Idaho Democrat's offer in the claim to settle the matter "amicably" for \$100,000 and "retraction of the charges made against him."

White was arrested April 1 after an argument with a traffic officer over a parking violation ticket placed on his car. He spent the night in the city jail and was fined \$100 and costs in police court the next day on a charge of disorderly conduct.

In his offer to settle out of court, White demands public retraction of "charges that I was intoxicated; that I committed a breach of the peace and that I improperly resisted police officers."

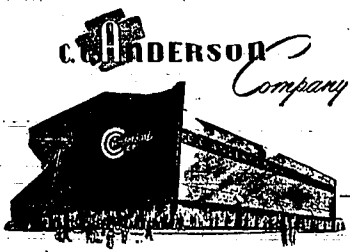

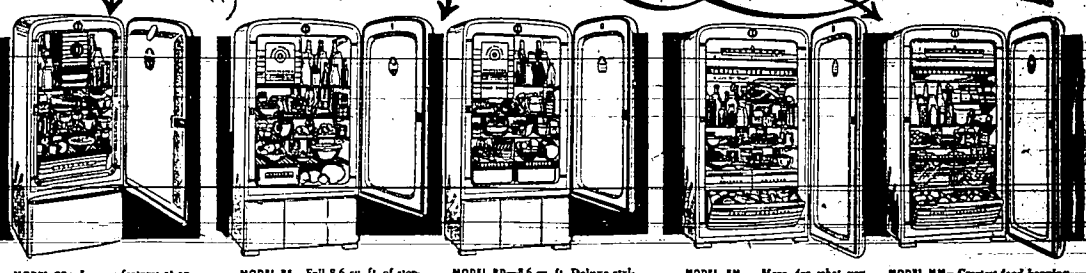

Idaho Pacing 25 States for "Safe" Traffic

CHICAGO, April 30 (AP)—The National Safety council reports that Americans died on the highways at a faster rate in the first quarter of 1940 than a year ago, and scored Americans for paying this tax.

However, 26 states reported decreases in fatalities led by Idaho with a 71 per cent drop.

In the first three months of the year, there were 6,610 traffic deaths, the council said, an increase of two per cent over the same period last year.

Many of us are yelling our heads off right now over higher taxes, said Council President Ned H. Dearborn, "and at the same time are accepting complacently a higher tax on human life—perhaps our own life—by the privilege venturing forth on a public highway."

The bad travel, the council said, apparently was the prime reason for the increase. Vehicle mileage was up 10 per cent in January and February over the same months of 1940, and March travel was expected to follow the trend.

Massachusetts showed an 81 per cent gain. Fatalities in Maryland went up 50 per cent and those in Rhode Island 50 per cent.

As a whole, the cities did better than the nation. City tolls were down two per cent from the same period last year.

In total, 200 cities had perfect records during the three-month period.

WASHINGTON, April 30 (AP)—A Democratic official said here that President Truman's latest edict on patronage is not likely to affect Mayor Taylor, D. Ida., who ran for vice president on Henry Wallace's Progressive party ticket last year.

\$300,000 Rise Listed in State Income Taxes

BOISE, April 30 (AP)—Idaho's income tax revenue in 1943 was \$300,000 more than in 1942 despite less revenue per return.

P. C. Neilly, deputy tax commissioner, said the average tax return was \$4,423.86 in 1943, but that 12,000 more individuals filed returns last year.

He said a decline in property taxes the latter months of 1943 and adverse weather in some sections of the state were believed responsible for the decrease in revenue per return.

Total collections from July 1, 1942, to date amount to \$8,951,922 as compared with \$8,152,888 for the same period one year ago.

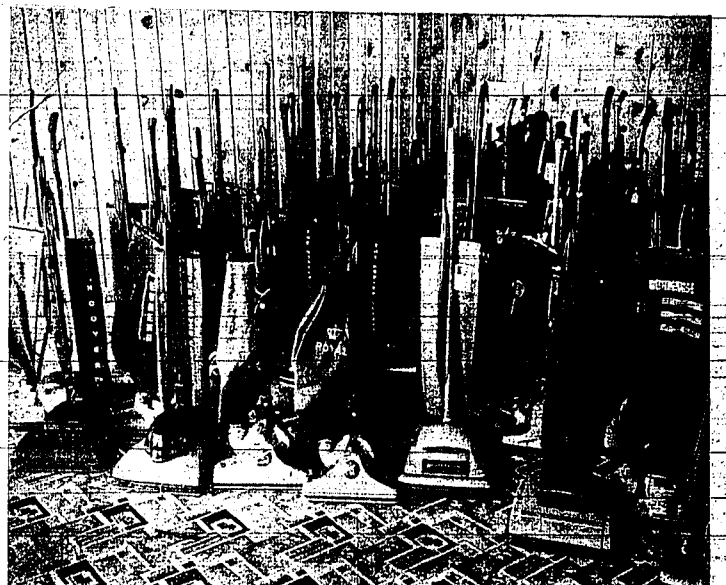

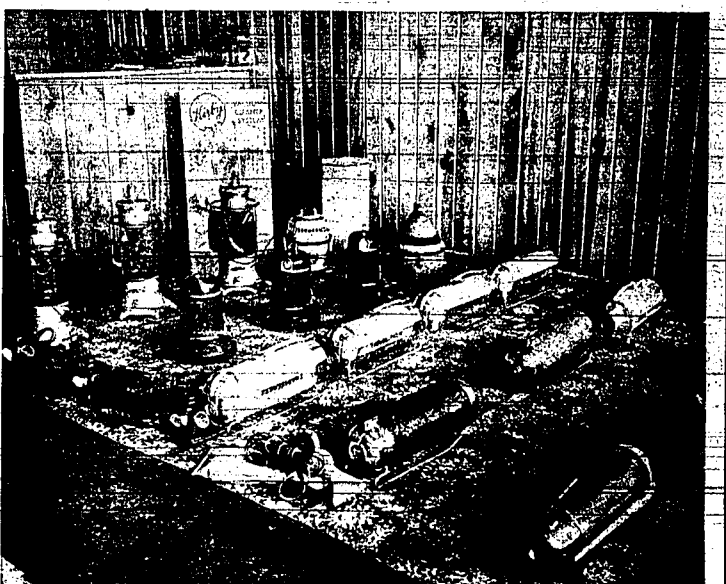

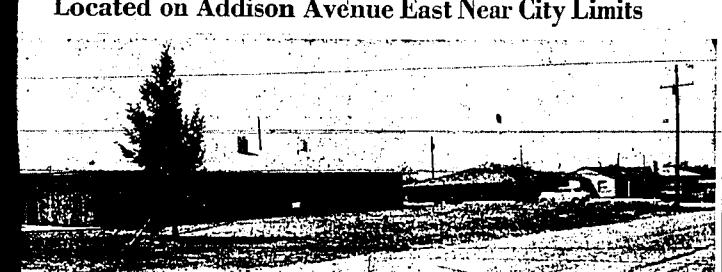

Expert Gives May Review For Heavens

By J. HUGH FRIEHT, Higher Education System, State Department.

Called such, but because of the blance of some of them and their names among the "fixed" stars, the most interesting objects in the firmament of the night sky are the stars which are visible in the western twilight sky, but which are not visible until the end of the month and then only very near the horizon.

Stars in the evening twilight sky are also visible in the north and northwest as soon as the sky is sufficiently darkened. Near the horizon, at which time it will be in a poor position for observation.

Stars in the dawn sky—too close to the sun for observation this month, Jupiter is still in the morning sky and is brilliant in the south southeast at daybreak. Mars is high in the south hour after sunset, and is easily bright as it stands very close to the ecliptic. In an hour after sunset, the most distant planet, visible only in large telescopes, is located in the constellation of Saturn. Uranus and Neptune also in the evening sky, but invisible to the unaided eye. In the dawn, Uranus is high in the east, while Neptune is high in the west.

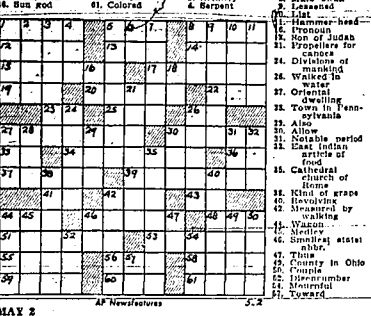

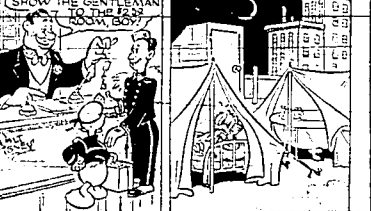
