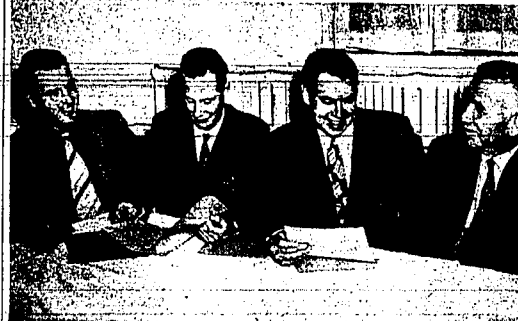

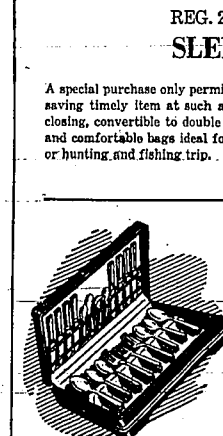

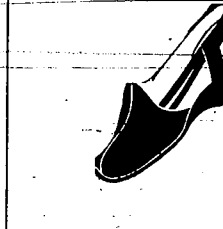

### iker Sees Serious Bust In 'Hot' War

WASHINGTON, May 5 (AP)—It is in for a readjustment unless the cold war gets "hot" again, the United States Chamber of Commerce was told today.

It won't turn into a real one unless the government provides the remedy by without realistic steps to get enterprises back into gear, Murray Sheldahl, vice president of the Chamber of Commerce, told a session in which members at the 37th annual conference tried to learn what's ahead.

Sheldahl forecast on that point in part with a new call by President Truman's economic advisers, delivered at the White House shortly after the president's speech.

Edward G. Nourse of the Federal Reserve Board declined to make the survey public but gave out the following:

### 600 Members of School Safety Patrols Gather Here Saturday

About 600 members of school safety patrols in Magic Valley will gather in Twin Falls Saturday for an annual picnic sponsored jointly by the Idaho Junior Chamber of Commerce; local, county and state police; and the Simplot School Safety Foundation.

Attending the picnic will be members of safety patrols of schools in the area from Rupert, Bliss and north to Ketchikan. In addition to student patrolmen, several high school bands are scheduled to attend, according to G. H. (Safety) Davis, director of the Simplot foundation.

Purpose of the annual picnic is to recognize the work of students participating in the school safety program. Sponsors of the program will furnish sandwiches, fruit, cake, soft drinks, ice cream and candy for all patrolmen, supervisors and high school band members. Davis said.

Individual schools are scheduled to meet at 10 a. m. at the city park. In praising the work of members of school safety patrols, Davis pointed out that figures compiled by the U. S. department of vital statistics and the National Safety Council prove the patrols have saved the lives of 24,000 children in the last 20 years. In addition, they have been instrumental in preventing 100,000 crippling injuries, he said.

Davis met here with representatives of the sponsoring groups to outline plans for the Saturday picnic and program.

### Classification For Gooding's Airport Aired

In explaining the difference in classification to CAA officials in Washington, Kenneth S. Ferry, acting chief of the airport branch of the CAA office at Seattle, wrote:

"Even though the temperature and altitude corrections are a little greater at Twin Falls, the high effective gradient—of the main runway at Gooding necessitates a much larger over-all correction factor."

"It is interesting to note that a trunk line airport at sea level in a cool climate with only slight gradient would have a numerical classification of 7, while a trunk line airport at high altitude with hot summer weather and an unfavorable effective gradient could have a numerical classification of 7. . . . Ultimate designations are both 'trunk line'."

# CVA View of Washington's Chief Rapped

OLYMPIA, May 5 (AP)—Secretary of State Paul Clegg has criticized Governor Langlie for his opposition to proposed Columbia valley administration legislation.

The governor last week denounced the proposed CVA as an all-powerful super-agency without checks or balances. Creation of the CVA has been proposed by President Truman in a bill now before congress.

Coe, who said he had been a long-time advocate of the CVA, said in a prepared statement:

Statements that a CVA would mean throwing away basic rights and freedoms are "pure bunkum," Coe declared.

He said he believed one agency would better plan and carry out the development of our greatest natural resource than to have a dozen or better federal agencies bickering over which one is to get the appropriation to carry out some part of the program."

# Marshal Petain To Stay on Isle

PARIS, May 5 (AP)—The French government decided today to keep the aged and ailing Marshal Philippe Petain on the Breck island where he is serving a life sentence for treason.

The question of moving the 82-year-old marshal, French hero of World War I and head of the Vichy government during the German occupation in World War II, has come up many times. Each time the government has decided not to move him from the Ile d'Yeu, off the west coast of France.

Recent reports have indicated Petain is suffering increasingly from the infirmities of age.

"It is a ticklish 100-ton removal job. It has to be done piece by piece," Harold D. Van Maton, state director of public institutions, estimated. It will take four to six weeks.

Van Maton said architects are considering the possibility of leaving the dome without a cupola or putting up a metal one that would resemble stone.

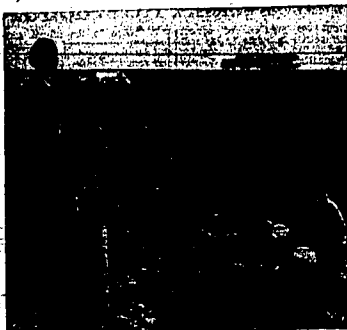

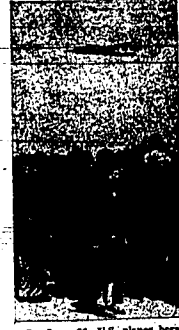
# Blockade That Boomeranged



The Berlin blockade started on April 1, 1948, when the Russians cut off rail traffic into the city and later even tore up rails. They also severed the international highway, only road western powers could use to enter the city, and halted all barge and waterway shipments. This action made the former German capital the "front line" in the high-tension east-west cold war.



As a counter-measure the western powers introduced a new currency to bedevil Russians on June 19. Soviet protests were ignored, so the Russians clamped down total blockade.



On June 24, U.S. planes began supplying western Berlin's 2,500,000 inhabitants. Since then Anglo-U.S. airlift planes have delivered a daily average of 4,500 tons of food and fuel.



Thanks to successful operation of the airlift, the west was able to establish a counter-blockade to pinch the German economy. Western Berlin's economy improved while Russian-controlled areas steadily deteriorated for lack of essential materials. Officials claim eastern Germany "beyond doubt" was hit the hardest as blockade idea boomeranged on the Russians.

Construction of the Twin Falls county canning kitchen is continuing at a rapid pace with almost all concrete for the foundation poured already. Operation should start by July 1, L. T. Creed, manager, said Thursday.

Capacity of the plant will be 5,000 to 6,000 No. 1 and No. 2's cans per day. A state official said it would be the finest canning kitchen in Idaho.

An 84-foot well was completed Tuesday. This is the deepest well in the immediate area and was sunk that deep, to insure a large, steady supply of water, Creed said. The water comes up to within 20 feet of the top of the well.

The kitchen is located on land about 800 yards from the south side of the Blue Lakes boulevard across Rock Creek canyon. It is about 100 yards from the road on the east side.

Dirt is being brought to the area to form the base for a concrete floor. The building will be 30 feet by 100 feet. The main canning section is 36 by 80 feet and includes the canning area, a storage room and an office. There will be three drains leading to a grease trap and into a four-foot sewer line.

Storage room and office space will be located in the front part of the building while the boiler room, coal

with the other door located in the front of the building.

Plans call for construction of picnic tables, benches and grills with the waste material from construction of the main building.

Expenditure of funds already includes \$600 for lumber and \$700 for concrete.

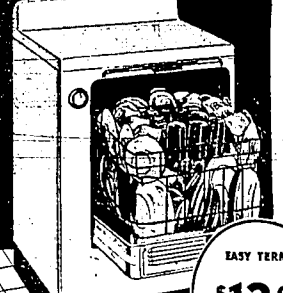

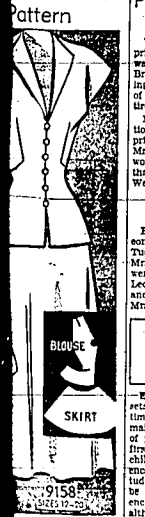

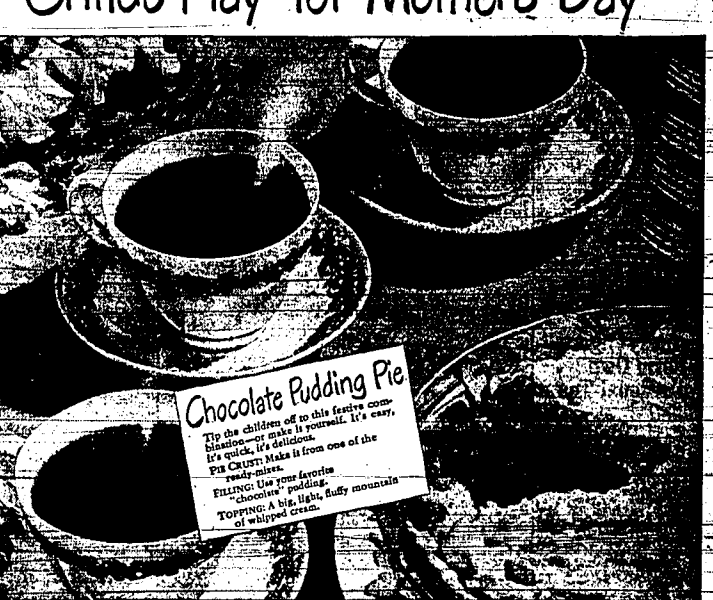

### Special Radio 'Wave Bands' Set by FCC

WASHINGTON, May 5 (AP)—The Federal Communications Commission has filed new frequency channels for radio operations for scores of specialized radio services.

The commission order, issued after five years of study, would affect more than 200,000 mobile radio units used by newspapers, police agencies, taxicab companies, railroads, forest fire fighters, delivery services and private persons.

**Confirms News-Use**  
The order confirms as a permanent service the use of radio units which reporters use to speed the transmission of news from reporters in the field to their city desks.

**Refuses Picture Band**  
The commission refused, however, to authorize the radio facsimile transmission of photographs from mobile radio units in the "VHF" band.

It said that it is "unable to determine at this time that this type of service is in the public interest."

**Concedes Good Work**  
The commission said it was "pleased to note that the New York Daily Mirror has made extensive and successful experiments" in radio facsimile transmission of photographs.

They have been given government police protection.

A Philippine constabulary source said threats had been received by Manuel Quezon, Jr. and his sister, Mrs. Zenaida Buena. ### House Winds Up Action on Missile Base

WASHINGTON, May 5 (AP)—The house has completed congressional action on a bill to give the military \$10,000,000 to start on a 3,000-mile test range for guided missiles.

It sent the measure to President Truman who is expected to sign it promptly. The range ultimately will cost about \$200,000,000. It will include a launching area in this country and a "test" target area outside the United States.

Negotiations are under way now with the British concerning establishment of these tracking stations in the Bahamas. The missiles would be launched out over the South Atlantic from a station in the Melbourne-Cocoa area of Florida.

The United States expects to have ready for test by the end of this year a guided missile with a range of 500 miles. It will have to be tested at the new station because present

He spoke before the annual meeting of the American association of Indian Affairs. The former Idaho educator said his plans for reorganizing the bureau along more efficient lines included the setting up of three divisions, national affairs, with community relations, utilities and other facilities.

### USAF Shows Amazing New 'Air Building'

BUFFALO, N. Y., May 8 (AP)—A vacuum cleaner holds up an amazing new balloon house made of only air, glass and rubber.

This house, disclosed by the air force, is flexible but strong. It will stand up under winds of 140 miles an hour that would wreck a sturdy frame dwelling. Seventy-five-mile winds are a hurricane.

The house is half of a huge balloon 30 feet high and 33 feet in diameter, fastened to a concrete base. It's made of fibre glass and rubber, and is only as thick as a few pages of this newspaper.

Air holds it up, acting as the timbers and beams. Once it's inflated, a vacuum cleaner pushing air in keeps it pumped up and inflated. You enter and leave through an air lock.

The pressure inside is less than that inside a child's toy balloon. But a puncture would make this airy house explode. It would just collapse slowly. It hit by shellfire, there would be no wood or stones to fall on men or equipment.

The balloon house, called the radome, was built to protect new radar eye equipment for the air force. It was made by the Cornell aeronautical laboratory here. But the idea could be modified for movable private homes or for buildings like an ice skating rink.

The radome is designed to operate in any climate from 0° below zero up to 140 degrees. This one is colored black. But it can be given different colors for camouflage in regions from the Arctic to jungles. It has withstood wind gusts of 80 miles an hour, and is designed to take 140 without blowing over.

"I'm absolutely flat broke," Crowe was quoted as saying. "In fact, I'm worse than broke. I owe money. That's why I'm converting our garage into a small apartment and renting rooms to summer vacationists. We've got to eat."

**Awaiting Trial**  
Crowe, who is awaiting trial on a federal indictment of four counts relating to the alleged theft of a fortune in cash and securities, said he has told nothing yet to his children, Richard H., Jr., 6, and Mary Elizabeth, 5, and William, 1.

"The children know nothing about all this," he said. "They thought I was in the hospital. There's no doubt that I was in Bellevue. In 15 days I answered questions put to me by 28 doctors. I counted 'em."

### Passenger Liner Refuses Gamble In Island Strike

HONOLULU, May 8 (AP)—The liner President Cleveland stood off Honolulu today and discharged and took on passengers by tug boat despite the fact that striking dock workers that it could enter port.
