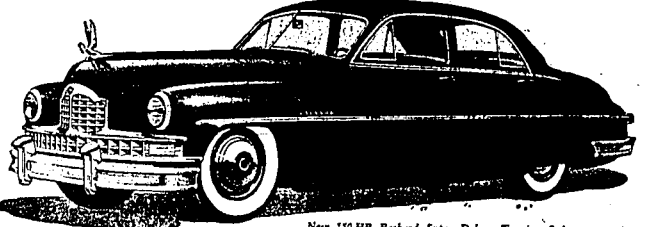

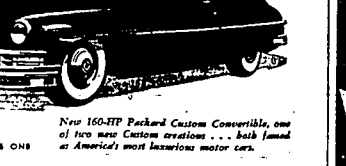

And I don't want him ever to forget that he is an American. God, a nice, plain, country boy just as most of us Americans are. I have no business talking to the President of the United States like this. That I grant you. But I consider him a friend, and as one of the little, tiny people who helped put him on Pennsylvania avenue (now the Blair house). I don't want him to let any of us down. Mr. Truman, some day you will know that you can't threaten an American and make it stick. An American will take it for a while. He will put up with it just so long. Solon Insists Plan of GOP To Get Okay

WASHINGTON, May 9 (UP)—Senator Taft, R. Ohio, says that major domestic legislation passed by the Senate is "the Republican program" and inquired "what's happened to Mr. Truman's proposition?"
 Senator Myers of Pennsylvania, acting Democratic floor leader, replied promptly that his party's program only has "corrected some of the mistakes" of the Republican 80th congress, but is moving ahead with the President's program.
 In separate interviews, Taft and Myers said credit for both their respective parties in senate approval of "housing," "aid to education and school health bills."
Offer Nothing New
 "These were part of the Republican program that the senate passed last year," said Taft, who heads the GOP policy committee. "On the other hand, to date the Democrats haven't offered anything new."
 "We have talked about a national health program, including socialized medicine, but it doesn't look now as though they are going to try to pass it this year."
 Secretary of Agriculture Brannan has suggested a new farm program, but they don't seem to have been able yet to get it into bill form.
 "As for repeal of the Taft-Hartley act, which the Presidents talked about all the time, his campaign on the house action on that seems to speak for itself."
 The house reached up the repeal bill and down again last week, finally sending the bill to the senate. Representative Wood, D. Cal., retaining many of the provisions of back committees for a fresh start.
Talk Deals Vets
 Conceding that the Republicans had furnished help in passage of the housing bill, Myers said that health bills, Myers added that talk by GOP senators "certainly delayed the final vote for a while."
 "We are getting through some important parts of the President's program," Myers said. "The housing, education and school health bills were all in our program."
 "We have not corrected the mistake the Republican 80th congress made in restricting the commodity trust corporation's right to acquire grain storage facilities."
 "We have passed the Marshall plan bill. Next week we are going to take up the measure, which the house already has voted, to correct the mistakes the Republicans made in continuing the reciprocal trade agreements program."

BUY U.S. SAVINGS BONDS

U. S. to Stage Largest Bond Drive of All Starting May 15

By DOUGLAS LARSEN

WASHINGTON, (NEA)—One of the greatest patriotic promotions ever set foot in the U. S. has been prepared for the government's 1949 savings bond drive, which will start May 15 and last through June 30.

In many respects this campaign will be bigger than the war bond drive. It is the first time since the war that the government has ventured to set a quota—\$1,040,000,000 in series E bonds.

The name of the campaign is "opportunity drive." The slogan is "get more opportunity in your future."

The main reason for the big drive this year is that the U. S. Treasury needs the money. Government expenditures are up and the income from taxes is down. The treasury's own explanation elaborates:

"The widest possible distribution of our national debt is the responsibility of all of us. Through continued investment in these bonds by individuals we distribute the debt as widely as possible rather than concentrate it in banks, thus securing a better balanced ownership and a less volatile debt. Further, as the debt shifts from banks to persons, billions of dollars of interest go into American homes."

It is expected that newspapers, radio and magazines will donate close to \$50,000,000 worth of space and time to the campaign. More than 200,000 newboys have been enlisted to help in the sale and to distribute forms for payroll savings deductions.

For the first time since the war practically the whole motion picture industry has been mustered behind the campaign. One hundred bond premiers are planned for 100 of the largest U. S. cities, with sets going only to purchasers of \$100 bonds. Hollywood names will be part of this drive.

A movie short, "Covered Wagon," is now being produced to symbolize the nation's growth.

the effort and will be shown at most of the theaters in the U. S. during the drive. This film, as well as the contributions of newspapers, radio and magazines, is being given free as a public service by the industry.

The U. S. air force will contribute its share to dramatize the drive by launching original covered wagons from Cedar City, Utah, to Independence, Mo., home town of the President, on the day the drive opens. Later, they will be flown to 50 different cities.

Independence will be the hub of the whole campaign. On May 15, the President will fly there and officially "air-lift" the "opportunity drive" with a speech on the four major radio networks. This will be followed by elaborate programs on a 31 network. Speaking with the President on the big show will be Gov. Earl Warren, California and Gov. Paul A. Devere, Massachusetts, representing the east and west coasts.

The five top quotas set for states are New York, \$127,800,000; Illinois, \$90,000,000; Pennsylvania, \$82,000,000; California, \$78,000,000; and Ohio, \$67,400,000. Nevada has the smallest quota, \$950,000. Quotas for the individual cities are being set by the various states.

One of the most encouraging facts about the whole government savings bond business since the war, according to treasury officials, has been the steady decline in the number of persons cashing them in. The first year after the war was the worst, with redemptions exceeding E bond sales by \$957,000,000.

The redemption rate in 1948 was lower than in 1947. The net of E bond sales above redemptions in 1948 was 219 per cent of that of 1947. Consistently for the past three years have averaged less than one per cent a month of the total outstanding.

E bonds sell for 75 cents on the dollar of maturity value. The E bond market in 1948, and pays an average of 2.9 per cent compounded semi-annually, if held to maturity. An individual can purchase up to \$10,000 worth of them in any one calendar year.

Airline Head Urges Added Pay for Mail

WASHINGTON, May 9 (AP)—W. A. Patterson, president of United Air Lines, said today the only "immediate remedy" for the financial plight of airlines is more pay for carrying mail.

He told the senate commerce committee this is the only quick form of relief for dealing with "our un-economic price-cost ratio." He said the failure to raise passenger rates in the face of rising costs is another reason why the industry is not operating profitably.

Seek Loss Causes

The committee is investigating the airlines to learn why so many carriers are operating "in the red."

Patterson coupled his mail pay recommendation with some harsh remarks about the past direction of the civil aeronautics board which regulates the airlines.

He said some "serious mistakes" in the past leading to too many airlines and too great a number of routes has left the present board "in a terrific mess."

"Blame Game" Flayed

Prior to the appointment of the present chairman, J. J. O'Connell, Patterson testified, there was "discipline and discord" in the CAB for 18 months. He praised the present board.

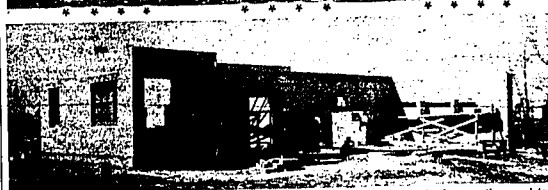
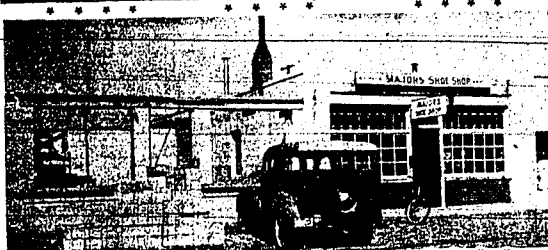
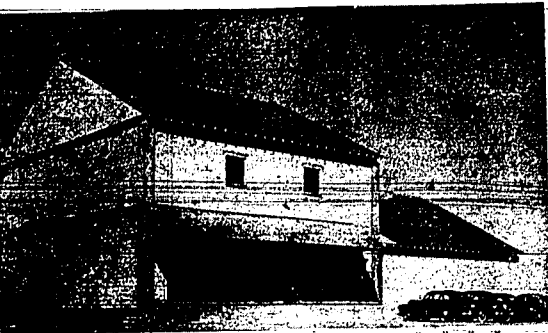
