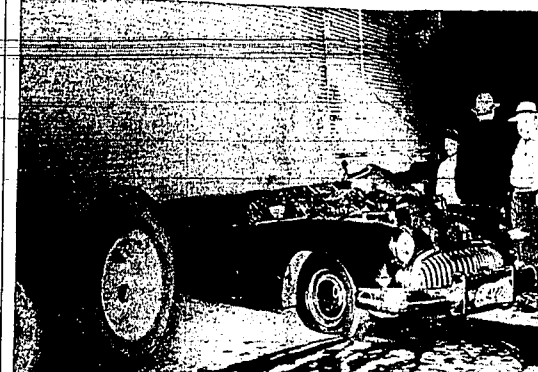

# Solon Assaults Tribe Neglect In Northwest

WASHINGTON, May 13 (AP)—Representative Horan, R., Idaho, believes the Kallipash Indian tribe in Washington state is the "forgotten tribe" of a "forgotten people."

He said a recent survey of conditions among the 100 members of the Kallipash tribe at the Indian reservation they get from the Indian bureau is clerical.

"One-fourth of the population is illiterate and none has ever been known to attend school," Horan said. "They are poor and farm lands have run down. Less than 10 per cent of them are employed and the remainder take their place in today's complex society."

Horan wrote to commissioner John Nicholas of the Indian bureau urging that a request from the chairman of the Kallipash Indian tribal council of Idaho for aid to establish a school be granted. He said the nearest Indian agency to which the tribes can look for assistance is located at Lapwai, Idaho, a distance of 400 miles.

Should Gain More  
"It is long due to give Horan told Nicholas, "that the Indians in those three reservations should be better provided with agricultural services and assistance, with domestic home improvement counseling, better education and health facilities and better provision for law enforcement."

Horan said Washington state and Pend Oreille county officials had given much aid to the Kallipash although the responsibility is not theirs.

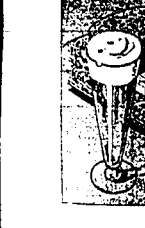

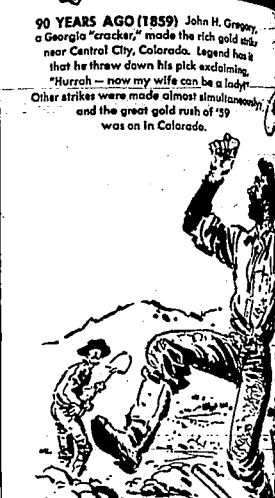

The win gave them a firm grip on second place in league standings, leaving only the Twin Falls Cowboys with a better record.

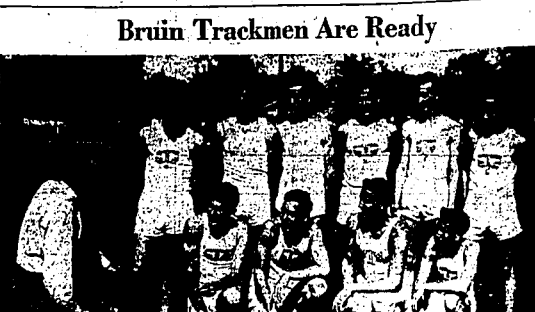
