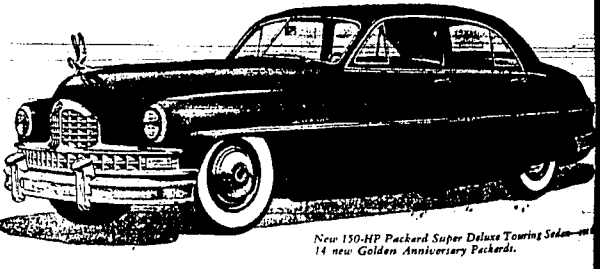

Summerfield Plays Action Of Cavanagh

POCATTELLO, May 16 (UP)—Democratic party solidarity, particularly among party officials, was urged here by R. L. Summerfield, Twin Falls, Democratic candidate for lieutenant-governor in 1948. Summerfield, in a statement to the United Press, urged all party officials "to adopt the policy of Ed Brennan, party chairman, and work for the election of all the candidates who win the party nomination." Summerfield was critical of the position taken by Dan Cavanagh, Democratic national committeeman, who has taken an active part in fighting the possible nomination of Glen Taylor as U. S. senator. Summerfield said to succeed himself in 1950. "I think that Mr. Cavanagh is hurting the Democratic party through his actions," Summerfield said. "As a party official he should keep his hands off the primary candidates and their race. He should concentrate on working for the election of those persons who win the party's nomination." The Twin Falls Cavanagh manager suggested that if Mr. Cavanagh might fight the nomination of Glen Taylor as a senatorial candidate, he should resign his position, and then, as a rank and file member of the party, he can work for the nomination of a candidate that pleases him. Summerfield pointed out that he was speaking as "a member of the party, and not as a party leader."

Practical Problem Preventing Use of Atom Engine Now

Druidridge told a meeting of naval architects and engineers it will be "many years" before a nuclear furnace is built to produce enough heat to convert into mechanical energy. A material with which to build the furnace is lacking, he said. Steel absorbs too many neutrons needed to keep the nuclear fire going. In addition, the furnace needs a heavy concrete and lead shield to protect bystanders. "When something goes wrong, you'll just have to throw the furnace away and get a new one," he said. 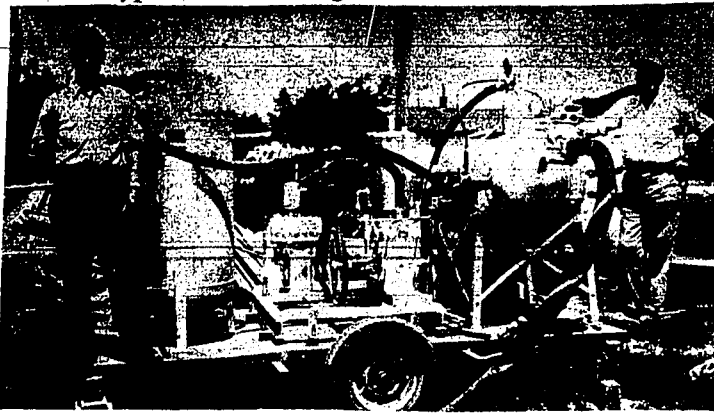

### Local Man Schedules Use for Portable Vacuum Gold Dredge

A portable vacuum gold dredge, the only one of its kind in existence, has been leased by a Twin Falls man for use in recovering gold from mining property near Leesburg in the Salmon district.

Ralph Scheerer plans to use the dredge on leased property, the Leesburg-Tacoma placer group, four miles southwest of Leesburg. The dredge is owned by Don East and John Kane, Los Angeles. Kane brought the machine here.

The dredge—originally, was built as a demonstration model. It is the smallest and only portable one of five models.

Most pumps used in gold dredging are the suction type, Kane said. This machine is a vacuum type and is twice as effective, he added. It is being used in Idaho for the first time. In addition to actually working the claim, it will serve to determine the composition of the ground.

Work on the dredge started in 1921 and several patents have been taken out. The principle on which it operates is the use of vacuum suction rather than water to pick up gold-bearing soil and water.

Capacity of the machine is one-eighth of a cubic yard per minute. The largest has a capacity of a yard a minute. Although the dredge can be built anywhere with standard parts, Kane warned that parts are expensive.

Cost of operating the dredge is \$1 a day including gasoline and oil, he said. It will pick up gold without gangue and is more selective.
