Cattle Disease Outbreak May Move up Line

WASHINGTON, May 18 (AP)—Agriculture officials said today the disease outbreak of foot-and-mouth disease in Mexico may require moving the quarantine line closer to the U. S. border.

The highly contagious cattle disease is a threat to this country's meat and milk supply.

The latest outbreak occurred among some 70 head of cattle at a point just one-fourth of a mile south of the masonry quarantine line and 300 miles northwest of the border.

The cattle have been slaughtered.

The U. S. Mexican commission, also directing the fight against the disease has sought to keep a fairly wide "buffer zone" between the infected area, and the quarantine line.

The United States has barred all shipments of cattle from Mexico since December, 1947, when the disease broke out in central Mexico. The disease kills man and other cattle, swine, goats and sheep. There is no cure preventive. The herd in which the new outbreak occurred had previously been vaccinated.

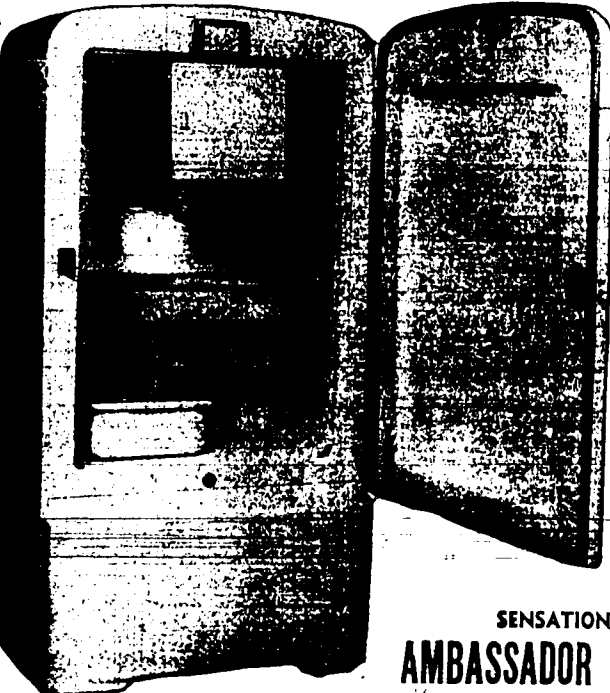

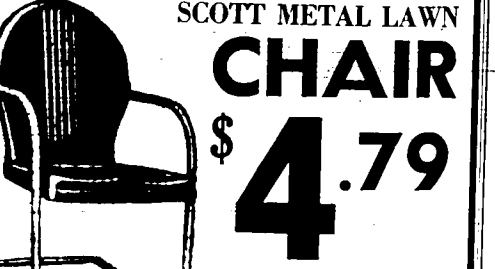

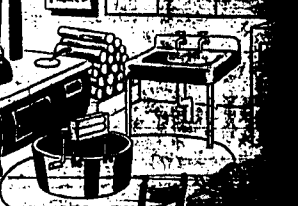

French Envoy Lauds Airlift As Life Saver

SPOKANE, May 18 (AP)—A French diplomat credited the Berlin airlift today with a large part in checking the rise of communism in western Europe.

Council Jean Vuau de Lagarde, French consul general at San Francisco, said the flight of supplies over the Russian land blockade made a "remarkable impression" on the German people.

The consul is traveling through the northwest to thank the American people for their help in France during and after the war.

"The airlift was a life-saver in many ways," de Lagarde said. "But probably the biggest value was the morale boost to the people of Germany and western Europe."

The consul praised the Atlantic pact and the Marshall plan. He said the pact had raised production in some French industries above pre-war levels and generally had a "wonderful effect on the French economy."

Saturday, the consul will present Arthur B. Langbein with an all-French certificate of appreciation of other states showing appreciation of the French for American aid.

Jail Term Given Man for Illegal Use of Potatoes

SUPERIOR, Wis., May 18—Arthur Wise, Hawthorne, Wis., farmer, has been sentenced by Judge Patrick T. Stone in federal court here to six months in prison for illegal sale of potatoes obtained from a commodity credit corporation for livestock feed.

Wise pleaded guilty to an indictment charging sale of 3,600 pounds of potatoes purchased for 25 cents per hundred-weight for use as cattle feed. The government charged he sold the potatoes at 42 per 100-pound sack to stores and restaurants here.

Under the provisions of the purpose "commodity" law, potatoes and for animal feed remain the property of the federal government until they are consumed as stock feed. The U. S. department of agriculture has sold a large quantity of potatoes acquired under the price support program for livestock feed.

The indictment against Wise was based on evidence obtained by agents of the Chicago field office of the compliance and investigation branch of the production and marketing administration, USDA.

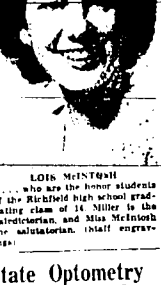
Court Dismisses Simplot Action

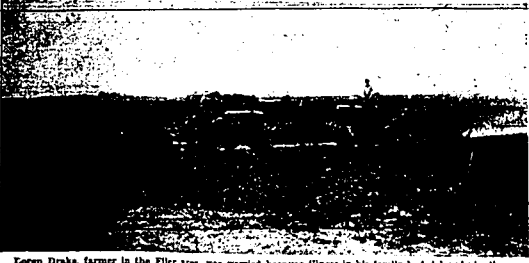

Solon Boosts Special Trick To Hold Debt

WASHINGTON, May 18 (U.S.—) An influential Democratic tax expert proposed a plan for balancing the 1950 budget without increasing taxes or cutting government spending materially. The trick to the plan, sponsored by Rep. Wilbur D. Mills, D., Ark., would be to require corporations, estates, trusts and non-resident aliens to pay all of their taxes within six months after the end of their taxable year. At present, they are allowed 12 months.

World Swell Coffers Mills said the effect would be to swell Uncle Sam's coffers by about \$1,000,000,000 in the first six months of 1950. The catch to the plan is that it would provide no long-range solution to the government's spending-versus-revenue problem. It simply would move forward by six months the date on which all corporations and other similar taxes are due and would put the government in a better financial condition for the next year or two. No Later Effects Beyond fiscal 1951 and 1952, the Mills plan would have no effect one way or the other. It is a device for pulling the government out of a financial hole for a relatively short period. A parallel effect would be to put corporations on a more nearly current basis in their tax payments. Mills is a top-ranking member of the tax-drafting house ways and means committee. The Mills plan has the tacit approval of Ways and Means Chairman John W. Snyder. Snyder thus far has expressed no opinion on it.
