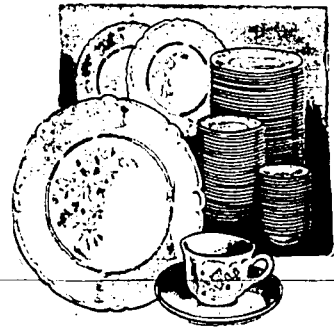

### Gooding Firm Bids Low for Patrol's Autos

BOISE, May 25 (AP)—The state purchasing department has bought \$2,471.65 in new motor vehicle equipment including 36 automobiles for the Idaho state police force. Leo Rice Motor company, Gooding, was awarded a contract to provide 36 new state police cars at \$141.81 each. Thirty-two of the old patrol cars were traded in at \$102.61 each. ### VFW Readies 'Jubilee' Sale For Saturday

The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States was the first veterans organization to promote a nationally organized campaign for the distribution of poppies made by disabled and needy veterans.

Paul Dauven, commander of local post No. 2135 said in announcing that the 1948 "golden jubilee" buddy poppy sale of the VFW will be held in Twin Falls Saturday.

"The idea of offering buddy poppies to the American public once a year to support a vital veteran welfare program," Commander Dauven said.

In 1923, Gen. Frank T. Hines, director of the U. S. veterans bureau, endorsed the plan. The VFW sponsored a workshop in Pittsburgh, Pa., where disabled veterans were employed to make buddy poppies. It was there that the term, "buddy poppy" originated among the veterans.

The following year the name was registered with the U. S. patent office. The patent guarantees that all buddy poppies are genuine products of the work of disabled and needy veterans and that no other organization, firm or individual can make legal use of the name, "buddy poppy."

"Later," Commander Dauven continued, "the VFW state department was authorized to have disabled veterans make the buddy poppies in local hospitals. This same duty under the strict supervision and accounting of the national organization.

Commander Dauven urged all citizens of Twin Falls to support the buddy poppy sale Saturday to aid the overseas organization to put into effect its slogan of "honoring the dead by helping the living."

### Only Surviving Beetle Colony Is Located on Camas Prairie

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, May 25—At the end of the first round of the University of Idaho's attempt to get rid of the St. John's beetle started in Idaho the outlook isn't so good. Three of the four colonies planted last year have been found. Only one appears to have made a start in establishing itself.

That is the nine-toon-cheerful report from W. F. Barr and Clarence I. Peck of the university's agricultural experiment station. Barr is assistant entomologist and Peck is in charge of research on the control of insects.

Two of the colonies which didn't take hold were planted in the bottom of the Clearwater canyon. The third colony was planted near the canyon rim.

The one colony which has shown signs of becoming established is "Camas" on the Camas prairie. That is all the information Barr will divulge on its location.

There is good reason for this secrecy," he explains. "Publicity in the press has done more to help the beetle than to help the control. The beetles must not be discovered. In California, curious and well-intentioned visitors did a lot of damage to colonies by their tampering.

Because the St. John's beetle has given such effective control of good seed in California and Australia the Idaho experiment station last year made four test plantings. Beetles were provided by the department of agriculture, Albany, Calif.

In 1947 the St. John's beetle was planted in the Clearwater canyon in fact this is color depending on the species. What makes the beetles at the prairie is that they are the only plantings which will still survive rather than die and be buried.

And the Ohio lawmaker reiterated his prediction that Congress will kill the administration measure and pass his substitute instead.

Hilda Good Palma, Republican substitute, sponsored also by the Republican Senators Donnell, McCarty, and Smith, New Jersey, would make more than a score of changes in the T-H law, but retain what Taft calls "the best features" of that law.

Taft told reporters he is presenting the Democratic leadership to get Senate debate as soon as possible.

There he forecast that any new labor legislation passed by the house and Senate will add up to substantially the provisions of his substitute measure.

Besides providing the Taft-Hartley law, the administration bill provides for restoring the old Wagner act with a few amendments.

The house already has put the repeal bill on the shelf once during this session.

**AFL Chief Avers Taft No. 1 Target**  
ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., May 26 (AP)—AFL President William Green said U. S. Sen. Robert A. Taft, R. O., is the No. 1 target for defeat in the 1950 elections.

The state department has insisted that the return of these vessels—28 frigates and three icebreakers—is not part of the lend-lease negotiations and that they should be sent back at once.

Russia is the only country that received sizable quantities of lend-lease material from the United States, Britain and France united in 1942.

### U. S. Seeking Unity Against China's Reds

WASHINGTON, May 28 (AP)—The United States is urging all other nations with direct interests in the far east to agree on a common policy toward the communist government in China—and to avoid granting recognition hastily.

Such a move has been held in Washington and in the capitals of the other countries involved which include Britain, France, the Netherlands, Belgium, Siam, India, New Zealand and Australia.

State department officials gave no word—confirmation—that discussions are underway with all these nations. But indications were that the chief concern of American leaders is that Britain and the United States should stick together on this issue. They wish to maintain a solid Anglo-American front toward communism in the far east as well as in Europe.

There has been considerable concern here that the British are much more anxious to establish close working relations with a red government in China than are the Americans. This difference in attitude is reportedly attributed to the greater British business interests in the area, including the immense amounts of opium wealth at Hong Kong.

Keeping informed. A state department official should say only that "in any situation it is natural that the powers having a common interest should talk together and we have held these talks on the China situation but there have been no agreements and naturally we are keeping each other informed."

In Paris, an American diplomat told the Associated Press the state department has sent notes about China to more than a dozen leading nations. This informant said the move was touched off in part by recent reports that China was planning to visit the Chinese Reds as well as the former government for all China.
