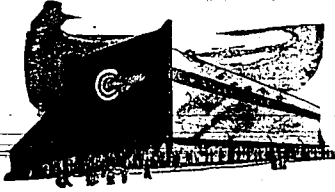

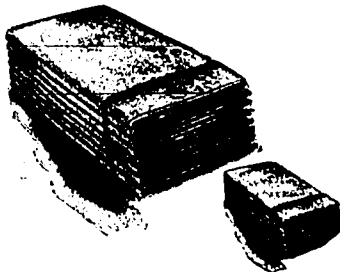

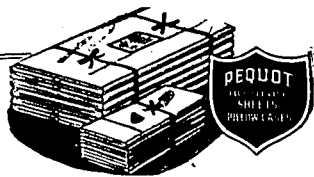

**Regular Army Has Openings For Ex-Brass**

Permanent careers as officers in the regular army are still available to qualified wartime officers of the army, according to Sgt. 1/16 Ernest A. Koss, Twin Falls army recruiter. For the first time in its history the army is offering direct regular commissions to former officers of other services under the new program, one of several projects aimed to build up its officer staff to full strength. Deadline for applications is June 30.

The direct commissions are open to veterans with one year of commissioned service between Dec. 7, 1941, and Sept. 3, 1946, in any of the major services, equivalent duty with the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey or with the coast guard and geodetic survey service under specified military authorities. Commission during the war.

New limits are 21 to 27 years, although credit allowed for active duty in wartime and since Dec. 31, 1947, will in some cases permit acceptance. Candidates must have received a grade of 10 or better on the examination of applicants up to 30 years of age, bachelor's degree from an authorized university or college by June 30, 1948, although a waiver will be considered for non-graduates who have completed 120 or more semester hours.

Sergeant Koss emphasized that the procurement plan is in addition to the opportunity for regular commissions after a successful application to direct commissions to distinguished military graduates of the senior director, reserve officers training corps.

Application forms and more detailed information may be obtained from the local recruiting station, unitary ROTC units, national guard senior instructors and ORC units.
