Inventor Opines Needs, Observations "Inspire"

"Needs and observations are the inspiration for inventions," says Major Glenn, inventor of a knockdown chair. He has traveled the national park service for the past 23 years, spending his spare time with his inventions which have proved useful and practical.

Glenn began inventing things about 23 years ago as a hobby. His first invention was a choker and bull hook for logging. This was followed by a saw plow with combined blade and rotary, a thermoplastic fabric which adjusts the temperature and flow of water, and shoe chains which prevent falls on slippery pavement.

The shoe chains were invented by Glenn before the war and 1,000 were sold to the army for use in the mountains. He has been unable to get the necessary materials to produce them since the war.

Glenn always has trouble getting his brain-children marketed. He said "I am not discouraged, though after all it took 23 years to convince people that appears as practical things."

Glenn, a native of Blackfoot, was the first Idahoan to go overseas with the military government. He was the army for more than two years and served for 18 months in Europe. 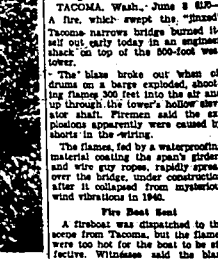

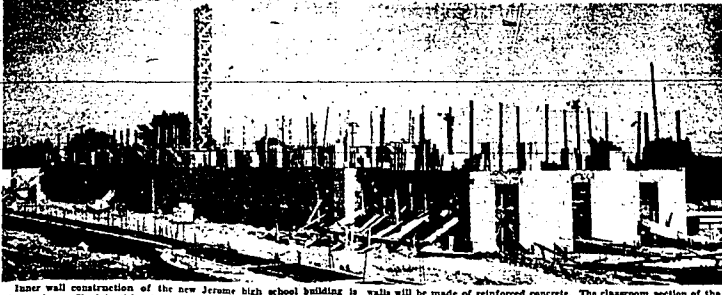
