WENDELL, June 10.—Clarence Hulet, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Hulet, has just returned here after spending the past 30 months on a mission to the Samoan Islands for the LDS church.
For 17 months he served as district president in two different districts of the Samoan mission. At the end of his term on June 10, 1948, he was in charge of the village of "Mapone" with his duties including those of mayor, lawyer, teacher and missionary to the people of the town.
It was soon after the war that Hulet received his call to serve on a mission and the Samoan mission, he laid the foundation to a speech which he made at the time.

SEATTLE, June 10.—A woman's intuition was perfectly right today as she faced a holdup man across a bank counter at the central branch of the National Bank of Commerce.
Mrs. Rita M. Smith, a teller, calmly stalled. She kept her foot pressed on a burglar alarm. As the man, later identified as W. H. Brundage, 53-year-old railroad switchman, impatiently demanded that she hand over money, he was captured in a few minutes in a nearby department store.

The note which he had handed her, ordering her to fill two envelopes with bills, was found on him and later he signed a confession at the police station. Detective Sgt. C. A. O'Brien reported he admitted having served seven years for a bank robbery at Gilman, Minn., in 1928, the officer said.

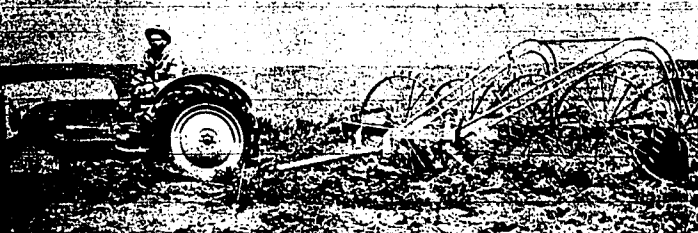

First Deep Well Near Albion Is Irrigating Once-Arid Land

By VIC REEDMAN

ALBION, June 10—Residents of the Albion valley are watching with interest the development of 180 acres of once-arid sagebrush land one-half mile southeast of this village.

The land was purchased last year by M. A. Kempton and a well was drilled last winter by Loren Paige, Murtaugh, to a depth of 300 feet. One mile of power lines was constructed by the rural electrification administration after tests showed the well water is capable of supplying 90 or more inches of water.

The water is lifted from a depth of 115 feet by a 30-horsepower electric motor. The well is located on a slight rise which allows gravity flow to all parts of the quarter section.

About 80 acres are planned to be fertilized next spring, and all acres to seed alfalfa. The remainder of the land will be cleared this summer and will be cultivated next season.

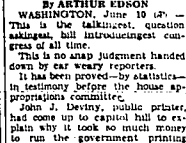

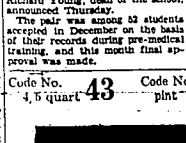

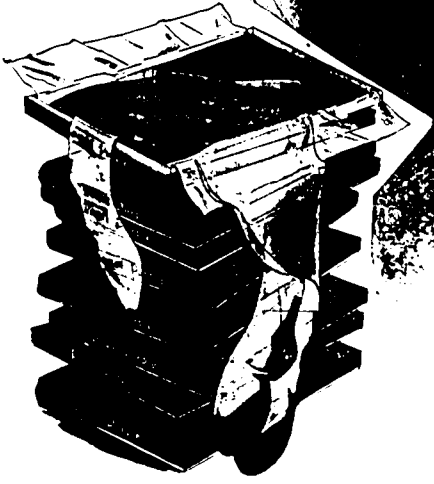
