Hereford Bull Sale Planned For Cattlemen

Idaho Cattleman's association will hold a hereford bull sale at Weiser on Dec. 3, according to J. H. Nettleton, secretary of the association. This will be the first association-sponsored sale ever held in Weiser and is being held to bring top quality purebred bulls raised by responsible Idaho breeders to one location for the convenience of range cattlemen in selecting their breeding stock.

The Washington County Cattleman's association will sponsor a banquet and dance after the sale, according to Chester Thorsen, Weiser, president of the county association.

Walter Schodde, Burley, chairman of the association bull committee, will be assisted by Carl Lehn, Ashton; J. O. Mayfield, Lida; Harmon, Fairfield; James Chaney, Gannett; Albert Wolfelt, Meridian; Virgil Litcher, Jerome, and Seth Burstedt, Challis.

All bulls entered in the sale must be registered and 14 months old by Nov. 1. All consignors must have raised the animals they are entering in the sale and must guarantee them to the buyers. The sale association also guarantees all animals being sold at the sale, Nettleton said.

All animals entered in the sale will be judged by competent judges into A, B and C classifications and any animals below C grade will be rejected. If rejected animals are sold, no registration papers will accompany the animal, Nettleton said.

Col. E. O. Walker, Fair, noted purebred auctioneer, will sell the 75 to 100 outstanding entries.

In addition to the sale at Weiser, the Idaho Cattleman's association will hold its 10th annual furture and sale at Twin Falls with Angus, cattle selling Oct. 21 and Herefords and Shorthorns on Oct. 22. Purebred breeders wishing to enter their entries were requested to write the Idaho Cattleman's association, room 211 Continental Bank building, Boise.

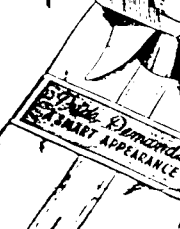

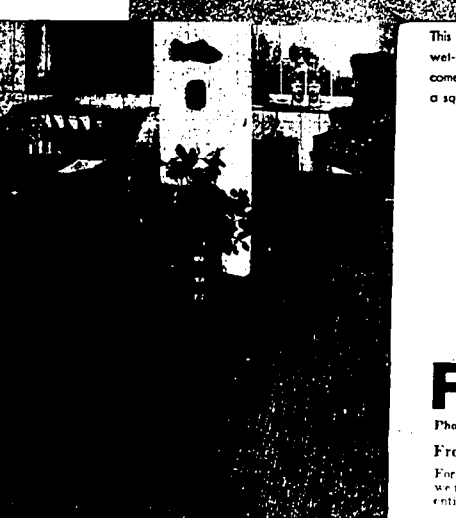
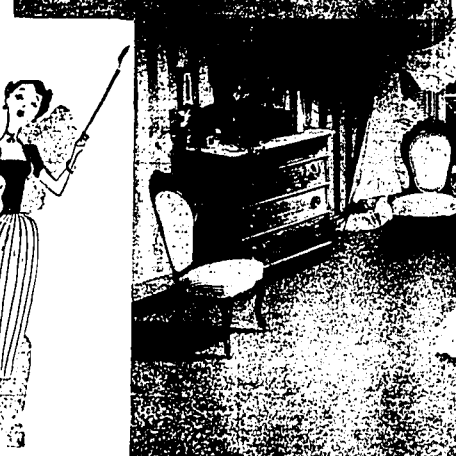
