Wendell Plant Ready to Start First Step of Production Now

WENDELL, June 21—Only a year ago ground was broken for the start of construction, the new million-dollar Gates Bros., Inc. triple superphosphate fertilizer plant will start its first step of production early next week with the making of phosphoric acid, President Charles T. Gates announced Tuesday.

Output of Gen State Phosphate fertilizer will follow the start of acid production within 60 to 90 days, Gates said. Sulphuric acid, which is required in the manufacture process of phosphoric acid as well as fertilizer, already has arrived at the new plant and three tank cars of the sulphuric liquid were pumped into the huge 150,000-gallon storage tank over the week-end.

The three tank cars were the first shipment to be received under a contract signed by Gates brothers for sulphuric acid requirements. "We're elated at the rapid progress being made at the plant," the Wendell man declared. "In spite of 10 weeks shutdown during the severe winter, we are able to start making phosphoric acid several weeks ahead of schedule. And we will be in production with the triple superphosphate later this summer. The growing new plant is taking shape on a 140-acre tract southeast of Wendell that just a year ago was nothing more than a rough-surfaced field.

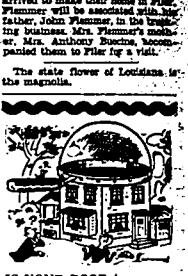

Bills Vital for West Awaiting Solons' Action

 WASHINGTON, June 21 (AP)—With the end of the present congress only two weeks away, considerable legislation of prime interest to the west is still hanging fire.

Highest priority in the minds of western congressmen is the interior department's appropriation bill with its budget for reclamation, the bureau of mines, administration of public lands, land management, etc. Congress won't recess without passing this and other major appropriation bills, but there are a score of measures of other types that are labeled "must" by some western congressmen.

Mining Bills
 Among these are bills to strengthen the mining industry. The recent slide in metal prices has enhanced the importance of these to western states. A bill by Representative Engle, D. Calif., to subsidize production from high cost mines is before the house rules committee, where similar legislation has died in two previous sessions.

Senator O'Mahoney, W. Wyo., the two Arizona senators and Senator Maitor, R. Nev. last week introduced a bill to stimulate production and exploration by means of government contracts, but its passage is regarded by the administration with less objection than the subsidy plan.

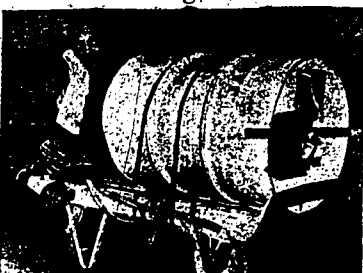
Copper Duty Sought
 Pressure also is on to reduce the import duty on foreign copper. Congressmen from many western states are anxious to work out a reclamation program for the Indians. Much attention has been given the long range plan for the Navajo of New Mexico, Arizona and Utah. A bill has been reported favorably to the house.

Several members have water problems they regard as critical and there is keen interest in Columbia valley legislation and in the new program for agriculture.

Farm People Easing Work; Survey Finds

WASHINGTON, June 21 (AP)—Farm families are taking life easier this year and getting more hired hands to do the work.

A count just completed by the Bureau of Agricultural Economics showed 56,000 more hired hands on farms in May than there were a year previously.

It also showed 311,000 fewer members of farmers' families were at work.

More machines are suggested. For one thing, there are more machines on farms than ever before and machines produce larger crops with less labor. Second, the world food situation is easing. There isn't the pressure on the farmers to produce that there was during the war.

This census showed farm people are working slightly shorter hours than they did last year. But the farm owners themselves still work longer than the hired hands do.

Average 2 1/2 Hours
 The report says that the employees are working on the average 2 1/2 hours a day. Last year they put in 2 3/4 hours.

But the farm operators themselves are working 11 1/2 hours a day—about 12 minutes less than the year before.
