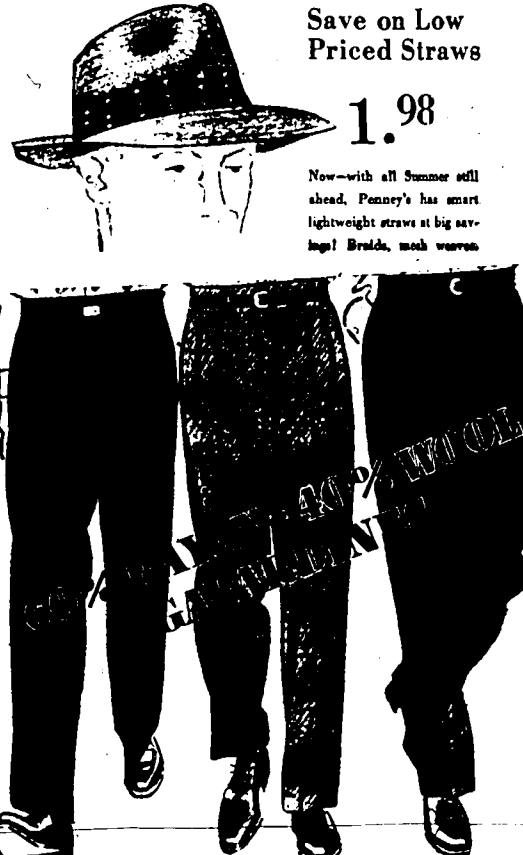

Price Support Program Used To Sell Spuds

BOISE, June 23—Twenty-one bushels of Idaho's surplus potatoes was marketed through the government price support program—the smallest percentage of major food producing states.

C. O. Rice, dealer service representative for Idaho's potato commission, said \$200,000 bushels of Idaho potatoes were sold to the government.

He pointed out that in Maine government purchases amounted to 81 per cent of the surplus production of the crop bought by the government in other states included New Jersey, 22 per cent; Washington, 48 per cent; South Dakota, 27 per cent; and North Dakota, 30 per cent.

Washington's surplus of 148,000 bushels was the largest in history. Total shipments reached 45,000 cars, which is the equivalent of 44,000 regular cars.

Idaho farmers sold nearly 54,000 bushels of surplus potatoes. Similar quantities without government help. Rice said Maine sold just two and a quarter million bushels through trade channels despite the fact that its total production was 30,000 bushels.

Traffic Expert Raps Cable Cars; He's Off His Trolley, San Franciscans Aver

SAN FRANCISCO, (UPI)—The traffic expert who rapped cable cars as a menace to San Francisco's traffic last year, has been off his trolley in San Francisco.

Arthur C. Jenkin, consulting engineer who revamped the Los Angeles mass transportation lines, branded the cable cars "antiquated and a nuisance."

"The only value of the cable cars in the present world of mass passenger transportation," he declared, "is for museum purposes. They would serve well as a model line to Golden Gate park, or for a block to Cotuit tower, as a means of preserving a remnant of the old mode of transportation. The city street of San Francisco, however, has no place for a museum piece."

The cable cars, he said, were designed for an era when only other traffic vehicles were horse-drawn, and now are "the last word in lack of safety devices."

Anticipating the protests of sentimentalists who succeeded in writing a clause into the city charter that the cable cars must be preserved, Jenkin declared there was "no more logical reason to keep the cable cars in regular service than to operate the penny express as a historic link."

The transit report roused the defenders of the little "dinkies" by phone and mail, they bombarded city hall.

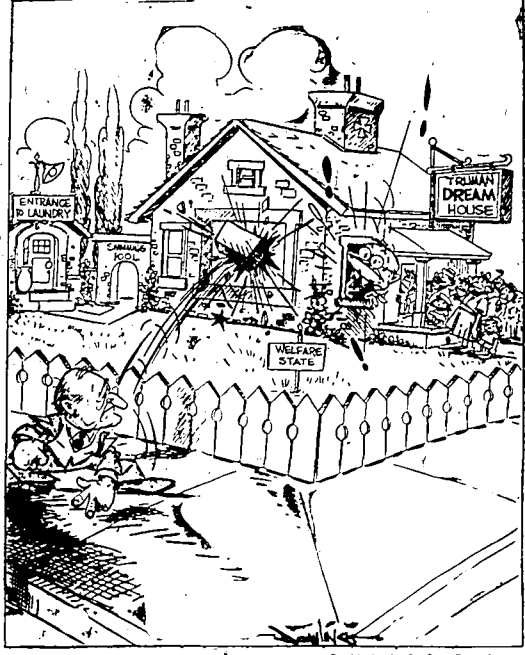

Russ Refusal Halts Plea to Stop Walkout

BERLIN, June 23 (AP)—Russia refused today to move supply trains from western Germany into western Berlin despite an offer by railway strikers to handle them.

The Soviet-based railway administration said the strikers' offer was "an encroachment of the operation rights of the railway."

The statement was taken to mean that Russia, which controls the railways serving Berlin under a four-power agreement, has no intention of permitting trains from west Germany to enter Berlin until the strike is a whole end.

Altogether 15,000 non-communist western Berlin railway workers are on strike. Their 34-day-old walkout not only has given the Russians an excuse to resume their railway blockade on Berlin, but has halted all service on Berlin's elevated railways.

Union leaders said strikers would unload some 600 freight cars brought into Berlin in the early days of the strike before the Russians decided to suspend traffic from western Germany.

It was estimated that some 40 or more freight trains loaded with supplies for Berlin are stranded in the Soviet occupation zone between western Germany and this city. The Russians have refused to let their locomotives haul trains here as long as the strike continues.

Biggest Bolt Shot By GE Scientists

WITTINGTON, Mass., June 23 (AP)—General Electric scientists shot a 15,000,000-volt bolt of lightning—the most powerful ever created by man—across a 50-foot gap here today.

The demonstration, conducted by Julius H. Hagenson, engineer in charge, was given at the official opening of the company's new high voltage engineering laboratory.

The discharge bridged the gap between two huge generators in the large demonstration hall of the laboratory.

McCloy Quit Cozy Job to Get Headache, Blames 'Curiosity'

By DOUGLAS LARSEN
 WASHINGTON (NPA)—When a man quits a cozy job that pays \$30,000 a year, tax free, to take a man's job at less than half the pay, taxed, it's enough to make you think he's either balmy or has a powerful ulterior motive.

Such a man is bold, sticky and affable to J. J. McCloy, who gave up the graceful existence as president of the world bank to shoulder the job of director of the Federal Reserve Bank in Washington. McCloy's headaches in Germany.

But McCloy, a vigorous man of 57 who loves tennis and fishes as hard as he works, is neither balmy nor does he have an ulterior motive. According to his friends who tried to talk him out of the change, it's his "blasted super-curiosity." The friend explains it this way: "When a problem or job intrigues John McCloy, it's like a powerful magnet pulling a steel needle. For him it is a basic force he can't resist. He's got a penetrating, analytical mind that keeps him awake at night unless he gives it plenty of hard work during the day. The Berlin situation has always fascinated him and he has been following it as closely as though he had been part of it. Now that he's really 'in it,' I hope he's satisfied. And I figure that he is."

McCloy brings plenty of savvy and experience to his new job. He and his wife both speak German fluently. His first picked up the language while serving as an officer with the occupation forces in Germany after World War I in Cologne. Mrs. McCloy learned it during the many years they spent in Europe in the 20s, while he was representing the Bethlehem steel company in the famous Black Tom case.

After 10 years of brilliant work in the steel industry, he finally won victory for his client by proving German espionage responsible for the explosion of a shipload of ammunition in the New York harbor in 1916. The case involved \$200,000 settlement.

McCloy's cool navigating through the morass of intrigue and counter-espionage that surrounded the Black Tom case won the admiration of Henry L. Stimson, secretary of state while most of it was going on. When Stimson became secretary of war in 1940, with specific instructions to bolster America's counter-espionage activities, he called on McCloy to help him. This amazing world of ours is changing so rapidly in its way of life that it's difficult for some of us old-timers to keep up with trends. It's no problem for the youngsters since they never have known anything else, but their hunch-and-bustle elders don't so easily readjust themselves to the ideological, social and political upheaval of the atomic age.

That's rather a pity, for we are in the midst of a global renaissance which exceeds anything since which folk who fall out of line are likely to get stepped on.

Caused by Marriage
You will, I trust, overlook this momentary outbreak. What inspired it was the marriage extraordinary of the German princess Cecilia of Hohenzollern to Prince Harry, a good-looking former American army officer from Amarillo, Tex.

The princess is, of course, the granddaughter of the late Kaiser Wilhelm (the all-highest and is a direct descendant of England's immortal Queen Victoria. The wedding took place Tuesday amidst the splendor of the Hohenzollern castle, with many notabilities, including royalty, present.

Unfathomable
Imagine the Kaiser's granddaughter marrying a commoner! When I was a young fellow in the hey-day of the all highest—"did they have ice-cream when you were a little boy, daddy?"—such a marriage would have been unthinkable, at least to the emperor and his court.

Throughout that fateful conflict the Germans glorified the Kaiser. Finally came the German collapse, the revolution, and the forced abdication of the Kaiser. Thus disappeared one of the greatest thrones of history, to be followed by the rolling of crowns in many other countries.

The rest of the German royal family, including little Willie, the crown prince, retired to private life and since then have lived quietly. Gradually they have been adapting themselves to the new world which has followed the Kaiser's war. Tuesday's wedding indicated how well they have succeeded.

Married for Love
The blond princess, Cecilia is a charming woman of 31 who has married for love—with the smiling approval of her royal father-in-law. And will the newweds live in a castle in Germany? Not on your castle in Germany! No, they will be back to Amarillo where he is an insurance decorator. There they will build themselves a home, even as you and I.

Yes, our world certainly is changing. Are we in step?

Quarter-Mile Shift Seen in Hill's Travel

MOSCOW, June 22 (AP)—L. D. Nixon's moving mountain near Cambridge may wind up a quarter of a mile from where it started.

So says Dr. Vernon Scheid, head of the University of Idaho's geology department who went to the central Idaho area over the week-end and a frantic call for help.

Dr. Scheid advised Nixon and his family to move off their ranch at the base of the mountain 2 1/2 miles west of Cambridge. He explained that water from an irrigation canal along the lower part of the central Idaho had seeped down to the "slide plane," acting as a lubricant for the mountain above.

He added there is a "distinct possibility" the mountain may move a quarter of a mile over toward the Snake river. It already has moved about 50 feet, leaving deep, circular cracks in the soil.

Dr. Scheid said he checked out the movement, he related on his return here, and found that in an hour the hill had traveled about a quarter of an inch.

The conclusion, he said, measures about a quarter mile wide and half a mile long.

WASHINGTON (NEA)—Vice President Alben W. Barkley is now the most successful man in town. At the age of 71 he set a new record by being the oldest man ever to be sworn into the job. But you'd never guess he held the age title in view of the records he's been setting since.

There are no official figures, but experts agree that in the few months he has been in office Barkley has probably crowned more beauty queens, awarded more medals to the lower part of the country, photographed with more movie stars and been guest of honor at more affairs than any previous V. P. in a full term.

His unflinching good nature and ally will have made him the town's favorite guest.

He averages between 40 and 50 invitations a day to attend private parties and dinners, and he gets almost that many requests to appear at public functions. He accepts as many of these demands on his time as he is able to, but insists on keeping a few evenings a week free for some quiet reading in his modest Connecticut avenue apartment.

Barkley has added new meaning to the tradition of a capital office without being announced. It's a hangout for both Republican and Democratic members, as well as being the clearing house for good jobs.

Barkley also manages to more than make good on his promise to be the most popular man in town. He is considered one of the best parliamentarians who ever presided over the vice president's body. Thanks to his many years as a senator and a scholarly interest in the subject.

His office, just behind the main senate chamber, is furnished with a fantastically valuable piece of art and antiques. His desk is a tremendous affair which came from the White House and was once used by Theodore Roosevelt and Woodrow Wilson. Above his head hangs a tremendous cut glass chandelier which was made in France for the White House. Theodore Roosevelt gave it to the capital because he said the linking caused by drafts in the White House made him nervous.

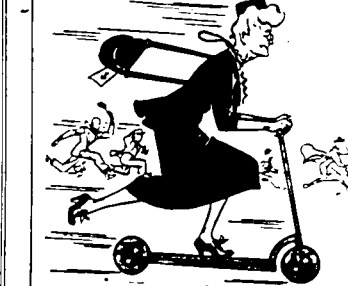

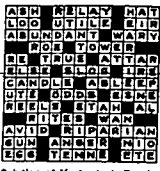

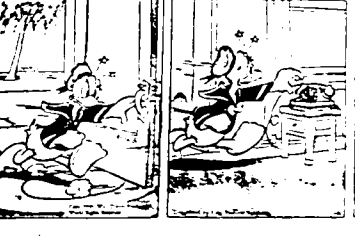

YAKIMA, June 23 (AP)—Delegates from northwest Indian tribes passed resolutions requesting government action on several Indian problems before closing the three-day conference of affiliated northwest Indian tribes here. The tribesmen put their signatures to a treaty of peace, friendship and mutual assistance, the first such alliance of northwest Indians in history. The Indian delegates were outspoken in their denunciation of preservation liquidation. In a resolution passed today, the Indians said 'reservations are lands reserved for use by Indians and we want them to be reserved for use by Indians ...'
