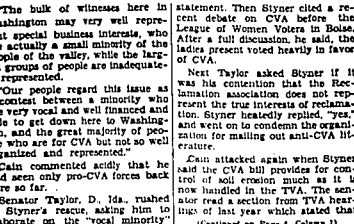

Secret Foes Peril Army Reform Bill

WASHINGTON, June 25 (AP)—The citizens committee for the Hoover report today blamed strong "secret enemies" for the house armed services committee's delaying action on military reform.

The citizens group charged that "powerful forces are plainly engaged in a vast ditch effort" to defeat the Rydings bill designed to complete unification of the military establishment. The measure, heralded by a billion-dollar-a-year savings, was approved unanimously by the senate May 26. Three weeks later house hearings were announced, to begin on June 28.

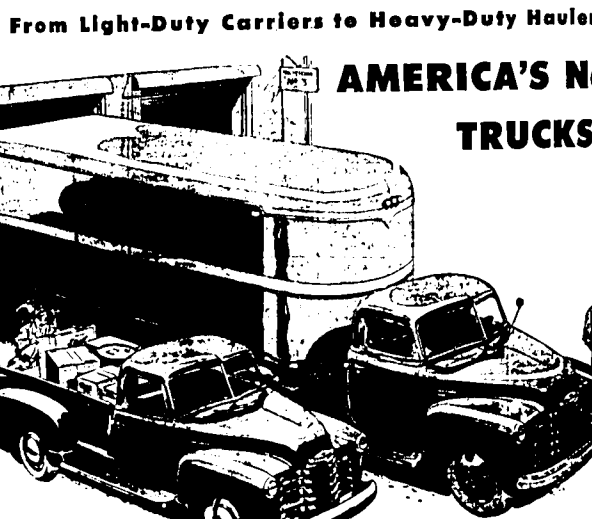

BAILEY, June 23—Effective next Friday a service fee will be charged people using facilities of the Redfish point camp on Big Redfish lake in the Sawtooth national forest, Forest Supervisor F. H. Moore announced Saturday.

Moore said the camp is one of 20 national forests in southern Idaho, Nevada, Utah and western Wyoming and has headquarters in Ogden, Moore explained.

Aids to Expenses

The park service is making the experimental charges at the suggestion of the budget bureau and congress to aid in defraying expense of maintaining the picnic and campsites. If the experiment proves successful, it may be extended to other improved locations.

Offerings Are Accepted for African Work

Offerings to build a hospital in Eastwood, South Africa, were received in the Seventh-Day Adventist Church Saturday.

The government and other agencies there have called upon the church to establish the hospital in an area where there are 25,000 people without hospital facilities. The 17,000 North American churches have agreed to adopt it as a project. Elder E. E. Collins, local pastor, said:

The new hospital is planned to include a dispensary for treatment of out-patients. The dispensary and 27 beds of out-patients, as well as two lever clinics (with 100 beds each), are being built under construction and others are planned. The church has 110,000 members in South Africa.

Nursing classes for native girls and home-making and nutrition classes are being organized. The church is also sponsoring a school for the children—deserted by the lack of training in "mothercraft," he said. "In May, 1949, for instance, more than 200 children died of diphtheria within walking distance of the hospital site.

"Our missionaries tell us that there has been a series of ritual murders in this area, and our hospital will war against such practices and taboos which are practiced by many of its witch-bound millions," Elder Collins concluded.

Taylor, Robins Have Dispute At Washington CVA Hearing

WASHINGTON, June 25 (Special)—Idaho's Republican governor, C. A. Robins and the state's senior senator, Glen Taylor, crossed swords in Friday's hearings on the controversial Columbia valley bill before the powerful senate public works committee.

Governor Robins testified, "the people of Idaho are overwhelmingly opposed to the creation of a CVA." Taylor objected, saying that the governor had no proof of this.

Robins called attention to the fact that "33 papers throughout the state had editorially opposed the creation of any valley authority."

Taylor responded that the Idaho power company might have influenced this opinion because the company buys advertising space in these papers.

Utah Sen. Arthur Watkins, a member of the committee, refused this, pointing out that in his personal experience rural newspapers were among the most "independent enterprises" in America.

Taylor necked Robins how he felt about the government's building electrical transmission lines. The governor said he thought the government should sell electric power "at the bus bar."

Another high point in the hearing was Idaho's chief executive testifying that the state feared becoming subservient to a bureaucratic machine, losing its water rights and the concentration of vast power in a "board of three men not elected by or responsible to the people of the area."

Governor Robins flew to Washington directly from the recent governor's conference in Colorado and is planning to return immediately to

Senator Backing 'Overall' Agency For River Basin

WASHINGTON, June 25 (Special)—Sen. Dennis Chavez, chairman of the public works committee conducting busy hearings here this week on a bill to set up a Columbia valley administration, said he is in favor of "some kind of overall authority."

His comments came as a surprise to many who felt the bill had favored the anti-CVA stand of the arm engineers. This agency has exerted considerable pressure on the New Mexico to oppose the legislation.

One of the most thrilling episodes he has related concerns the uprising of a band of Indians which had to be quelled by U. S. cavalrymen. The battle probably only Dick Adamsen and the Carey school buildings now stand.

Yesterday I saw Harvey Smith coming out of the "drug store" with two boxes. I put quotes around the words, drug store, because the drug store isn't the drug store any more. But likely it will retain that name always because the late C. K. Tulloch ran the establishment as a pharmacy for years and years. Pharmacy work seems to be a tradition in the Tulloch family. If the boys are working in that line in Twin Falls, they're Ralph and Harb Tulloch, both former residents of Carey.

On a clear morning it is a pleasure to stand outdoors and listen to the sounds of activity all about. Probably the most sharp of the sounds is the clang of milk cans being tossed around at the fruit plant as white-garbed men work systematically to process hundreds of gallons of milk. The Kraft plant and the two water reservoirs have not always been a part of the Carey picture. These were when the area was not so green nor the ranchers so prosperous.

Everyone is proud when they tell of the change made when the Little Wood river dam and the Fish creek dam were constructed. In the words of "Uncle Bill," those dams have "made Carey." Now the plan is to increase the storage supply in Wood river dam so the Fish creek reservoir.
