River Canyon Fall Takes Life of T. F. Boy When Hiking

A Twin Falls youth lost his life Sunday when he fell from rim rock on the north side of Snake river one-half mile below the Twin falls power plant into the canyon 70 feet below. He was Don Bell, 18, son of Mr. and Mrs. Rodney W. Bell, 124 Buchanan street. Bell was still alive but unconscious when sheriff's officers reached the body about 20 minutes after the fall. He died shortly thereafter.

Witnesses to the accident were Melvin Swenson, 17, 141 Blue Lakes boulevard north, Verna and Bob Ehardt, and Jim Condie, 152 Tyler, who had been climbing around the rocks with Bell. The party was ready to start back home when Bell slipped and fell. He was on a ledge to peer over and see if they could descend at that point.

Bell's companions told sheriff's officers the rock fell into the canyon and Bell was in a top-heavy position, plunged with it. The youths called sheriff's officers about 5:30 p.m. A Twin Falls physician later with them pronounced Bell dead. J. R. Wiley, Jerome county coroner, stated Monday that an inquest will be held.

The officers reached Bell about 5:30 p.m. and he was placed on a stretcher and carried to the hospital. He died about 8:30 p.m. The cause of death was asphyxia.

A small boat operated by Lad and Bob Dreyer was used to convey the stretcher. The boat was attached to both sides of the stream were used to enable the boat to take a sharp curve.

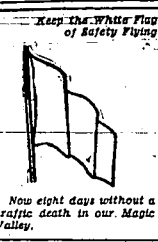

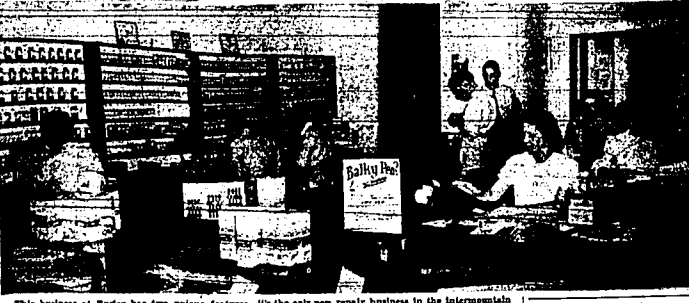

Novel Burley Business Hires Disabled Vets to Repair Pens

By CARILDA STEELSMITH
BURLEY, July 11—An unusual business here, a fountain pen and pencil "hospital," employs only disabled veterans of World War II for its male personnel. The business is starting its third year this month. The pen repair shop, which now handles approximately 3,000 pens per month, started almost through accident. The Saterstroms, Fred and Palmer, opened their "book store" in Burley in 1946. Soon within a short time they were confronted with the problem of getting pens and pencils repaired for their customers. When pens and pencils came in they were mailed to the respective manufacturers for repair, with the time of mailing and their return ranging from 10 to 12 weeks. Saterstrom thought there could be a quicker way to get the pens back to the customer and he gave the idea of stocking pen parts in Burley and doing their own repairs.

After contacting various pen companies on the idea, they were urged to try it, and on July 16, 1947, the first fountain pen underwent "major surgery" at the hands of Palmer Saterstrom. "I repaired all my own pens until October, 1947, when I found I needed a helper," Saterstrom said. "Gene came in from neighboring towns and I went to the store to get the pen parts. I then referred Bill Hunter, a veteran, to me and I went about buying out a 100 pen training schedule of 3,000 pens work in the United States. This is still the only pen repair program being used universally. "With Bill helping me, I found that the pen parts in Idaho towns were quite receptive to my idea of repairing pens and pencils throughout the state. This resulted in personal calls being sent in through the mail, and editing in personal calls to our agents on a commission basis with retail prices for the work identical with those of the pen factories. "The Saterstroms adopted the also pen pen parts in 'low shop overnight," and with this swift service, a steady increase in their pen and pencil made their way to the pen shop in June, 1944, another veteran, Ethel Bonner. Fred joined the staff, increasing it to three. An instructor was needed, so Karma Blak filled the job, also doing the book work and wrapping. Within a short time, the shop was established on the banks Bonner, a disabled veteran was also employed from American Falls, and in May, 1949, Gene Patterson, also disabled, from Twin Falls, was added to the staff. The need of a full-time bookkeeper and office manager was filled by the addition of Mrs. Mildred Brewster. A year ago Bill Hunter, the first repair man, was made pen service manager by confining the male employees to disabled veterans, the partnership has created national as well as

local fame. The shop is located in such a small town, Saterstrom said. "Location means everything, however, in that we are just about in the exact geographical center of our territory. Size of the town means nothing except that living conditions are much better here, prices of living accommodations are lower and rentals easier to secure, and also proximity to hunting and fishing grounds are a constant joy to the workers. "Many of our customers are amazed that there is such an industry located in such a small town, but when the manner in which the business was originated is explained they can readily see the advantage. Also, the public is ready to approve

of the manner in which we select our technicians, namely, the role of the disabled veterans of World War II. "This is a depression-proof business to a great extent," Saterstrom concluded, "in that it follows the lines of the shoemaker whose business always picks up when the pants hang thin. Repairing, rather than buy new shoes."

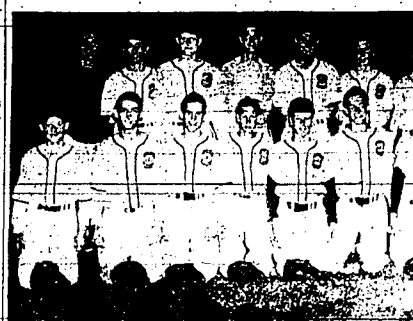

Farms Listed As Dangerous Places to Live

WASHINGTON, July 11 (AP)—A farm is just about the most dangerous place a family can live and work.

Safety experts have known this for a long time, and President Truman is trying to make farmers aware of the danger.

He has proclaimed the week of July 24 as national farm safety week.

About 15,000 farm accidents are killed each year in work and home accidents and in automobile mishaps on farm roads. Thousands of others are injured.

Mr. Truman has set up a farm safety committee. It is attempting to eliminate 300,000 farm accidents that range from head-butts to unsafe tractors.

Meanwhile, the bureau of labor statistics has reported these continue to be more fatalities in agricultural activities than in any other major industry.

And the bureau of agricultural economics (BAE) has just completed its first major survey of farm accident costs. Its conclusions:

Non-fatal farm accidents caused farm people to lose 15,000,000 working days in 1947. The cost for medical care, but not including the lost time, was \$20,000,000. These figures, however, were only the accidents that didn't cause death.

The BAE found the most costly kind of an accident is an auto accident. The average cost for medical care for these non-fatal accidents is \$64.

But falls cause more farm injuries than any other accident. In the sample survey of 2,000 accidents, 478 involved falling from such things as haystacks and steepladders. The average cost of each of these accidents was \$45 in medical care. Farmers lost an average of 24 days from each accident.

Machinery are the next greatest hazard. They caused 246 of the 2,000 "non-fatal" accidents and they accounted for 81 an accident.

The south has the lowest accident rate. The BAE says this probably is because there are fewer farm machines in the south than some other areas.

The accident rate is slightly below the national level in the north-east and far above the national average in the north central states and west.

BOISE, July 11 (AP)—Polio has taken the lives of three persons in Idaho so far this year and the state department of public health says it is the present rate of new cases continues an epidemic stage will be reached.

The third death was reported from Idaho Falls where 64-year-old Charles Edwin Gross died Saturday. Another death was reported from Pocatello Saturday and there one reported from Bonner county Saturday in the area.

Dr. Madeline Donnelly, director of the Idaho child health and crippled children service, said these three cases have been reported, bringing the July total to 14. There were 28 cases in April.

The worst outbreak of the disease in the state was between July 1947 and April 1948 when 17 died and 401 persons were stricken.

Dry Weather Hits Wheat, Pea Area

BOISE, July 11 (AP)—Dry weather is making serious inroads into wheat and pea production of the Snake valley.

The protracted dry spell has cut heavily into early harvests of the area, says K. H. Kluge, agronomist at the University of Idaho, said today.

"Rainfall was half an inch short in both April and May and one inch below normal for June," Kluge said. "Drought wheat and peas have felt the drought and there is considerable damage to those crops. Winter wheat is doing well in spite of dry weather, and we are fortunate in having a good winter wheat average this year."

He added that the drought, moisture deficiency probably has hit the Snake area the hardest of all Idaho sections this year. However, he thought some relief in the Couderc Valley, Nampa and Boise River areas, although more moisture is badly needed there.
