Authorization Bill Given to House Group

WASHINGTON, July 13.—House today passed a \$22,000,000 military construction bill which would cover about \$10,000,000 into the nation's Alaska and Pacific territories.

The house armed services committee called witnesses on a giant army air force and navy program to build 100,000 aircraft and 100,000 tanks around the world.

The bill would authorize those services to spend approximately \$22,000,000 in this country and about \$12,000,000 of base abroad. It also would set up an unidentified \$20,000,000 special weapons project for the army.

Special No Money No money would be made available by the bill. It would only grant the service permission to spend the money when they could get it. The actual money would have to be voted by Congress in a separate appropriation bill.

The bill would concentrate about \$18,000,000 over the next five years. It would be available in Alaska. Enlarge Guam base at \$4,000,000 enlarging its base at 640,000 square feet. It would also be available on Okinawa, where the army and air force would spend about \$4,000,000.

### Local Man Proud of Pet Birds—and New Quadruplet Goats

The chance for quadruplets is reported to be one in 67,000 and the same ratio is estimated for the goat.

So the 67,000th event has occurred in Twin Falls. A 10-year-old Togemog milk doe belonging to James C. Wolff gave birth July 15 to four perfectly formed, lively kids. A number of different pet animals of the quadruplets is a French Alpine buck, 2 years old.

Wolff has owned the doe for eight years and during that time she has had one set of triplets, several sets of twins and now the quadruplets. Only one year during the eight has she had a lone kid, all others were multiple births.

It is a high-powered registered, good milk goat giving from one and one-half to two gallons of milk a day.

The same Togemog doe claims motherhood of the familiar team of goats owned by Wolff's two sons and often appearing in pet parades in Twin Falls.

The family pet project doesn't stop at goats, however. While there are four perfectly formed, lively kids, a number of different pet animals of the quadruplets is a French Alpine buck, 2 years old.

Wolff has owned the doe for eight years and during that time she has had one set of triplets, several sets of twins and now the quadruplets. Only one year during the eight has she had a lone kid, all others were multiple births.

It is a high-powered registered, good milk goat giving from one and one-half to two gallons of milk a day.

of last winter, the birds came out in large shape.

He doesn't have any special housing project, merely a well-built, small shed in one end of wire netting enclosure where the birds may fly in and out at will, winter or summer. During cold weather the shed is warmed by a heater similar to those used in chicken brooders.

The birds are native of Africa, Java, India and other countries. One pet cockatiel and Mickey, a white parakeet, are more or less privileged characters and now and then spend some time in the house. Mrs. Wolff is a enthusiastic over the birds as he is and the cockatiel often perches on her shoulder, or if nearby when she is washing dishes will alight on the water faucet and twitter at her. Two parakeets have been hatched this year.

Wolff, who is a landscape gardener, is also an authority on birds. He can identify by name many hundreds of types of birds and give a resume of their culture and landscape possibilities.

Among the other pets of the family are a Siamese kitten, golden hamster, rabbit, marmoset dog and a large assortment of tropical fish. Inquiries have come from all sections of the United States in regard to his tropical birds and many people have wanted to purchase some. Quarantine regulations on shipment of the birds limit his orders to Idaho.

Most of the feed for his birds is either raised on the Wolff place or gathered nearby. It consists mainly of various types of millet seed with sunflower seeds added to the diet of some of the birds.

It is a high-powered registered, good milk goat giving from one and one-half to two gallons of milk a day.

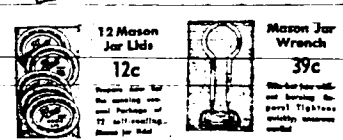

**Non-Employed Reflect Switch In U. S. Marts**

BY HADEE WINGET  
NEW YORK, July 12 (AP)—Unemployment figures, like everything else, are reflecting the switch from a normal buyers' market.

But unemployment, while on the increase recently, still is only slightly above average when viewed in the perspective of the last 100 years.

However, that's a small comfort to the 3,776,000 persons pointing the pavement looking for work today. And it is little help to a community paralyzed when its biggest industry, steel, goes down.

But the figures show that, even if the nation maintains a fairly prosperous economy with "full employment" in coming years, we can expect at least an average minimum unemployment of 2,000,000 and 3,500,000.

That conclusion is based on a study by the Twentieth Century Fund, which found that five per cent of the labor force under normal conditions are looking for work at any given time.

Organizations and various federal government economists have predicted a possible rise to unemployment to around 6,000,000 this winter. That's above the five per cent line and far into the emergency zone.

President Truman, in his economic report to congress, said "There is nothing healthy about mass unemployment." He added that "unemployment has not risen to the dangerous levels which would call for all-out emergency measures."

What is the danger line for unemployment?

That question is the core of discussions over unemployment. Although estimates vary widely, it is generally agreed that looking at the figures for the entire country is misleading in giving a true measure of the personal suffering caused by men and women being out of work.

"While unemployment is not so high as a very high level for the country as a whole," President Truman said, "There are many localities and even some states where it is serious. These pools of heavy unemployment tend to be created before they are spread, and the responsibility is in part national."

If you are out of work and your kids are hungry, you don't care how the statistical picture is. You want work.

That same statistical picture is pretty bleak for the nation as a whole, on the other hand, but individual families might not suffer. If the family bread winner is out of work in the middle of the winter, that's bad. But if his young son gets out of school in the summer and can't find a job right away, it doesn't matter much.

That's one way the statistical picture is warped.

### Johnson Again Denies Charge Of Censorship

WASHINGTON, July 12.—The House armed services committee has indicated new military unit will be activated "possibly" for the rest of the session.

By a 13 to 10 vote, it delayed action on its senate-approved bill until completing an impending investigation of the B-36 bomber, which may take months.

The committee acted after hearings that Secretary of Defense Johnson had ordered the military services to submit their testimony on the B-36 to his office—four conditions.

"This led Representative Van Zandt, R. Pa., to charge "censorship."

Several hours later, Johnson issued a statement saying:

There was not and is not any intention of censoring the statements of any department, agency, or individual in the national military establishment in connection with this inquiry.

Representative Brooks, D. La., told the House that the committee's decision means that the unit's activation will be "held" for this year.

However, the committee could reverse itself at any time, and Johnson said he will speed up the B-36 inquiry in the hope the committee can receive consideration of the bill.

The unit's activation would give the secretary of defense considerably greater direct authority over the armed services and the committee report is raising the question of how he is using the power he has.

Representative Van Zandt injected the B-36 question into the consideration of the unit's activation measure. Van Zandt produced copies of memoranda from Secretary of Defense Johnson to the military services and the joint chiefs of staff telling them that their testimony in the B-36 case would be submitted to that office for "coordination."

The B-36 hearings are slated to start July 26. They were ordered after Van Zandt made a house speech in which reports were circulating in Washington about connections between high defense officials and the makers of the big six-engine bomber.

Van Zandt said he did not know whether the reports were accurate but believed they should be investigated.

### Mentor Says Russian War Will Be Folly

ASPEN, Colo., July 12.—Mandarin can achieve lasting peace only through "a moral, consistent and spiritual revolution based on a common bond of faith."

Robert M. Hutchins, chancellor of the University of Chicago, is chairman of the bi-cultural celebration here honoring Johann Wolfgang von Goethe, German poet-philosopher born 200 years ago.

Goethe, Elise.

Hutchins in a major address cited Goethe's faith in goodness and in a humanity as the source of the "modern world's dilemma of the atomic bomb and the cold war with Russia."

"To cast good Goethean world," Hutchins said, "the means of communication and transportation would be used not to send bombs, spies, propaganda and messengers of misguided self interest from one country to another but to exchange students, prophets, ideas and books and to develop a super-national community founded on the humanity of the whole human race."

"Bad for Us"

Referring to the cold war, Hutchins said "we are told that a new day will dawn if only we can get rid of those dreadful men in the Kremlin. If we go to war with Russia before Russia has the atomic bomb, we shall be embarrassed upon a process of the modern conquest in which we may succeed, but which will be bad for us and bad for the world."

"If we go to war with Russia after Russia has the atomic bomb," he added, "we can expect nothing but results: for the whole of Europe and much of the world will be destroyed. When Russia has the atomic bomb, we can not have war and civilization too."

The expectation for life of Americans at 50 now is 13 1/2 years.

### Profs Declare Red Card Not Ouster Cause

WASHINGTON, July 13 (AP)—The right of college teachers to be members of the communist party if they do not propagate in the classroom is backed by an important committee of the American Association of the University Professors.

The association's committee on academic freedom and tenure says that so long as a teacher does not use the classroom to propagate or is not disloyal, he has a right to his job.

"No 'Grosses'"  
"So long as the communist party in the United States is a legal political party, affiliation with that party in and of itself should not be regarded as a justifiable reason for exclusion from the academic profession," their report says.

"Guilt is personal"  
"The committee's report which restated a decision made in 1941. If a teacher should use his classroom as a forum for discussion or otherwise abuse his relationship with his students for that purpose, he should be dismissed, the committee says.

Such a teacher says the committee should be dismissed "because of his acts of disloyalty or because of professional unfitness, and not because he is a communist."

The committee censured the University of Chicago administration for firing a teacher because he supported Henry A. Wallace in the 1948 presidential campaign.

The association will consider the committee's report at its annual meeting next February.

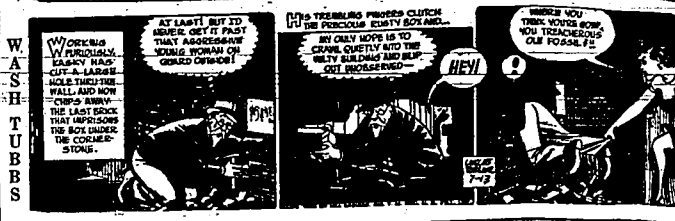
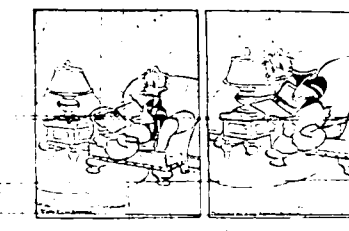
