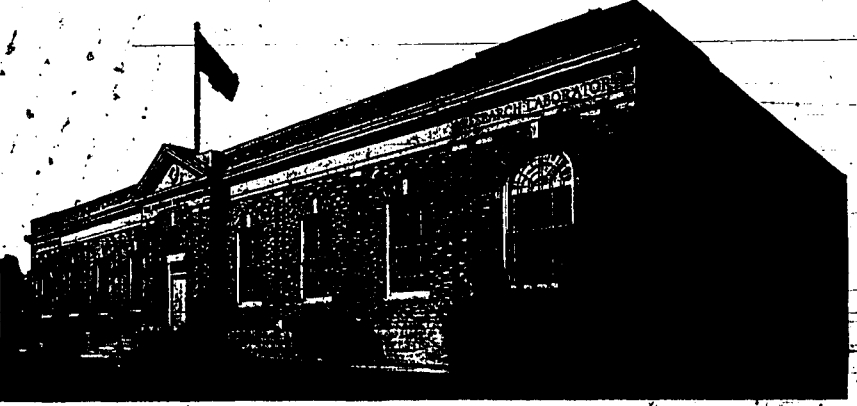

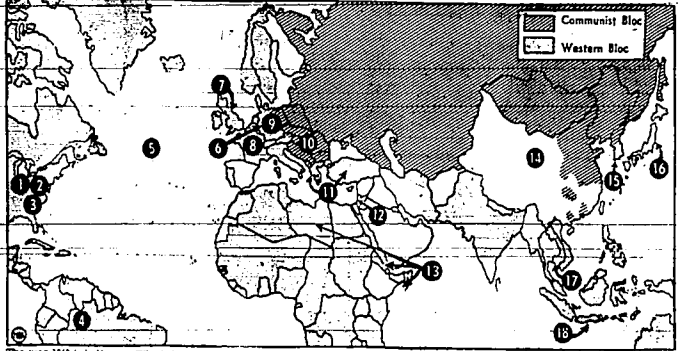
Black Market Uncovered in German Zone

BERLIN, Germany, July 14 (AP)—German officials have uncovered a black market involving the movement of huge quantities of goods from the West German zone to the East German zone.

The United States Army, three other government agencies and British military officials have agreed to crack the black market. U. S. customs officials said they would inspect, photograph, and seal all goods being moved to the U. S. occupation zone and then resold on the black market. Regulations permit the import of up to 500 pounds of goods duty-free.

The black market is a network of agents and officials who have agreed to smuggle goods from the U. S. zone to the East German zone. Some of the goods being smuggled are clothing, shoes, and other items. The black market is also used to smuggle out of the U. S. zone goods that are needed in the East German zone.

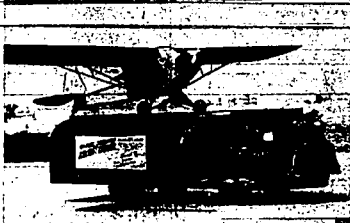
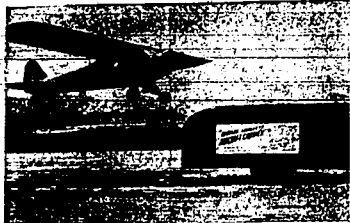

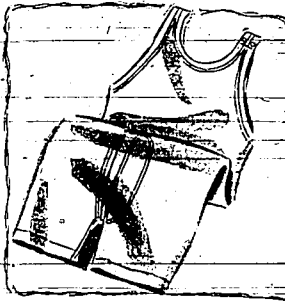
